It's a senseless waste, and is costing the school money as we undertake various repairs. Police have been informed and are trying to assist

Unfortunately, all schools are soft targets as our campuses are large and the grounds often easy to access. As a result of this situation we will be locking the Amsleigh Park PS campus gates at all entrances over the next couple of weekends until the issue eases. Our apologies to the community as we like our campus to be used for recreation after hours and on weekends, but this situation requires this action at this time. If you do happen to live close to the school and hear any noises, such as smashing glass, especially at night, please call the police to report it.

STEM - Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics

We live in a rapidly changing world and as a school we need to respond effectively if we are to support our students to prepare for their future adult lives. If the predictions are correct, our children can look forward to working in a range of occupations that may have not even been invented yet, and there is no doubt that technology will play a significant role in this, hence the emergence of STEM learning. The acronym, STEM, encompasses learning in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics.

In 2018 we have further developed our STEM learning program so that all students will now be undertaking one STEM learning session each week for one semester (Half Year). This is a significant opportunity for our students who can look forward to future focused learning in coding and robotics. Mr Powell, our STEM teacher, is our resident expert in this learning area, and we are indeed fortunate to have this expertise on our teaching staff in this important field. Late in 2017 we were successful in writing a grant submission and received

robotics. Grade 3-6 is participating in STEM learning for Terms 1&2, and then P-2 will be in Terms 3&4. If you have any feedback about the program please let me know.

Math's Extension Programs

At Amsleigh Park PS we are pleased to offer Mathematics Extension programs for students in Grade 3-6. This extra learning opportunity is for students achieving well above expected levels, who benefit from the added challenges provided through problem solving and more advanced mathematical thinking. Students are selected for this program based on their academic results and other assessments, and with lots of talented mathematicians at APPS there is no shortage of candidates. During the program our Grade 3/4 students will participate in the Mathematics Games, whilst our Grade 5/6s will undertake the Mathematics Olympiad, both run by the Australasian Mathematics Association. The program has now been running for 3



years and we are proud of our student's achievements, and pleased that we can offer this opportunity.

Grade 1-2 Incursion on Cooperative Learning



I had the pleasure of observing our Grade 1/2s participating in a special incursion focusing on cooperative learning this week. As a vitally important life skill, cooperation is an essential aspect of learning for all students, who will get many chances to develop and practise this skill throughout their school lives. Students undertook a range of activities to introduce and reinforce skills through a range of challenges, one of which is pictured to the left. In this activity two students had to walk along the wall, both keeping their balance, whilst holding onto a short rod. As I watched they did a great job! Other activities included a range of challenges in which students worked together to achieve an outcome.

Curriculum Day

Friday 9th March is a Curriculum day at Amsleigh Park PS therefore, no school on that day for our students. Our teaching staff will be undertaking a day of professional learning focusing on the teaching of Writing using the six traits of Writing including Voice, Organisation, Ideas, Conventions, Extending Vocabulary and Sentence Structure. We know this as VOICES+P with the 'P' standing for publishing. At the conclusion of this day our staff will have been trained fully in using this teaching model.

Communicating with Amsleigh Park Primary School

At Amsleigh Park we have a detailed 'parent communication policy' which is available to all members of the school community. The following rationale is included with the policy:

Amsleigh Park Primary School is committed to good communication and treating everyone according to our school values of respect, integrity and inclusion. It is important to remember that everyone in the school community should work together in the spirit of cooperation and understanding and should conduct themselves in a respectful, calm and courteous manner. All members of the school community are bound by the requirements of this policy when raising a concern at the school.

Within this policy there is an appendix which outlines who parents might get in contact with in the event that they have a concern. The following comes straight from this policy.

- Matters that are best addressed by the classroom teacher or specialist teacher may include: individual student needs, academic progress, assessment, behaviour and discipline issues, non-attendance at school and challenging or changing family circumstances.
- Matters that are best addressed by the principal or teacher leaders may include: school facilities, school
 fees and charges, student reporting, school policy, dress codes and/or serious discipline issues. The principal
 will also be available, by appointment, to speak to parents about any other concerns they may have and
 wish to raise with a more senior member of staff.

Who should I make contact with?

Normally your child's classroom teacher is the best person to get in contact with; however there may be times when it's appropriate to seek a staff member in a leadership role such as the following staff:

Do I need to make an appointment to speak to a teacher?

Normally you need to make an appointment to speak with one of the staff if the matter requires a discussion like a parent-teacher interview. Teaching staff are generally available after school most nights expect for Monday, which is a routine meeting night for all teachers. Making an appointment also puts the teacher in the best position to give you their full attention without compromising their duty of care to students.

What if it's just a quick message?

Passing on a quick message is normally OK, but it should happen outside of teaching time, as the teacher must always maintain their duty of care to students.

What if the matter is urgent?

If the matter is more urgent and concerns **student wellbeing or safety** in particular, then teachers are usually contactable for a brief chat/phone call before 8.45am. If the classroom teacher is not available then the Assistant Principal should be contacted. The Principal can also help to address urgent matters if other staff are not available.

Do I need an appointment to see a teacher leader?

Yes, if the matter requires more than a 'quick message' and is <u>not</u> urgent then you should contact the office to make an appointment to speak with the Principal, Assistant Principal or teacher leaders. We will always do our best to undertake this appointment in a timely manner.

Does the school have an 'open door' to parent concerns?

Yes, most definitely, and the purpose of this newsletter article is to provide a clear idea about how a parent might go about this, and who to contact.

We hope you find this a useful guide in communicating with the school.

Safety on our School Crossing

Having our school crossings on State Street and Dublin Street is vital in supporting us to maintain community safety. Our crossing supervisors have a very important role to play in assisting all families to arrive at school safely. We need to make sure that we support our crossing supervisors to undertake their role by following some simple and easy to understand rules:



- always use a crossing where possible
- wait for the whistle before crossing
- always cross between the 2 white lines, remaining in front of the crossing supervisor If any families are crossing away from the school crossing please, ensure children are supervised closely and carefully. Recently we've become aware of some unsafe behaviour and we all need to work together to ensure there are no accidents.

Illness

From time to time, children are unwell and are unavoidably absent from school. Although we would like students to attend school every day where possible, it is important to keep sick children at home. This prevents other children becoming unwell and a bug spreading through the school. We have spoken to our students about the importance of hand washing and personal hygiene and appreciate your support in reinforcing this at home with your child.



School Uniform

We are very lucky at Amsleigh Park to have an onsite uniform shop, run by two fantastic parent volunteers, Jo Devlin and Kath Spotkaeff. Having parents undertake this role enables the school to continue to provide uniforms at a 'wholesale' price as our shop is non-profit. The uniform shop is open Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:30-4:00pm and Wednesdays from 8:45-9:30am. If you are unable to attend at these times, you can fill out an order form, available

from the office, and the items will be delivered to your child's class when the uniform shop is next open. We really appreciate Joanne and Kath for volunteering their time and effort in running our uniform shop. On the topic of uniforms; as I've visited classes this week I was pleased to see that our students were looking smart in their uniforms. A reminder that our policy states that students should wear a <u>light or dark coloured shoe</u>, and this offers lots of scope in the design of shoe. Fluorescent shoes should not be worn as part of the school uniform, and we ask for community support to meet the school policy in this regard. It really does look fantastic when our whole school is in uniform. It creates a sense of connectedness and pride in our school.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students.
