The Framework is an initiative of the Federal government and through this training our staff are better equipped to work with families to support our students if they are experiencing social-emotional challenges.

This morning we held a special 'inaugural' KidsMatter coffee morning, with the aim of bringing together parents and staff informally to further develop partnerships with our school community. We were thrilled with the number of parents who came along and enjoyed the chance to grab a quality 'barista' made coffee. We look forward to having another such morning in Term 2.

Swimming

A big well done to all of our swimmers for 2018, and many thanks to the staff and parents for supporting this most important school program. At the start of the program I challenged students to make sure they really improved their swimming skills, and I trust they have fulfilled this expectation. I also reminded students that it is absolutely vital to develop a range of water safety skills, as we are a country that thrives on water sports. Just to give you an idea, it is expected that all 12yo children can tread water safety for at least 2 minutes. If you add clothing to this equation it's even harder, so the message from water safety experts is that we should not underestimate the importance of swimming lessons. Some recent information I read suggested that many families engage in swimming lessons very early in a child's life, say 2-6 years, but then stop as other competing interests make it difficult to continue. However, this can mean that children have not reached the necessary proficiency, and the research also suggests that many parents can tend to overestimate their child's abilities after initial swimming lessons.

Our annual swimming program is designed to support the development of proficiency, but in itself should not be considered a total program, as most children would benefit from ongoing opportunities to develop water safety skills. As I always say, 'learning to swim could save your life...'

I would like to sincerely acknowledge and thank Mrs De Fazio and our office team for organising this year's program, it's been a great success. Huge thanks to the many parents who helped along the way, and of course to our wonderful staff, who got our students to the pool every day.

The Easter Raffle

As I walked into the staff room today I was greeted by shimmering array of chocolate treats. I want to thank our PFA who were hard at work wrapping up the Easter baskets in readiness for the annual Easter raffle. With lots of prizes on offer there should be lots of happy smiling faces on Thursday afternoon. Many thanks to our families who not only donated the treats, but also purchased some raffle tickets. It's one of those great Amsleigh Park PS 'traditions', and we really appreciate the efforts of our PFA and community in bringing it all together.

Year 6-7 Transition 2018-2019

The state wide Victorian Government School Year 6-7 Transition process, commences at the beginning of next term. During the first week back after holidays, all Grade 6 students in government schools will receive a Transition Information Pack which details the process of transition and how families need to go about indicating their preference for a particular Government Secondary School. This pack includes the 'Application for Year 7 Placement 2019' form, which all students, including those attending an independent school in 2019, must **return by Friday 11th May**. Please look out for this important paperwork coming home after the holidays.

If you would like your child to attend an Independent Secondary School, please contact them directly about the application and enrolment process, as they work with a different process than Government Secondary Schools.

We encourage Year 5 and 6 families to attend the Open Days and/or Nights of many secondary schools in the area to see the broad array of educational opportunities they may offer your child. There are advertisements for some of the upcoming Open Nights later on in the newsletter.

Swimming

Today our students completed the 8 day intensive swimming program at the Doug Ellis Pool at Monash University. The students have made great progress and have thoroughly enjoyed the program. Thank you to Mrs Louise DeFazio for coordinating the program.
