Principal's Report

100 Days of Prep Celebration

Wednesday 8th August was a day of great significance for our preps, who celebrated their 100th day of school. It's a great milestone, and our preps enjoyed introducing themselves and sharing what they like about school so far. They also provided us with some beautiful singing and dancing to mark the



occasion. As I was sitting there I reflected on how much our preps have learnt so far this year. Their confidence has grown, and seeing their smiles tells me there is an obvious enjoyment of school life. A big congratulations to our preps on achieving their first milestone of school life! Many thanks to the parents who attended this event, and big thanks to our Prep teachers, Miss Renwick and Miss Tapper, for organising the whole event, and getting their classes prepared. Special mention to the many other staff who also attended to help out, which is part of the Amsleigh way of doing things.

Parent Opinion Survey 2018

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies. This year the Parent Opinion Survey is being conducted from Monday 23rd July to Sunday 26th August. The survey is conducted online, only takes 10-15 minutes to complete.

The Parent Opinion survey for 2018 was sent out to 104 school families a couple of weeks ago. So far we only have 17 responses, and we urgently need parents to complete the survey so we have a valid survey sample of families. Please help us to further improve our school by completing the survey in 2018. Many thanks in advance for your support.

Curriculum Day Report

Our teaching staff were very productive on our curriculum day last Monday, focusing on three important professional learning priorities. We started our day learning more about positive behaviour support, and how we can further enhance learning in this area. Following this we workshopped a school instructional model, which describes the core teaching components of a highly effective lesson. Finally, we looked deeply into the theory behind High Impact Instructional Strategies and how they might impact on student learning outcomes. It was a very busy day of professional learning, and we appreciate the opportunity to undertake this important work.

Professional learning is a high priority for our school, and we are constantly building our knowledge and skills through a cycle of continuous improvement. It's vital that all teachers are reflecting on and refining their professional practice, keeping up with new teaching ideas.

Grade 5 Camp

Our Grade 5s head off to Camp Sunnystones on Monday next week. Mr French and the team have all the preparations done, and the group can look forward to an exciting camp experience. A visit to Sovereign Hill should be a highlight. I'm crossing my fingers for lots of sun shine!

House Athletics

Our House Athletics is an annual event for Grade 4-6 students, and it was held last Friday 10th August at Davies Reserve. Weather is always a bit tricky at this time of year, but we were fortunate that the rain held off. Mr Shallard reports that it was a fantastic day and our students were really cooperative and strived to achieve their best. Some of the highlights included the relays and field events such as discus and triple jump. The results will be announced at Monday assembly next week, so stay tuned. On behalf of the school, huge thanks to Mr Shallard, and the teaching staff for running this great event. Students are selected on the basis of these results to participate in the District Athletics team, which is held on Monday 27th August.

Building Project Update

During my daily walk in and around the school I'm watching the progress of the modernisation of our main building with increasing excitement, especially now we are getting closer to finishing. The modernisation of our main building is a very complex build, and is actually a lot more difficult and challenging than constructing

a brand new building. I'm quite certain our whole community will be amazed by the transformation of the interior of this building. Whilst from the outside not a lot will have changed, on the inside the change is massive. At this stage the completion data and handover of the main building will occur at the end of October. It's later than expected, but this is not unusual in a building project which involves a renovation rather than new construction.

Main Building Q & A

What are some of exciting design elements?

Our main building is 89 years old and the original design has served our school well for many years,



however just like a family home, there does come the time to modernise. The interior of the main building will be very contemporary, with a small hint of its heritage style preserved to remind us of our history. Upstairs, our Senior Learning Centre will consist of four large classrooms, two break out rooms (for small group activity), wet area, STEM learning space, teacher office and a very cool Multi-Media Hub. Natural ventilation will be improved through new windows and the overall look will be colourful and fresh.

Downstairs, our Administration Centre will have the same contemporary look, which compared to our previous offices, will be completely different. Our main entry will open onto a smart foyer, and general office. An interview room and conference room are also accessible from the foyer. The Admin also includes offices, staff lounge, toilets, staff work and resource spaces. Our Library, whilst not changing position, is now larger, and includes a reading room, library work area and a computer HUB.

Where are the toilets?

Safety is always a priority so the Administration Centre and Senior Learning Centre have indoor toilets. Our students will have direct access to them during class time. There will also be four external toilets for use during recess breaks and lunchtime.

Will it be comfortable for students?

Comfort is a high priority in architectural design, and this is complemented by the student furniture we will use in the spaces. We have already used some grant money to purchase new classroom furniture such as classroom chairs and tables, and we are looking at some coloured ottomans and collaborative tables to round out the spaces.

What kind of technology will be available for students and staff?

Technology is an important resource for learning, and our equipment includes i-Pads, notebook computers and desktop computers. Increasingly technology is becoming more portable, and wireless, so the networking we have planned for is 'state of the art' and will enable students and staff access to technology when they need it. The classrooms in our senior learning centre are also equipped with the latest 'Promethean' interactive whiteboard technology.
