Our Uniform Shop has Moved!

On Monday this week we moved our uniform shop over to the Thelma Bailey Centre, taking over the canteen area. It's an ideal spot for our shop, as its location is easily accessible to all, and there is ample storage for our stock. The uniform shop will continue to open as normal, but please note the new location.

Continuing to provide a 'non-profit' uniform shop is very important as it makes the process of purchasing uniforms convenient and affordable. However, it's only going to be possible if we have parents who are willing to help out. Our current coordinators, Jo and Kath, have now been doing the job for a couple of years and it's time to pass the role on.

We are now seeking 2-4 volunteers who can assist the school to keep on providing this important service to our community. The role requires a 1-2 hours each week to open the shop, keep an eye on stock levels and place orders through our school office. The role can easily be shared, so any persons might only need to open the shop once a week. Any interested person/s should come by the office and let Meredith or Karen know. We can provide training in the processes required.

Parent Contributions for 2018

All families will be receiving a letter from the school shortly with details of our parent financial contributions for 2019. Next year's payment will have two components, made up of \$150 for essential student learning items, payable to the school and \$90 payable directly to our chosen supplier, Officemax. Prices have been kept the same as 2018.

Officemax is our supplier for 2019, and we have negotiated excellent value for money using our bulk buying power to advantage. The pricing is hard to beat but families can also choose to purchase their own supplies so long as each child has the required items. Like last year <u>parents will order directly with OfficeMax</u>. Please note the date for **FREE** delivery to avoid any extra costs.

We ask our community to support the school by contributing financially to higher quality educational programs and enabling us to provide materials and resources <u>well above</u> the standard curriculum we are funded for. Parent payments for 'essential student learning items' are used to support all learning areas inclusive of: Art materials, English and Mathematics materials, Science consumables, ICT equipment and leasing of laptop computers, Inquiry Leaning materials, printing consumables, photocopying of learning activities, access to Mathletics and Reading Eggs software and so on. We can only provide these items with a contribution from families, as they are not included in the funding we are provided as a government school to implement the standard curriculum. A detailed 'Parent Payments' policy is available on our website for anyone who would like to access it.

Enrolment Census for 2019

We are still awaiting the return of some of the census forms so we can plan a class structure for 2019. It is vital that we have accurate numbers of students at each year level, so even if you have been at the school for a number of years we still need a return. If any families are moving house and changing schools in 2019 we need to know ASAP, and rest assured it does not affect your child's current enrolment. It's a big help when we have accurate information and would really appreciate your support. If you have lost the form, a note or email will also suffice. Looking at current numbers we have limited vacancies in Grade 3-6 so if you have any new families in your area please introduce them to the school.

Sporting Schools Australia Program

A note has been distributed for the Term 4 Sporting Schools program, which will focus on Gymnastics. Sporting Schools programs are held after school hours and are completely free. They are part of a Federal government initiative to get children more involved in physical activity outside of school hours. I highly recommend this opportunity as a way of getting children more interested in sport. Thanks to Miss Hayes for coordinating.

Family Fun Day

The City of Monash is running a Family Fun Day at Batesford Reserve, Chadstone on Sunday 18th November from 11.00am – 3.00pm. This is a free event which gives local residents the opportunity to connect with local service groups and organisations. There will be live entertainment and free children's activities including a jumping castle, animal farm, reptile experience and arts & crafts.

Our Tawny frog Mouth Family

It's I'm very excited to report that our Tawny Frog Mouth's now have two fluffy chicks. They hatched just over a week ago, and their growth and development has been rapid. Just the other day I could see they were now learning to fly, and their fluffy appearance was already changing. Very soon they will be on their way out into the world, but I really hope they return again to Amsleigh Park PS, as it's wonderful to see nature in action.
