### **Understanding Student Placements**

We are currently finalising the very complex process of placing students into classes for 2019. We consider many factors in this process including the number of girls/boys; spread of academic ability; level of participation; student behaviour and special needs. I want to emphasize that learning is the number one priority for class time, and whilst friendship is one consideration, we are now placing less priority on the meeting of these requests. Rest assured, our students are still placed with children who they learn well with, but we believe that these important decisions should not be compromised by satisfying friendship requests over having a productive learning environment. Students have both recess and lunch to be with friends, and this should suffice. We hope that all families understand this common sense approach, which we believe leads to the best outcome for our class placements and learning. Our aim as always is to ensure that our classes are well-balanced groups that enable our teachers to establish a productive and safe learning environment for all.

### Class Structure 2018

I am pleased to announce the class structure and teacher placements for 2019, as shown below. This structure ensures that we will maintain outstanding class sizes across all year levels. Whilst numbers may change slightly the classes and the number of students currently in each group are as follows. As you will see all classes will have the optimum number of students. For the record an optimum class size is about 25 students, and we always aim to keep classes around this figure.








### A fantastic new Garden for Amsleigh Park PS

We are very excited to give you a snap shot of the plans for new 'Friendship Garden' which will be constructed early in 2019. The various elements will provide our students and community with endless hours of fun and relaxation. If you look closely at the plan you will see one of the central features is a walking Mandala, and this connects to a sensory trail that runs over a dry creek bed. Artificial grass mounds, planted areas, a new sand pit and walking logs also feature in the design. Our architects, Spaces, are now commencing the documentation of the project, which will go to tender soon. It's a very exciting time for our school and this will really complement our new buildings and give us an outdoor area we can all feel really proud of. Construction should commence in February 2019 and the garden will take about 6-8 weeks to construct.



### The Office is Moving!

Our general office is moving back into the main building and will be open from Monday 10<sup>th</sup> December. Access is via the regular front entrance, but you will notice that we now have a ramp installed, so you can use the stairs or the ramp. We would like to thank everyone for their patience in advance as we transition back into our new spaces. 
### **Transition**

### **Prep Transition**

Yesterday our 2019 Prep students spent the morning at school for their third transition session. As part of this session, they met their Year 5 buddy and complete their first buddy activity together. Our Year 5 students were so excited to meet and talk to their Prep buddies, as well as share a card they had made for their buddy. It is always a lovely time, watching our Year 5 students interact with the younger children and become a 'big buddy' for the first time. Our Year 5 students have looked forward to being a buddy for a long time and it is often a highlight of their primary school life. Our Better Buddies Program focuses on the development of empathy, social values and building positive pro-social relationships between children of different ages. Strong positive connections between children help to discourage antisocial behaviour and ensure our Preps feel further supported in their transition to school.

### **2019 PARENT PAYMENTS**
