PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

What a Great Year!

Here we are once again nearing the end of another school year. For me each year seems to whizz by at such a fast pace that I sometimes wish things would just slow down a bit. But, as the saying goes, 'time flies when you're having fun', and this year is no exception!

As I reflect on 2018 I remember many great events and occasions with some of the highlights including; the School Picnic, Bush Dance, Prep Pizza Night and Swimming in Term 1; Education Week, Tributes concert, ANZAC service, Grandparents Day, 5/6 Science Expo, Mother's Day Stall, School Disco, Grade 6 and Grade 3/4 camps in Term 2; Grade 5 camp, Life Education, 100 days of Prep, Book Week, Bedtime stories, Father's Day stall and the school production in Term 3; the Colour Run, Grade 2 Sleepover, Whole School Transition, Prep Orientation and Grade 6 Graduation in Term 4. School improvement is also an ongoing focus, and this has included implementations of a new framework for teaching Writing, that we know as VOICES. This framework outlines what skills and knowledge students need to successfully write in a range of styles or genres such as narrative, persuasive, exposition, retell, poetry and information reports. Additionally, we have spent time on implementing a new approach to the teaching of Phonics in Prep – Grade 2. Understanding phonics (the sounds made by the letters of the alphabet) and the various ways sounds are blended is vital to developing confident reading skills, and the results have certainly been very pleasing. Like all professional organisations, seeking ongoing improvement is part of every school year, and we are proud of our commitment to this aspect of our work.

Make sure that students are continuing to read every day during the school holidays, as the research clearly shows that it is a great support to Literacy growth and development. 
Thank you!
