Get to Know You Interviews

We have set aside very important time for 'Get to Know You Interviews' for Grade 1-6 parents on Wednesday 13th February. These meetings provide a timely opportunity for our parents to share information about their children with this year's teacher. It's also a chance for our teaching staff to form an effective partnership with each child's family. Working in partnership and having consistent expectations between home and school leads to better outcomes for our students. The Interviews are strictly 10 minutes. To ensure we run on time each teacher will be using their smart phone or a timer to keep track. If families need a longer time then a follow up time should be organised.

Prep 2019

A very special welcome to all of our 46 new preps who commenced school in 2019. We are all looking forward to getting to know our new students and their

families. Welcome also to the students who have joined us at other year levels, we hope you are all settling in well and enjoying making new friends. Whilst our prep classes are full we do have limited vacancies at our school so if you know of anyone who is looking for a school over the next few weeks please encourage them to have a look at APPS.



We're Making a 'small' Change!

This week we introduced a small change to our daily routine, with a bell now sounding at 8.52am each morning to signal that children can enter the buildings to get prepared for the school day. Our students no longer line up in the mornings, which means that we can start the learning program right on 9.00am, therefore maximising the valuable learning time across the morning sessions. This small change can add quite a lot of additional learning time to our class sessions, and we know this will be of benefit to all.

I want to thank our dedicated teaching staff who are varying their morning preparation routines to make sure they are in their classrooms as children enter. Our teaching staff acknowledge that this is a great initiative, and look forward to the benefits of the extra 10-15 minutes of teaching time during the morning session. We believe that the small change in this routine should be fairly seemless as most children are already at school by this time anyway.

Since we began on Tuesday this week, we can already see how calmly our children are starting each school day, so early signs are great. We look forward to strong community support for this initiative, which is designed as a benefit to learning. As always, we welcome and invite any feedback from our community about this improvement in our routines.

What's happening with our Capital Works Project

Coming back to school to such magnificent buildings was a real joy this year. It's very exciting to work in such a fresh and contemporary environment. Demolition works continued to remove the old buildings from our school site, and as the space is opening up we can finally see the project vision taking final shape. Described by our architects as the 'beating heart of Amsleigh' the central corridor of our school is now opened up, showing off the benefits of our large school site. Obviously we have some landscaping to do, and this will be a focus all across the coming year. Our new garden will be constructed in place of the old buildings in this area, and that promises to be a great space for all students and our community. We'll keep you posted on when the project will start, but it should not be too far away now.

Student Insurance – Reminder from DET

At the start of each school year we remind all families that the Department of Education and Training (DET) does not offer any form of 'student accident insurance'. If families are concerned about this they are advised to make their own arrangements. Ambulance cover could be one consideration as the school will not hesitate to call an ambulance if we are concerned for a child's wellbeing.

Accessing our New Office

Hopefully you will get a chance to visit our fantastic new school office at some time. Access to the general office is via the front doors of our main building. Parents should always come to the general office via this entrance when signing children in or out from school or to make any payments or general enquiries. You will be greeted by the ever smiling Meredith or Jackie, who will be happy to help.

You might notice a smaller counter at the back of the office, which is the Kids Counter. This is for students to use during the school day only. We ask that parents not use this counter so the office team is not looking after two windows at the same time.

Developing a Partnership with Amsleigh Park Families

Our teaching and support staff are looking forward to a productive partnership with you to ensure all students can achieve their highest potential. We recognise that in order to be successful in school, our children need support from both the home and school. We know a strong partnership with you will make a great difference in your child's education. As partners, we share the responsibility for our student's success and want you to know that we will do our very best to carry out our responsibilities. We ask that you guide and support your child's learning by ensuring that he/she:

- 1) Attends school daily and arrives on time ready for the day's learning program
- 2) Completes all homework given by teachers
- 3) Reads daily to develop a love for reading and to improve literacy skills
- 4) Shares school experiences with you so that you are aware of his/her school life


