Parental Communication Policy

At Amsleigh Park PS we are committed to effective communication and ensuring that appropriate opportunities exist for parents to raise any concerns and ask questions related to their child's education, wellbeing and progress. Following on from our recent 'Get to Know You' Interviews I want to remind everyone about this. Typically, parents will need to make an appointment to meet with their child's teacher, especially if the matter needs an in-depth discussion. A meeting such as this is best done at a mutually convenient time, where there is enough time to have a proper discussion. Please contact the office if you wish to make an appointment with one of our teaching staff.

Before school is usually **not** convenient to contact teachers as they are usually making final preparations for teaching. A brief message is usually Ok before school, so long as lengthy discussion is not required. After school is the best time and our teachers will endeavour to fit this in around our regular meetings, which are held on Mondays and Wednesdays. If anyone has any questions about this policy, which was developed and approved by the School Council, please contact me.

Building Works Update

We are awaiting the final completion of civil works at present, which include construction of new asphalt pathways linking our buildings. This is due to commence next Monday. Construction of our new garden in the same area should commence sometime soon after. For those who may have not caught up with the fact, we have been the recipient of a special grant, in addition to our building works, to construct a fantastic landscaped garden for all to enjoy.

Pictured to the right is the design which shows the 'walking maze' that links into a meandering path. As students walk along the path they go through a pergola with coloured roofline, before heading over the dry creek bed, past lots of interesting and colourful plants. Other features include walking logs and a new sand pit. It's going to be a great addition to our school outdoor spaces.



Learning to Learn

During the first two weeks of the school year all of our classes focus on 'learning to learn' in order to establish a solid foundation for the school year. This learning is tailored to the needs of each year level and enables each teacher to develop clear expectations with their class, with students having a 'voice' in some aspects of the environment, such as class rules. During this time the teacher also reinforces the important habits of the mind that aid learning, such as focusing on learning, persevering with challenging tasks and working collaboratively. It is vital for all learners to develop an understanding of how they learn best, and what areas they need to develop, as these skills will be used all throughout life. Classes have now commenced the academic year and I can see the learning tone in all classes is well established.

Important Safety Message

It has come to our attention that some parents are entering the driveway off Oakleigh Street to drop off children in the mornings. We respectfully ask that parents do not use this driveway, which could potentially cause a hazard for other students and parents. Oakleigh Street is designed with a turning circle that enables drivers to make a U-turn and then drop off children next to our school grounds. Students should enter via the pedestrian gate thanks. We need the full support of all community members to ensure we keep the school entry points safe for all.

CCTV

I want to inform our community, as a courtesy, that we have CCTV cameras all around Amsleigh Park PS. The purpose of these cameras is to provide security for our school campus out of school hours. CCTV is a very effective deterrent and helps us to ensure we are not subject to vandalism.

Traffic Safety

Last newsletter I wrote about the importance of traffic safety and the 40kmph speed zones around Amsleigh Park Primary School. Another reminder to our school community is to please take care with vehicles around the school to ensure our students and families stay safe. Specifically, when using the Oakleigh Street entrance at the back of the school to pick up and drop off your child/ren, please ensure you are using the 'bowl' of the Oakleigh Street court to turn around, and that you don't turn into the staff carpark entrance to complete a three point turn. This causes a safety issue around students walking along the street to get to the pedestrian gate, as well as stopping the flow of traffic in the street. Thanks for your support with this, it is important we all work together to ensure all our students and families stay safe.

On Friday 15th March from 3:30-6:00pm, we are holding a whole school working bee. We would love to see as many families as possible attend, to help keep our school yard looking great. 


