Principal's Report

Having a stable enrolment is important, and therefore promoting Amsleigh Park PS is a vital part of my work. However, I do know that the most powerful message is parent to parent, so please make sure you encourage other families to consider our school. Whilst, we are not looking to build an 'empire' we do aim to maintain at least two classes at each year level. In my view this is an optimum size school as we can provide a broad range of programs and learning opportunities, whilst still maintaining a school community in which our students are well known to all staff.

Mid-Year Reports – Information for Parents

Our teachers have been very busy in the past few weeks analysing mid-year assessments and writing student reports. Like most schools in Victoria, our reporting process includes two formal reports, one at mid-year and one in December. It takes many hours to prepare these reports, and our aim is to make sure they are easy to understand and provide a clear indication of each child's progress when assessed against the Victorian Curriculum. The report includes a table showing the current progress in a range of curriculum areas, a written comment related to personal qualities, and two further more detailed tables for English and Mathematics to show children's progress in recent learning. Reports are also included for each specialist program, with a description of the learning focus, and comments regarding children's progress. A sample of the table showing progress against the Victorian Curriculum is included below.

The blue dot indicates your child's progress at school. In this example, the child is achieving **at** the expected level. When the dot is on either side of the yellow band, the child is achieving **at** the expected level. A dot placed **above** the band shows when a child is above expected or **below** the band when achieving below expected.

EVERY DAY COUNTS

SAME-DAY NOTIFICATION OF UNEXPLAINED STUDENT ABSENCES

Fact sheet for parents/carers

If your child is sick or absent, you are required to notify their school **as early as possible** on or before the day of absence using one of the following methods:

1. **Online:** log the absence directly using your school's IT platform – **FlexiBuzz**
2. **Email:** the school and provide the staff with your child's name, class, date of absences and reason, amsleigh.park.ps@edumail.vic.gov.au
3. **Telephone:** the school office and let the staff know your child's name, class, date of absences and reason. **Phone 9544 1553**

Notifying the school of your child's absence either prior to, or on the day that they will be away, helps ensure the safety and wellbeing of children and will fulfil your legal responsibility.

Why do I need to notify the school if my child is absent?

Schools need to know when and why a child is absent and you need to know if your child isn't at school.

From the end of Term 2 2018, all Victorian government schools are required to contact parents/carers as soon as practicable on the same day of an unexplained student absence. If your child is absent on a particular day and you have not contacted the school to explain why, the absence will be marked as unexplained.

This system also promotes daily school attendance. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education, they learn new things every day – missing school puts them behind.

What is your responsibility?

You are legally required to ensure your child attends school every day or you must provide an explanation for their absence. You should let the school know in advance of any upcoming absences or let them know in the morning if your child won't be at school. In order for schools to implement the same day notification requirement, it's essential that you provide the school with your most up-to-date contact details.

Generally one notification will be sent per family. Should there be circumstances that require both parents and carers to be notified, please contact the school to make the necessary arrangements.

What is the school's responsibility?

The school must notify you of an unexplained absence in relation to your child as soon as practicable on the same day.

Schools will let you know either by your school's online communications app, SMS, phone call or email. If you can't be reached because the school does not have your correct contact details (i.e. changed phone number, SMS/email failure notification received etc.), the school will attempt to make contact with any emergency contact/s nominated on your child's file held by the school. Where possible, this contact will be made on the same day of the unexplained absence.

Where can I learn more about the process for managing student absences?

Ask your school for a copy of the *Attendance Policy* which outlines the school's processes and procedures for monitoring, recording and following-up of student absences.


