Principal's Report

New Playground - Coming in Term 4

I'm very excited to announce that we will be constructing a new playground for our Grade 3-6 students to further enhance their play options. (See picture) The new playground will offer lots of new and different apparatus compared to what we have now and is designed as a circuit. In researching this project, we presented a range of options to our Grade 3-6 students, and they overwhelmingly voted for this design. Their voice was very important in this process to ensure we went ahead with an option that our students were excited about using. Our Parents and Friends Assoc have played a central role in getting this playground to reality, raising 50% of the funds during the past

couple of years, the final contribution of \$25000 is greatly appreciated. It's a huge community effort. The playground will be installed sometime in November, and should be awesome.



Teddy Bears Hospital

Lots of our Preps most precious 'teddies' had a health check last week in the 'Teddy Bear's Hospital Program'. Run by Monash University this program introduces medical students, who will be future doctors, to the skills of working with and relating to children. Our Preps also benefit greatly through the opportunity to learn about what a doctor does, the equipment they might use, such as a Stethoscope, all with the aim of reducing their anxiety when visiting a medical professional. The Teddy bears Hospital is an annual program for our Preps and they love the experience, especially the chance to bring along a much loved teddy to school. This year I noticed that Teddy bears have really increased in size, some of them were bigger than the actual child carrying it!

Sun Smart

It's time to dig out your hats because September 1 is the first day of Sun Smart for 2019

- 1. **Slip** on some sun-protective clothing that covers as much skin as possible.
- 2. **Slop** on broad spectrum, water resistant SPF30+ (or higher) sunscreen. Put it on 20 minutes before you go outdoors and every two hours afterwards. Sunscreen should never be used to extend the time you spend in the sun.
- 3. **Slap on a hat** broad brim or legionnaire style to protect your face, head, neck and ears.
- 4. Seek shade.
- 5. **Slide** on some sunglasses make sure they meet Australian Standards. All students need to organise to have a hat at school from Monday 2nd September, otherwise they need to play under the art room veranda.



Book Week Fun

Book Week is always a great time to enjoy the latest children's books, highlighting the wonderful world of reading, and the many great stories to enjoy. This year we celebrated with a special 'pyjama' day, and this included a bedtime stories session with hot chocolate in Prep – Grade 2. Our Grade 3-4s also had a special focus day on the Picture story Books of the Year, and put their creativity to good use in creating some responses, some of which are on display in our Admin area.

District Athletics

Amsleigh Park PS students love their sport, and enjoyed a great day at the District Athletics on Monday this week. Competing in the Oakleigh District, our school enjoyed the carnival, and worked together as a team. There were lots of great moments, so well done to all of our competitors. It's great to hear that 14 students are proceeding on to the Divisional Athletics. Many thanks to the parents who accompanied the team on the day to help out, and thanks to Miss Hayes and our Grade 5/6 teachers for organising the team on behalf of our school. All greatly appreciated.

Replacement Teaching Staff

Unfortunately, one of the professional hazards that teachers face is the constant exposure to viruses and illnesses that seem to always be present in the wider community. Whilst, we do build up our resistance, it does mean that teachers will get sick, and need to be at home to recover. In this instance we will normally organise for a casual relief teacher, often a person who is known to our school and students, to teach the class for the day. If a relief teacher is not available then our next alternative is to split the class up amongst our other grades, which works quite well, as our students spend time with teachers and children they know well. This year there has been a high demand across the school system for relief teachers, and in some instances we have not been able to get someone as a replacement. So, if your child reports a different arrangement for their day at school this might explain it.

Child Safe Standards

In 2016, the Victorian Government accepted the recommendations from the 'Betrayal of Trust' Inquiry into Child Abuse leading to the creation of Ministerial Order No. 870. This legislation sets out the specific actions all schools must take to ensure we maintain a child safe environment. It specifically focuses on reducing the incidence of Child Abuse across the community. As a school we play an important role in this area, and we do not accept child abuse in any form.

In meeting the following child safe standards, it is our moral and legal responsibility to create and maintain a child safe organisation that demonstrates:

- □ a child safe policy or statement of commitment to child safety
- a code of conduct that establishes clear expectations for appropriate behaviour with children
- □ screening, supervision, training and other human resources practices that reduce the risk of child abuse by new and existing personnel
- □ processes for responding to and reporting suspected child abuse
- □ strategies to identify and reduce or remove risks of child abuse
- □ strategies to promote the participation and empowerment of children

If anyone has any questions about the child safe standards please contact us. We also have a range of relevant policies on our website including the Child Safe Policy and Child Safe – Code of Conduct.

NAPLAN

The 2019 National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) results for Year 3 and 5 students will be available very soon, and on Wednesday this week preliminary results for all states were released. These results show that Victorian children are doing well overall and Victoria remains a leading state in Australia in many domains. When they become available the individual student results of the NAPLAN tests provide diagnostic information for parents and teachers about a child's performance in Literacy and Numeracy. This information is used to support our teaching and learning programs and improve student achievement. Please remember that the NAPLAN tests are just a 'snapshot' of student performance and are conducted under test conditions within short timelines in May. NAPLAN results should be considered along-side other assessment data collected by the school. Parents are encouraged to contact their child's teacher should they have any questions about the results.

STEM Program

Mr Powell is on Long service Leave in Term 4 so the STEM program is finishing up at the end of Term 3. Hopefully everyone has really enjoyed their learning in this program for 2019. Thanks and enjoy your leave, Mr Powell.
