### Principal's Report

### **School Production**

Broadway move over, because Amsleigh Park is moving in! Next week we will be performing our newest musical extravaganza, 'The Magic Faraway Tree!' This year's show is a revamp of our very first show, which has been rewritten to include a larger cast of Grade 6 students. After a busy few weeks our class performances are nearly ready to go. Once again it's going to be an event filled with colourful costumes, fantastic singing & dancing.

Participation in a school production is a great experience for our students, and for some students it may be the only time they ever perform in this way on stage. The benefits include collaboration, teamwork, confidence and the wonderful enjoyment that comes with singing and dancing.

I want to highlight the great work being put in by many parents to make this event such a success. It's a fantastic partnership and we really appreciate your help and support. Our teaching staff are also working very hard, with many hours spent outside their normal roles to ensure it is a success. Mrs Kennedy, Miss Hayes and Miss Carr are the driving force behind our production, and their outstanding dedication to this whole school program is greatly appreciated. I'm really looking forward to next week's performances. Limited tickets remain for both nights in the 2<sup>nd</sup> round of sales.

### Ever Heard of a Ga-Ga Pit?

We love it when students use their initiate and recently a group of them got together to 'lobby' for the school to build a 'Ga-Ga Pit' for our students. Ga Ga

is a popular game that our students often get to play on school camps, which involves the same general rules as poison/dodge ball. It played inside an octagon shaped enclosure, with a group of about 15 participants try to avoid the ball touching them on the legs. The picture attached should help! It's immensely popular, and there is always a huge queue of kids waiting to play the next round.



We had not considered this before as we believed it would spoil the novelty at camp. But, we realised that our students already spend many hours playing down ball, four square and two touch, which are all very repetitive games, and yet they remain a daily routine. Hence, we think that the option of playing 'Ga-Ga' will be a great way to keep students active, adding to the range of activities at our school, without spoiling the fun of the game.

We are going to apply for a grant to construct this new play space, and if we are successful then the construction will go ahead once the funds are secured. If that is not successful we think it might be an excellent community focus, and something we could raise the funds for. Stay tuned, but either way we have accepted this request from our students, and will get it done.

### **Parking at Production**

As always we will be working hard to get all of our students into the venue safely, whilst making sure the traffic flows along and into the available parking as quickly as possible. We ask for your patience with this process, as all of our traffic management people are volunteers, and will be doing their best. Occasionally, there will be some short delays as children are dropped off, and we will be ensuring that safety is our main priority. Please listen to and follow all the directions of our volunteers to ensure that we have a safe event. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.



### Sun Smart

The weather is just starting to warm up, and we are advised that UV levels are already on the rise. Ultraviolet (UV) radiation is invisible so it can't be seen or felt physically. UV radiation can be high even on cool and overcast days. This means we can't rely on clear skies or high temperatures to determine when we need to protect ourselves from the sun. The UV Index is reported daily by the Bureau of Meteorology. The alert identifies times during the day when the UV level is 3 or above and sun protection is needed.

The Cancer Council recommend a combination of sun protection measures:

- 1. Slip on some sun-protective clothing that covers as much skin as possible.
- 2. Slop on broad spectrum, water resistant SPF30+ (or higher) sunscreen. Put it on 20 minutes before you go outdoors and every two hours afterwards. Sunscreen should never be used to extend the time you spend in the sun.
- 3. Slap on a hat broad brim or legionnaire style to protect your face, head, neck and ears.

NB: to be sunsmart it must have a brim that covers the ears, back of neck and face.

- 4. Seek shade.
- 5. Slide on some sunglasses make sure they meet Australian Standards.

Our Sun Smart Policy specifies that all students must wear a sun smart hat whenever they are outdoors at school. Please support our Sun Smart policy by providing a 'sun smart' hat for your child.

### **School Awards Policy**

It's always great to see so many parents at our Monday school assembly, especially when there is an opportunity see our students presented with the different awards such as our Excellence Awards and The Kiwanis Awards. These awards are presented according to the following guidelines from our 'Student Awards Policy.' This policy is available on our website.

<u>Amsleigh Park Primary School Certificate of Excellence (Weekly – Presented at Monday Assembly)</u> These awards recognise excellence in student learning and the upholding of school values.

- Classroom teachers will nominate students for these awards.
- A minimum of one award for each class per week.
- Specialist teachers can also make this award as required.
- Awards should be presented to as many deserving children as possible.
- Awards to be presented by Student Leaders.

### Kiwanis 'TERRIFIC Kids' Award (Quarterly, presented at assembly)

Two Kiwanis 'TERRIFIC Kids' awards are awarded each term. Levels P-5 receive one award a year and level 6 receive two awards a year. Grade level teachers will collaboratively nominate students to receive a Kiwianis 'TERRIFIC Kids' award that embody the 'TERRIFIC Kids' traits. "Terrific" is an acronym for **T**houghtful, **E**nthusiastic, **R**espectful, **R**esponsible, **I**nclusive, **F**riendly, **I**nquisitive and **C**apable.

- A child is only eligible for one award, consideration should be given to ensuring a wide spread of students receive the award across their schooling.
- Students are eligible for this award once during P-2 and again during 3-6, but not in consecutive years.

Recognising our students in this way reinforces the important dispositions, knowledge and social-emotional skills that are so important to life, and will be carried into the future.

### **School Holidays**

We finish at **2.30pm** on **Friday 20<sup>th</sup> September** as we break for the Term 3 school holidays. As this is our final edition of the Buzz for term 3, I want to wish everyone at happy and safe holiday. I hope that both students and staff get a chance to rest up in preparation for another busy term of learning. Hard to believe it is nearly the end of Term 3! Take care.

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
