Principal's Report

Congratulations Georgie

At Monday's assembly the state Member for Oakleigh, Mr Steve Dimopoulos, presented Georgie from Grade 6 with this year's Community Leadership award at Amsleigh Park. Georgie is an outstanding student leader and role model at our school, and is a very deserving recipient. This is the first of our special awards for 2019, and we can look forward to more of them at upcoming assemblies.



Staff Update

A year is a long time in a school, and like many organisations we always have some comings and goings. In 2020 we are looking forward to welcoming Miss Trish Jones back from her maternity leave. Miss Jones is a long standing member of our staff and it will great to have her back. Miss Jones will join our existing team of classroom teachers as the only change for 2020.

At the end of 2019 we will say farewell to one of our specialist teachers, Mr John Powell, who has been at Amsleigh Park PS since 2014. Mr Powell has decided to retire from primary school teaching, and intends to continue his teaching of Japanese language at a secondary college level. More recently, Mr Powell has been teaching our STEM program, and our students have enjoyed lots of Coding, Robotics and Engineering in his sessions. He also looked after Mathematics Extension and Tournament of the Minds. On behalf of everyone at Amsleigh Park PS I want to say a sincere thank-you to Mr Powell for developing our STEM program, and wish him every success for the future. Mr Powell is currently on long service leave, travelling on a school trip in Japan, but he will return to Amsleigh Park for a farewell at the end of the year.

Mrs Spillane previously taught at our school for many years prior to taking Maternity leave, and her Literacy expertise has been invaluable. A number of our students benefitted from these interventions and on behalf of all of our community I want to say a sincere thanks to her. We will keep in touch with Mrs Spillane and look at other possibilities for her teaching expertise in future.

Miss Hillary Sullivan joined our staff on a contract position for 2019, taking over Grade 4B early in Term 2. Miss Sullivan brought a huge amount of expertise and experience to our school and has done an outstanding job with our Grade 4s. At this stage we are not in a position to offer her a position for 2020, but we would love to welcome her back to Amsleigh Park sometime in future. On behalf of everyone at Amsleigh Park we offer Miss Sullivan a heartfelt thanks for her commitment and dedication to our school and Grade 4B all across 2019. Understanding Student Placements in classes

We are currently finalising the very complex process of placing students into classes for 2020. We consider many factors in this process including the number of girls/boys; spread of academic ability; level of participation; student behaviour and special needs. I want to emphasize that learning is the number one priority for class time, and whilst friendship is one consideration, we are now placing less priority on the meeting of these requests. Rest assured, our students are still placed with children who they learn well with, but we believe that these important decisions should not be compromised by satisfying friendship requests over having a productive learning environment. Students have both recess and lunch to be with friends, and this should suffice. We hope that all families understand this common sense approach, which we believe leads to the best outcome for our class placements and learning. Our aim as always is to ensure that our classes are well-balanced groups that enable our teachers to establish a productive and safe learning environment for all.

Enrolment Possibilities for 2020

We currently have a limited number of vacancies in classes from Grade 4-6, so please pass on a positive word about Amsleigh Park PS if you have a new family move in to your street or the neighbourhood. We are not

looking to add too many more students but it does help to balance out the movement of students to new areas, which happens at the end of every school year.

Our New Playground

Our students are really enjoying playing in our new adventure playground, which opened last week. The playground is based on a circuit, and was selected by our students, who were excited by the possibility of testing their skills to move around the elements. We have adjusted one of the platforms this week, which appeared a bit low for taller students, but otherwise it's been a great success. Once again I would like to acknowledge our parents and friends who contributed half the money to make this project a possibility.



Transition Program 2019

All Grade 1-6 children are currently participating in our transition program in preparation for 2020. Please look out for a special handout with further details about the information being shared with our students. It's a very important program and provides all students with high level support as they move onto their next class. Transition can sometimes bring our anxiety is some students, and we aim to reassure them that they will be able to cope with this change. Parents can support this by reminding students that they have transitioned previously, and that our teachers will be there to support them as they start in a new class. We have two further sessions in coming weeks, the final one being with their new class for 2020.


Merry Christmas




