Principal's Report

Welcome for 2020 Welcome back to another exciting year at Amsleigh Park Primary School. I can't believe that we are now 20 years into the 21st Century, it seemed like just yesterday we were talking about the Millennium Bug! Starting a new decade feels exciting, and there's lots to come for our wonderful school in 2020.



I hope that you had a great summer holiday and were able to spend some quality time with

family and friends. My family and I headed off to Port Fairy, which is one of our favourite places to escape the hustle and bustle.

January brought lots of anguish in Victoria, and we are aware that some of our families were affected by the horrendous bushfires. We hope that things have calmed down at least, but the emotional toll must be terrible for those affected. These times do remind us that some of our own issues are not nearly so hard to overcome. The bravery of so many volunteer firefighters is just amazing, and the generous spirit that so many give to their communities in times of need is just staggering. If any of our students are experiencing adverse effects of the bushfires please let us know, DET has put together a number of supports for children.

I would like to welcome back our fantastic teaching staff in 2020. You might wonder if teachers spend the whole summer vacation on holidays and the answer is a resounding no! All of our staff spent significant time in the holidays, getting their rooms ready, planning for learning and working with the teams. We also had two very productive curriculum days on Tuesday and Wednesday last week.

Special welcome back also to Miss Jones who has also returned from family leave and is teaching Grade 4. Our German language assistant Vivien has also returned in 2020 to provide learning support across the Grade 2-3 area in 2020. **Learning to Learn**

At the moment all of our classes are participating in our 'Learning to Learn' program. This special program helps our students to settle into their new classes, get to know their classmates and new teacher, and set clear expectations and tone for the year. It's a very important time, and it's vital that everyone develops the right mindset towards school. Learning to learn finishes this Friday, and from next week the academic year kicks in.

At Monday assembly, I reminded students of our school values, Respect, Integrity, Inclusion, Motivation and Resilience. Additionally, I made it very clear that students should also play in a friendly and inclusive manner, and that bullying, teasing and other such behaviour are not welcome at Amsleigh Park PS.

Kids will have their moments, and that is to be expected, as its part of learning for life. Our aim is to be fair and consistent, following the principles of School Wide Positive Behaviour Support, and teaching children the skills they need to be happy and successful at school.

Developing a Partnership with Amsleigh Park Families in 2020

Our teaching and support staff are looking forward to a productive partnership with you to ensure all students can achieve their best. We recognise that in order to be successful in school, our children need support from both home and school. We know a strong partnership with you will make a great difference in your child's education. As partners, we share the responsibility for our students' success and want you to know that we will do our very best to carry out our responsibilities. We ask that you guide and support your child's learning by ensuring that he/she:

- 1) Attends school daily and arrives on time ready for the day's learning program
- 2) Completes all homework given by teachers
- 3) Reads daily to develop a love for reading and to improve literacy skills
- 4) Shares school experiences with you so that you are aware of his/her school life.

This partnership is one of the very important components to a successful and happy school life.

Student Insurance – Reminder from DET

Parents are reminded that the Department of Education and Training (DET) does not offer any form of 'student accident insurance'. If families are concerned about this they are advised to make their own arrangements. Ambulance cover could be one consideration as the school will not hesitate to call an ambulance if we are concerned for a child's wellbeing.

Personal Goods brought to school at the 'Owners' risk

The Department of Education and Training (DET) does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools. All schools are requested to remind students and parents/guardians of this at the beginning of each academic year and to discourage parents/students from bringing any unnecessary or particularly valuable items to school. Please avoid bringing these items as it can be most upsetting for all concerned if items go missing or are damaged.

Arriving at School on-time

Thank-you to the many families who ensure their child arrives on time to school every day. Punctuality is an important life skill and a great habit to form early in life. Students ideally should arrive at school around 8.45am, which allows enough time to enjoy a quick catch up with friends before the preparation bell at 8.52am. At 8.45am, a teacher is on 'yard duty' and therefore supervision is provided from this time onwards. We are asking that children do not arrive at school early unless they remain in the care of an adult until 8.45am to ensure they are supervised adequately.

School Administration

Our fantastic office team, Karen, Meredith and Jackie, have been very busy at school since 20th January getting things organised so we have a smooth start to the year. Many thanks to them for their dedication to our school. Office hours are 8.15am – 4.00pm, and you can make contact with us during this time. A voice mail option is provided out of those times to leave messages for us.

Novel Coronavirus

As families should be aware we have continued to provide updates about this very concerning illness. We are following all Health recommendations, and asking any families who are affected to adhere to them. Fortunately, there are not too many affected at our school, but we will continue to monitor things very closely. Let's hope that the situation can be brought under control quickly. Please reinforce with the children the importance of handwashing, and sneezing/coughing into the elbow. Both simple hygiene practices are known to reduce the spread of germs and viruses.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students.
