Principal's Report

I'm sure everyone is excited but impatient for Monday to roll around. I can tell you it will bring us all great joy to welcome our students back to Amsleigh Park. I'm expecting a feeling similar to the one I get

at the start of each year, as students enter our grounds with happy smiles and excitement. Our students are the reason we chose to be educators, they give us a purpose and provide us with great motivation to help them be successful. So, just as they will return with the anticipation of seeing friends and enjoying the fun and familiarity of school life, we will be back into the classroom and the core business of face to face teaching that we know and enjoy so much.



For the next little while our focus has been sharpened to include three Statewide priorities that include; **mental health & wellbeing, learning and transition.** Across this week we have been working on translating these priorities into actions. We now have a clear plan for what we need to do, and it starts from Monday, as we start to support our students to adjust back into the routines of school life.

Re-establishing a happy and productive classroom environment, rebuilding learning stamina and motivation and rekindling friendships are all vital in those first few days. We expect students will need time to adjust as they get back into routine, but we expect that most students will bounce back well. Our teachers and support staff will be observing and noting student wellbeing, and where needed, we'll work with parents to further support those students who need it. As we get the routines in place, we will increasingly turn our attention to learning. Remote learning enabled us to maintain continuity, and we'll be observing and assessing the progress made during this time to establish what needs further consolidation. During Term 4 we will be increasing the amount of time we spend on teaching Literacy and Numeracy, making sure that this year's curriculum in these core subjects is covered thoroughly. In doing this we are confident that we can support students to meet the expected standard for their year level. Of course, there will still be our specialist programs and other learning as well, but Literacy and Numeracy will be the priority.

Term 4 is a key time for transitions, and this will come into focus in the second half of the term. We will be supporting our students to prepare to move up a year level, handing over information from teacher to teacher and planning for the continuity of learning. We have planned for our pre-schoolers to attend four orientation sessions as they begin to prepare to move to primary school, and at the other end, our Grade 6s will prepare for the move to Year 7.

We understand that some parents may feel worried about the loss of face to face schooling, and by prioritising these three areas, we are confident we can make a significant difference to each child's learning. Please be assured that we are determined to make this a success, and look forward to your support. Please read over our list of FAQs included with this newsletter to get more specific information about other aspects of our return to school.

Planning for a COVID Safe Community

By now we are all accustomed to the many rules that must be followed in the interests of having a COVID safe community. We all share this responsibility, and as a school there are a number of important actions we must undertake.

- 1. If a student or staff member is unwell they should not attend school at all. Anyone with cold/flu symptoms needs to stay home until the symptoms are completely gone. There can be no exceptions to this.
- 2. Our students and staff will undertake regular hand washing/sanitising, up to 5-6+ times per day. This includes when they arrive at school, before eating and after play times.
- 3. Children are not required to wear masks at school, although they may do so at the discretion of their parents. Staff are not required to wear masks while working in the classroom, but must wear masks at all other times. Parents must wear masks whilst travelling to and from school, according to the directions from the CHO.
- 4. Social distancing between adults is vital, and our staff will be practising this routinely. Parents also need to social distance in and around our school fence lines, and we ask respectfully that parents do not congregate in groups.

Many thanks in advance for supporting our COVID safe plan, and helping make Amsleigh Park PS a COVID safe community.

Term 4 is Sun Smart

As you get the uniforms out once again make sure you locate your child's school hat. As UV levels are now

increasing we expect that all children will wear a hat when outdoors. If you happen to need a new hat they can be ordered from the uniform shop. Please email the school or contact the office to place an order and we'll make sure the kids get their hats ASAP. Please note that a peaked hat does not meet the criteria for Sunsmart, and the hat must protect the face, ears and back of neck. Sunscreen can be worn at school, and children need to have a personal supply.

Staying in our Bubbles

Over the coming weeks you might hear your child/ren talk about being in their class bubble. The term 'bubble' is being used to help children understand the need to minimise interactions between classes <u>when children</u> <u>are indoors</u>. So, until there is a change in the advice from the Chief Health Officer (CHO), we are going to keep children to their own classrooms as much as possible. It's not that the risk is that high, but in the unlikely event we do have an infection, then the contacts are greatly reduced.

When children are <u>outside for recess, lunch or sports</u> they are not required to stay in their class bubble. It is both impracticable and unnecessary, as being outdoors is a low risk activity for infection, and let's face it kids need to play.

The use of the bubble complements all of our other strategies, such as hand washing, and together form a common sense set routine for everyone to follow.

Xuno is Coming

During Term 3 we undertook some important investigation of a number of software packages that schools can use to manage different aspects of school life. For example, having online permission and payments for excursions, daily roll marking, writing reports and communicating with parents. After an extensive process we have selected Xuno, which offers many great features. During Term 4 we will be undertaking professional learning so we are ready to introduce the package in 2021.

One of the most important considerations during our selection process was having a special Parent App that

we can use to communicate with our community on a day to day basis. The App will also allow for notifying of a child's absence from school, giving permission for excursions, making payments and receiving student reports. It will be very easy to use, and accessible from all platforms including IOS, Android, PC, phone and tablet. Many schools are successfully using XUNO already, and give it a big thumbs up. Stay tuned for more about this as the Term progresses. **And finally...**

Return to School FAQs

Understandably, as we move into the new COVID-normal, things will look and be very different from our normal school routines.

When do students return?

Prep to Grade 6s return on Monday 12th October, 2020.

Are parents allowed on our school site?

The short answer is a respectful 'no.' The normal friendly and welcoming atmosphere at Amsleigh Park needs to be different for now. The Department of Education and Training (DET) have instructed schools to be extremely careful with this, and parents must drop off children without coming onto the main school site. Our staff will be there to welcome students and help get them to class as needed.

What if I need to speak to my child's teacher?

We understand this is important, and teachers will be contactable via email or phone. If the message is urgent please call the office, and the message will be passed on.

Can I go to the School Office?

Whilst we are in current restrictions in Victoria, the office will not be accessible as it would normally be. There will be a small number of exceptions, for example, picking up a sick child.

My child only has a little 'Sniffle' can they still come to school?

In the past children have sometimes attended school with a 'slight cold' or not feeling 100%. DET has provided clear advice to schools and the community. Any child or staff member who is ill, no matter how minor it seems, should not come to school until they are completely well. Parents should also seek medical advice as required. There is no room for any school to make exceptions about this; it's in everyone's best interests.

What happens if my child becomes unwell during the school day?

Just as per normal, any child who becomes unwell will be sent over to the sick bay, and parents contacted to pick up. If a child presents with a runny nose or cough (cold/flu symptoms), they will also be sent over the sick bay, and parents contacted for pick up.

Can children use the play equipment or share toys or sports equipment?

Yes, children will be able to access our adventure play equipment, but of course it will be important that they wash their hands after doing so. It's a similar story with sports equipment and other items used in play.

What steps will the school take to encourage 'hygiene' especially hand washing?

As we know hand washing is one of the single most important things we can do to prevent the spread of any virus, especially COVID-19. Students will be required to wash their hands at routine times every day including, when they first go to class, before eating, after recess and lunch playtimes and any other time we feel it is necessary. Parents can support this by reinforcing the proper '20 second' approach to washing hands before kids return to school.

Will students also use hand Sanitiser?

Yes, we will also use hand sanitiser when hand washing is not possible. Each classroom will have its own supply of sanitiser. Can I keep my child at home even if their class has returned?

DET have made it clear that parents have the right to keep children at home if they want to. However, it will not be possible for the learning at home program to continue, as teachers will need to devote their time to planning and preparing for learning at school.

What if my child has a medical reason for not returning to school?

Please contact us if you believe this circumstance applies to you, so we can develop a plan for your child.

Can students use the drink taps (bubblers)?

This is a definite 'no' and all students will need to have a named drink bottle with them at school every day. They can take them into the yard at play time and have them in class.

Will we have Monday Assembly?

Unfortunately, having our normal Monday assembly is not possible under the current restrictions, and it may not be for some time. We are planning to run a trail of having assembly on Friday afternoon via video conference. Parents will be invited to attend.

How about excursions and camps?

DET have currently informed us that we are not able to go on excursions or camps until further notice.

Will students be undertaking extra homework?

No, this is not the plan initially, as it will be important that students build their learning stamina at school first. As the term progresses we will provide home learning that is achievable. Reading every night is still a priority, and this should be maintained right from Monday.

What about some of the community events we normally expect in Term 4?

At this stage we are not sure if we will be able to run any large community events during 2020, as it will depend on the advice from the CHO. For some vitally important events such as, Grade 6 Graduation, we will definitely have a celebration that acknowledges this moment.

Can I send birthday treats to school?

At this stage we can only have wrapped items, so a small chocolate or similar works well. Please ensure there are no items that have nuts thanks.


 avoid gathering in a group inside or around the school

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support

As our students return to school next week, we can't wait to get back into the tangible acknowledgement system as part of our School Wide Positive Behaviour Support implementation. All staff will be using tokens to acknowledge students who are demonstrating our expected behaviours and school values. The tokens are colour coded to the school value the child was displaying:



Blue – Respect Red - Motivation **Yellow-Inclusion Green – Resilience**

As previously, students will collect their tokens in their classroom and then once a week. students deposit their tokens into the whole school reward boxes of their choice! I can't wait to see which reward we achieve first!

To support this at home, you could ask your child about the tokens they have earned this week and what values they were acknowledged for.

Our SWPBS Value focus next week is Motivation, focussing on the behaviours 'I participate positively', 'I engage in learning' and 'I try my best'.

VIRTUAL

Victorian Government High Ability Program

SCHOOL VICTORIA The Victorian Government has funded an Excellence Program, The Victorian High-Ability Program. This will provide up to 48,000 high-ability students in Years 5 to 8 (Year 5-6 at Amsleigh Park) at government schools the opportunity to participate in a 10-week online extension and enrichment program, in English and mathematics.

The virtual program, delivered by Virtual School Victoria, will focus on extending and developing students' mathematic and English abilities. After completing the virtual program, students will participate in a face-to-face masterclass with other high-ability students from schools in our local area (pending Covid restrictions).

The Department of Education has centrally managed the selection process for the program based on students' academic performance. The students at Amsleigh Park who are participating in this program have commenced their first classes this week and have enjoyed meeting high ability students from other schools and their teacher from Virtual School Victoria. Congratulations to the students who have been selected to be in the inaugural cohort of this program.

Introducing 'The Resilience Project'

We are very excited to announce that the Resilience Project is coming to Amsleigh Park in 2021!

As you know, resilience is one of our school values at Amsleigh Park, as well as being a state-wide education target, 'building



healthy, happy, resilient kids'. Often we are approached by parents in our community, looking for advice on helping to build their child's resilience and it is also something we actively work on at school. Next year we are partnering with the Resilience Project, to help support the positive mental health of our students, staff and parent community.

The Resilience Project delivers emotionally engaging programs to schools, providing practical, evidence-based mental health strategies to build resilience and happiness. Some of our families may already be familiar with their work, or have attended one of The Resilience Project's public presentations in the past.

Through student, staff and parent presentations, school curriculum, the TRP App, and Wellbeing Journals, they share the benefits of Gratitude, Empathy and Mindfulness, and easy ways to practise these in everyday life. They also incorporate Emotional Literacy, Connection and Physical Health education and activities as they are foundational contributors to positive mental health. Their mission is to teach positive mental health strategies to help people become happier.

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) –Important changes for 2020 only

- The final eligibility date for CSEF in 2020 has been extended from 14 April until 5 October 2020.
- Families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply.

Parents who became eligible from April 15 to October 5 can now apply for 50 per cent of the standard per student rates. Parents who claimed the 2020 CSEF in Term 1 or 2 should not apply again.

If you now have an eligible Centrelink pension or Health Care Card and would like to apply for CSEF, please contact the general office for an application form. A copy of your eligble card will be required together with the completed claim form. Please submit any applications before October 30, 2020.


