### **Principal's Report**

### **Changes to School Procedures**

### No 'nuts' at Amsleigh park PS

Amsleigh Park PS has a number of students who have serious nut allergies requiring the use of an epi-pen if experiencing a reaction. For this reason we would like to remind everyone not to pack nuts or nut based products for students to eat at school. This includes peanut butter and Muesli bars that contain nuts. Students can look forward to enjoying these foods at home. We greatly appreciate if families can support us to maintain a safe environment by ensuring they do not send such foods to school.

#### **Shade Sail Grant**

I'm very pleased to report we are the recipient of a Shade Grant from the Department of Health and Human Services in 2020. We entered a highly detailed submission for this grant application and we are thrilled that it has been successful. The grant of \$23,000 will enable us to construct a fantastic new shade sail over the new playground we installed last year. Winning this grant means that we do not have to raise funds for this project, so we can focus on other improvements at our school. Construction will commence in January and will be completed in time for the hotter months of February, March and April.

### Grade 5-6 Camps Go Ahead

Following the greatly improved circumstances in Victoria, the Department of Education and Training have removed the ban on school camps. This change has brought great news for our Grade 5-6 students who have been invited to attend their annual school camp in the second last week of the 2020 school year. Fortunately for our students, Miss Carr had previously secured this booking with Camp Sunnystones in the event that restrictions were eased. As you might imagine our Grade 5-6s are very excited as school camps are often a great highlight of the school year. We are especially thrilled for our Grade 6s who have missed other events in 2020.

#### **End of Year Activities**

Working within the various restrictions that we are currently meeting, we are planning to undertake as many of our usual activities in a modified format. So for example, we'll still be running elections for Student Leaders for 2021 and announcing them in December. Our Grade 6s will still have a modified Graduation ceremony and can look forward to attending their Year 7 orientation day on Tuesday 8th December. All students will participate in our all-important whole school transition program, preparing them to move onto the next year level.

#### **Prep Orientation Next Week**

We are looking forward to welcoming our 52 new preps for 2021 next Wednesday. On Wednesday our newest students will visit Amsleigh Park in groups of 10 starting their all-important transition to primary school. We will be holding four transition sessions in total, one each Wednesday until the end of the year.

### Last Day 2020

The last day for students in 2020 will be **Thursday 17th December**. School will finish a little earlier on this day concluding at 2.30pm. We are intending to do our traditional farewell for our Grade 6s on this day at 2.00pm pending further advice from DET. Friday 18th December is a Student Free Day .All day care will be available from Youth Leadership Victorian on Friday for any families who require it. Please contact YLV for bookings on this day.

#### **Class Placements**

We are starting the process of placing students into their new classes for 2021. With some moderate enrolment growth we are growing from 14 to 15 classes, enabling our school to offer great class sizes for all classes. Class placement for 2021 will be communicated on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> December, as all students will be involved in class orientation the following day with their teacher for 2021.

#### Class Structure 2020

Planning a fair and equitable class structure for 2021 is underway. Through this process we must decide on the number of classes required at each level, so we can provide an optimal learning environment for all. There are a number of considerations we must make when planning our class structure which include:

- Government funding All schools are funded for the number of students enrolled and we need to staff both classroom and specialist programs
- The number of students in each year level e.g. We have 47 Grade 6s in 2021
- Class size and equity for all
- Organisation of the Curriculum

Of course the key factor in all schools will always be quality teaching, so whilst the grade structure is important, we know that it is not as important as the work our teachers do every day.

#### Ga Ga Pit

After many delays due to COVID 19 we are finally getting the Ga-Ga pit underway. This special play area for students will provide hours of fun and exercise for our students. Ga-Ga is a game that many of our students were introduced to at school camps, and is a bit like poison ball, but in this instance is played inside an octagonal shaped area. The game is played with a soft ball, that student's tap with their hands to try and get other players out. If the ball touches you then you are out, and the last person remaining is the winner. It's amazingly popular and the whole initiative was based on student's constant requests for us to build one. Funds for our Ga-Ga pit were provided through a special community grant provided by the Federal Government. Pictured below is the area being prepared for construction and to the right is an example of what a Gaga pit looks like.

### **School Uniform Parent Survey**

Thank you to our families who completed the School Council's School Uniform Survey, earlier this term. It was great to have a strong number of responses (over 160) to gauge our community's satisfaction levels of the current school uniform requirements and policy. Our School Council undertook this research as part of the regular review of the school uniform policy.

Diary Use

The results of the survey showed that 95% of families found that the current school uniform met the needs of their child on a typical day, and that overall, 93% of families were generally satisfied with the current uniform and requirements.

Noting these results, School Council have opted not to make any changes to the uniform policy at this time.

There were some good suggestions about uniform shop, quality of uniforms etc... and these will be considered as we go forward into 2021.






Today I'm writing to you about NAIDOC Week.


