Principal's Report

Welcome to 2021

I would like to welcome everyone in our school community for 2021. Special welcome to all new families joining us for the first time, we hope you are enjoying being in our wonderful school community so far. A big welcome to our new teachers, Miss Barker, Miss Toulios, Miss Vella, Mr Price and returning teacher, Mrs Dimopoulos, for 2021.

Our students have made a terrific start to this school year, and as I walked around the school this week I was pleased to see how settled the classrooms

are. There is a really sense of calm all across the school and that's very pleasing.

After such a challenging year in 2020 I hope January was a time for some rest and relaxation. The recovery from 2020 will take some time yet, and let's hope that things continue along positively. I have included a letter from the Chief Health Officer, Brett Sutton, who encourages us to maintain our COVID safe school routines in 2021.

Amsleigh Park is a wonderful school with a great staff, great students and a terrific and supportive school community, so we have all we need to flourish in 2021.



Learning to Learn

At the moment all of our classes are participating in our 'Learning to Learn' program. This special program helps our students to settle into their new classes, get to know their classmates and new teacher, and establish clear expectations and a productive classroom tone for the year. It's a very important time, and it's vital that everyone develops the right mindset towards school. Learning to learn finishes this Friday, and from next week the academic year kicks in.

Recently, I reminded students of our school values, Respect, Integrity, Inclusion, Motivation and Resilience. Following our school values is essential and we expect that students, staff and parents will adhere to them. Additionally, I made it very clear that students should also play in a friendly and inclusive manner, and that bullying, teasing and other such behaviours are not welcome at Amsleigh Park PS.

For the record our students are overwhelmingly fantastic, and this is well supported by having a consistent expectation for all. Kids will have their moments, and that is to be expected, as its part of learning for life. Our aim is to be fair and consistent, following the principles of School Wide Positive Behaviour Support, and teaching children the skills they need to be happy and successful at school.

Prep 2021

Special welcome to all of our 54 new preps who commenced school last Friday. We have 3 Prep classes this year and we are all looking forward to getting to know our new students and their families. Welcome also to the students who have joined us at other year levels, we hope you are all settling in well and enjoying making new friends.

Developing a Partnership with Amsleigh Park Families in 2021

Our teaching and support staff are looking forward to a productive partnership with you to ensure all students can achieve their best. We recognise that in order to be successful in school, our children need support from both home and school. We know a strong partnership with you will make a great difference in your child's education. As partners, we share the responsibility for our students' success and want you to know that we will do our very best to carry out our responsibilities. We ask that you guide and support your child's learning by ensuring that he/she:

- 1) Attends school daily and arrives on time ready for the day's learning program
- 2) Completes all homework given by teachers
- 3) Reads daily to develop a love for reading and to improve literacy skills
- 4) Shares school experiences with you so that you are aware of his/her school life.

This partnership is one of the very important components to a successful and happy school life.

Get to Know You Interviews

We have set aside very important time for 'Get to Know You Interviews' on <u>Thursday 11th February</u>. These meetings provide a timely opportunity for our teaching staff to form an effective partnership with each child's family. Working in partnership and having consistent expectations between home and school leads to better outcomes for our students. The Interviews, undertaken using WebEx video conferencing, are strictly 10 minutes. If families need a longer time then a follow up time should be organised. The bookings for interviews are all done using XUNO and a notice was distributed on Tuesday this week with details. Bookings are open until Wednesday 10th February.

Being COVID Safe

It's quite easy right now to feel as though we are free of COVID-19 but the reality is that this will not be over for some time yet. In order to keep our community safe we must continue to play our part which includes, social distancing, maintaining hygiene practices such as hand washing and most importantly, staying home when unwell. We must continue to ensure that any child with cold/flu symptoms does not attend school, and ask parents to support us in this important action. Any child with symptoms should be tested for COVID as soon as possible and then stay home until receiving a result. This is the best line of defence, and it might just help to avoid us heading back into remote learning. Wearing a mask in and around Amsleigh Park is currently optional, and is encouraged if social distancing cannot be maintained. Adults should always carry as mask in case.



No Nuts at Amsleigh Park

At Amsleigh Park PS we have a number of students who are allergic to nuts, and might experience a serious anaphylactic reaction if exposed. Therefore as a school we ask that parents do not send nuts or nut based products to school, including peanut butter. We appreciate your support as this can be a life threatening condition.

Student Insurance – Reminder from DET

Parents are reminded that the Department of Education and Training (DET) does not offer any form of 'student accident insurance'. If families are concerned about this they are advised to make their own arrangements. Ambulance cover could be one consideration as the school will not hesitate to call an ambulance if we are concerned for a child's wellbeing.

Personal Goods brought to school at the 'Owners' risk

The Department of Education and Training (DET) does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools. All schools are requested to remind students and parents/guardians of this at the beginning of each academic year and to discourage parents/students from bringing any unnecessary or particularly valuable items to school. Please avoid bringing these items as it can be most upsetting for all concerned if items go missing or are damaged.

Arriving at School on-time

Thank-you to the many families who ensure their child arrives on time to school every day. Punctuality is an important life skill and a great habit to form early in life. Students ideally should arrive at school around 8.45am, which allows enough time to enjoy a quick catch up with friends before the preparation bell at 8.52am. At 8.45am, a teacher is on 'yard duty' and therefore supervision is provided from this time onwards. We are asking that children do not arrive at school early unless they remain in the care of an adult until 8.45am to ensure they are supervised adequately.

School Administration

Our fantastic office team, Karen, Meredith and Jackie, have been very busy at school since 18th January getting things organised so we have a smooth start to the year. Many thanks to them for their dedication to our school. Office hours are 8.30am – 4.15pm, and you can make contact with us during this time. A voice mail option is provided out of those times to leave messages for us.

Annual Swimming Program 2021

Schools are allowed to once again provide a swimming program for students, and therefore we'll be running our annual swimming program in the last two weeks of Term 1. After a record year of drownings in Australia, it's vital that we continue to build child's water safety skills. It might be a lifesaver in the future.

I was interested to note that the largest 'at risk' group is men over the age of 45 years who can tend to be over confident when in water. Falling into that category myself, I hope that the dads out there will take a moment to think about this.



The Annual School Picnic

Unfortunately, we are not able to have the school picnic at this time. It's disappointing, but there is no way we can run this event in a COVID safe way at present. It may however be possible to run this event later in the school year, so we will keep it in mind for Term 4.

School Birthdays

Celebrating a birthday on a school day is a lot of fun, and we know that students often like to share a little treat with their class. All treats need to be individually wrapped, so they can be shared safely with the class. A Freddo Frog is a great example of a quick and easy treat to share. Please note we are unable to share large birthday cakes, as this is not considered COVID safe.

Camps Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students and \$225 for eligible secondary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, sporting activities and excursions for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 9544 1553 and ask for an application form.

School Improvements in 2021

We have been quite successful in securing grants for some improvements for our school, including money to construct a new shade sail for our new playground (\$23,000) and covered walkway (\$90,000) between our buildings. I'm working on this projects at the moment, and hope to get them underway very soon. In addition to this we have other plans to focus on across 2021 including improving our front garden area and also constructing a large undercover sports area. Keep an eye out for these improvements in 2021.

Advance notice that we have a community working bee pencilled in for Friday 26th February between 3.30pm and 5.30pm. We have missed our working bees, which are a great help in maintaining our fantastic school campus. We are so lucky to have so much outdoor space, but this also has its challenges, and every bit of help we can get is greatly appreciated.

Victorian Chief Health Officer message to Victorian schools and their communities

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome back the Victorian school community in 2021.

Following an incredible effort by students, staff, teachers, parents and carers last year, Victorian schools are well placed to safely commence the new school year. Schools will return to a largely normal program of activities, including welcoming parents and other vital members of the school community back into their grounds.

Throughout the pandemic, Victorian schools have rapidly adapted and successfully implemented measures to reduce the risk of coronavirus (COVID-19) transmission in school environments. By embedding COVIDSafe principles in all its operations and reinforcing good behaviours throughout 2020, schools have created safe spaces, and are in a strong position to quickly respond to any coronavirus (COVID-19) risks that may emerge.

Given the current very low risk of coronavirus (COVID-19) transmission in the community, continued high rates of testing, wastewater monitoring, and continued observance of health and safety measures in schools; those with medical vulnerabilities or their carers can feel reassured that they can safely return to working and learning on site.

While we have seen outbreaks emerge over the summer break, we have also witnessed our capacity to respond quickly to limit the impact of these outbreaks. Should community cases of coronavirus (COVID-19) increase again, I am confident that with COVIDSafe plans in place, alongside our ability to quickly identify and respond to cases – schools remain safe places for all staff and students. I also continue to be reassured by evidence that children are less impacted by the virus and are less likely to develop severe illness.

It is crucial, however, for everyone to remain vigilant – to stay home when unwell, get tested, perform regular hand hygiene, wear a mask when required and maintain physical distancing from others when practical. Schools should consider how they can continue to pursue strategies that contribute to reduced transmission of coronavirus (COVID-19).

Schools and parents continue to have an important role to promote and ensure testing when a child or staff member has any symptoms, no matter how mild, and then stay home. Getting tested and staying home until results are known, remains critical to limiting community transmission.


Xuno

Regular credit notes can be applied to any outstanding invoices, including outstanding 2020 Essential Education Item fees. CSEF credit notes can only be allocated to invoices relating to camps, sports, excursions etc. All credit notes are shown with a negative symbol, -\$10.00. If you are unsure of the amount outstanding, please phone the office for assistance.

A reminder to please complete page 5 & 6 of the 2021 Parent Payment information form and return to the general office. **We need a Parent Payment form returned by every family to assist with the receipt allocation.**

Student Book Packs – If you have not yet done so, please order online from Office Corporate – details below. Book Pack items listed with a zero quantity are "Only if required items". These items may be retained from the previous year if still in good working order. If needed for 2021, please adjust quantity from 0 to 1.

2021 Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF) – Eligible families can now claim the 2021 CSEF allowance. New families to the school who hold an eligible Centrelink pension or health care card should collect an application form from the office. We are required to sight and make a copy of your eligible card. Existing families who did not claim last year and have recently became eligible should also collect an application form from the school office.

Families who claimed last year through our school do not need to complete an application form, the CSEF system uploads details from last year and will advise us if families are no longer eligible.




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
