Many thanks to all of the members of our School Council, who play a very important role in our school community. The School Council provides important oversight of our school, in areas including finance, policy, buildings & grounds and Out of Hours School Care. They have a broad decision making role in these areas, and bring important parental perspectives to discussion and policy review.

Special thanks to Mrs Marnie Morton, who is retiring after serving the past 6 years as a school councillor. We greatly appreciate her contribution to Amsleigh Park PS.

XUNO Update

The roll out of XUNO is continuing well, and we are hoping that most families have subscribed to the portal and also downloaded the XUNO Family App. We are no longer using Flexi-schools for messages, with all communications coming

via XUNO email or messaging. The XUNO Family App is great for messaging, and if parents set their phone to accept notifications from XUNO you will receive them as a push notification. Please note that this is done via the phone 'settings', not in the actual App. Thanks for subscribing to XUNO, we do need at least one family member subscribed as we will send out all communications via XUNO.



Tutor Learning Initiative

The Victorian State Government has funded a large educational initiative in 2021 to support learning catch up. The Tutor Learning Initiative (TLI) is worth \$200 million across State Government Schools which is an unprecedented investment of a program on this nature. This funding is being used to employ tutor teachers to work with students who fell behind during remote learning. Typically, students participating in the TLI will have made less than 12 months of learning growth in 2020.

Our Tutor Learning Teachers are Mrs Jonga, Mrs Dimopoulos and Mrs Kennedy. It's an excellent team, and they have done a fantastic job in getting the program established. Tutoring sessions commenced on Monday 8th Feb. Students in our TLI participate in 3 x weekly sessions (Small group) with the tutor teacher, focusing on areas that were identified by their teachers in 2020. The main focus areas for tutoring are: Number, Reading and Writing, although there are also many incidental benefits, such as the development of confidence, independence, building self-esteem and persistence.

Student Representative Council / Class Captains

Sincere congratulations to our Grade 6 Class Captains, Student Representative Council (SRC) representatives and Enviro-Stars, who have been elected to this role in 2021. These students can wear their special badge with pride, as they represent both their classes and our school. All of our student leaders have a responsibility to act as a role model for all other students, both through their behaviour and learning, and I look forward to observing them in this regard across the school year.

Our SRC and Enviro-Stars both offer an important opportunity for promoting 'student voice' in our school, and we welcome their input into our school and the ideas they put forward. All ideas proposed by our student groups are given serious consideration. Many thanks to Miss Kirton and Miss Wall for coordinating the SRC, and Frau Salles who will coordinate the Enviro-Stars.

Get to Know You Interviews

Many thanks to our parents who attended the 'get to know you' interviews last week. These interviews offer a timely opportunity to reaffirm the partnership between staff and parents, and make sure everyone is united in supporting our students. These interviews also complement the handover information that teachers share about students, which is designed to ensure a continuity of learning.

Parental Communication Policy

At Amsleigh Park PS we are committed to effective communication and ensuring that appropriate opportunities exist for parents to raise any concerns and ask questions related to their child's education, wellbeing and progress. Following on from our recent 'Get to Know You' Interviews I want to remind everyone about this. Typically, parents will need to make an appointment to meet with their child's teacher, especially if the matter needs an in-depth discussion. A meeting such as this is best done at a mutually convenient time, where there is enough time to have a proper discussion. Please contact the office if you wish to make an appointment with one of our teaching staff.

Before school is usually <u>not</u> convenient to contact teachers as they are usually making final preparations for teaching. A brief message is usually Ok before school, so long as a long discussion is not required. After school is the best time and our teachers will endeavour to fit this in around our regular meetings, which are held on Mondays and Wednesdays. School Promotion

Each year we conduct a range of promotional activities so that prospective families find out about our school. Being hidden away in Oakleigh East is great, but it also means that some families do not even know we are here, even after we have placed materials at all local pre-schools and child care centres. One thing we do know is that 'word of mouth' is one of the best forms of promotion, and a positive word often brings families along for a look. If anyone asks, encourage them to come along for a tour, and they can see all the great things that are happening.

Parking Around Amsleigh Park PS

We are very fortunate to have plenty of parking around our school, and normally we have very few concerns about this. Recently however, I have been contacted by residents both in State Street and Gamble Street with complaints about parking. In this instance I usually point out to residents that the vast majority of parents are careful and considerate in their parking, but that I will put out a reminder to our school community. As residents can contact the City of Monash, please be mindful of parking according to the parking rules in the area, in case we find parking inspectors around our locality. If you are not parking correctly around the school the council will book and fine the driver.

CCTV

I want to inform our community, as a courtesy, that we have CCTV cameras all around Amsleigh Park PS. The purpose of these cameras is to provide security for our school campus out of school hours. CCTV is a very effective deterrent and helps us to ensure we are not subject to vandalism. The footage is kept for a period of two weeks, and is only accessed if there is an issue.



Developing a Mathematical Mindset – Comment

As a long time educator I have always loved Mathematics, and I have a passion for teaching in this area. I'd like to share with you some insights I have developed more recently. Recent research on Mathematics has shown the influence of parental attitudes towards Mathematics can impact on student's attitudes and confidence. I sometimes hear a parent say 'I was never any good at Maths' or even 'I hate maths' which children can quickly pick up on. Whilst this is well meaning, usually designed to provide support for the child, it can have a negative effect on their attitude. What we find is that this attitude can almost become a 'blocker' for the child, which is very hard for teachers to overcome. Learning in Mathematics can sometimes be challenging, but there is no reason why the majority of students should not be able to build skill, knowledge and confidence in this vital learning area.

As Mathematics is a Strategic Priority at Amsleigh Park, we are working on a process of continuous improvement. Many of our students do very well in this learning, and we want to make sure that all children have every opportunity to reach their learning potential. One of the important ingredients is the development of a positive mindset, through which the child has the belief that they will learn and make progress over time. Yes, leaning in Mathematics will sometimes be challenging, but with persistence, they can continue to build their knowledge and skill. If your child complains that it's hard, that's OK, just encourage them to persist. And importantly avoid sending any 'negative' messages that might influence their persistence of confidence.



I hope that all children will in turn develop a Mathematical mindset that is positive.

Working Bee

We have a community working bee next Friday 26th February to undertake some clean up around the school. If you can spare some time between 3.30pm and 5.30pm we would appreciate it. If you can bring a wheel barrow and some tools, such as a broom and rake this will help. We have such a great campus but the upkeep is very challenging. Thanks in advance, we appreciate the help.

Family Account Information

Thank you to the families that have paid 2021 fees and returned paperwork to the office. We really appreciate your support with this process. If you have any queries regarding your family account, please contact the office.

Family account statements with 2021 Fees were issued last year. You may notice two different types of credit notes listed on you statement. Regular credit notes can be applied to any outstanding invoices, including outstanding 2020 Essential Education Item fees. CSEF credit notes can only be allocated to invoices relating to camps, sports, excursions etc. All credit notes are shown with a negative symbol, -\$10.00. There may also be an unallocated receipt amount, this is also shown as a negative. These unallocated receipts are a result of a payment being made without the relevant paperwork handed in to notify us of what is being paid for.

A reminder to please complete page 5 & 6 of the 2021 Parent Payment information form and return to the general office. **We need a Parent Payment form returned from every family to assist with the receipt allocation.** We cannot assume which fees are being paid by families when a payment comes through from BPay and this is why we ask for the paperwork to be returned when payments are made.

2021 Swimming Program – Notices regarding swimming have been sent home and family statements sent out by email. Please carefully check if you have a credit amount on your account that could be used to offset the swimming charge, this will avoid overpayments. BPay is the preferred method of payment, followed by credit/debit card. Please complete and return the swimming permission form and questionnaire no later than March 4th.

2021 Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF) – Eligible families can now claim the 2021 CSEF allowance. New families to the school who hold an eligible Centrelink pension or health care card should collect an application form from the office. We are required to sight and make a copy of your eligible card. Existing families who did not claim last year and have recently become eligible should also collect an application form from the school office.

Families who claimed last year through our school do not need to complete an application form, the CSEF system uploads details from last year and will advise us if families are no longer eligible.

 All you need to bring is spare clothes and any comtort items your child may have.

Curriculum

What is covered in my daily fee?

The daily fee includes all meals the children will consume at the Centre (breakfast, morning tea, lunch, affernoon tea, late snack). We also provide nappies, wipes, hats, bed sheets, sunscreen and 5-26 formula.

The only things we ask families to bring is a change of clothes, and a comforter, if your child uses one.

How will I know what my child has been doing each day?


We use an online communication platform called Storypark, where the educators upload a daily group story with photos from the day. We also use this to share observations on children's learning and encourage families to also share their own stories with our team.
