# **Principal's Report**

## **Reflections on Term 1**

It never ceases to amaze me how quickly time passes in a school year, and here we are all of a sudden at the end of Term 1. It's been a really great term, and I commend all of our staff and students for their hard work.

Reflecting on the term I can say that the Resilience Project was a real highlight, and we are looking forward to teaching and consolidating the key messages of Gratitude, Empathy and Mindfulness (GEM) across the rest of the year. I reread the 'Resilience Project' book by Hugh Van Cuylenburg recently and it's my belief that the messages in his story are so relevant and important to our students. They remind me that we have much to be thankful for, and that we need to remind ourselves about this regularly. In building our sense of gratitude, even despite the adversity that we sometimes face, we can become more resilient and better able to deal with life's challenges.

In Hugh's book he talks about the different people he has met throughout his life, and the way in which these moments caused him to reflect on his attitude towards them. The stories are both engaging, yet sad in parts, but the overwhelming message is his admiration of the gratitude and strength shown by these individuals despite everything they faced, be it severe poverty, disability or mental illness. In the process he realised that he could and should look at the challenges in his own life differently, and in doing so discovered that he was able to build greater resilience.

The Resilience Project was originally created for schools, but it's been taken up all across Australia, including all AFL and NRL clubs, large and small corporations and any organisation looking to help their people to be more resilient. If you can get a hold of the book, it's a good read!

After 10 years of working in our wonderful Education Support team, Helen Wright will be retiring at the end of Term 1. Helen has been an integral member of our ES team, and has provided fantastic support to many students and staff over a long period of time. # A Doggy Dilemma

We have always been welcoming of dogs in and around our school, and I often notice how much joy this brings to our students, staff and other parents. We know that dogs and pets in general are not for everyone, but as long as it's managed carefully and parents are responsible then it's OK. For the record I'm also a dog owner, and I believe in responsible pet ownership, which includes 'picking up' after my dog at all times.

Recently, we have noticed that some dog owners are not practising responsible pet ownership, and are not picking up after their dog. Whilst, we suspect it's the dog walkers using our campus after school and on weekends, I'm reaching out to our community as well. It would be of great disappointment to many local families if we have to have to close off our campus to the local community, we know that it's valued open space, and one of the best spots around to enjoy the fresh air. For the record many schools are locked up out of hours, but we have resisted doing this, as our school is a valuable community asset.

I would also say that it's not the doggie school who use our site on Saturday mornings, as they know as a strict condition of their usage, that all dog training includes being a responsible pet owner.

So, starting with our community first, I'm just reaching out to remind all dog owners to please pick up after their dog/s, and if they see other dog walkers out of hours to pass on this reminder from our school. Alternately, let me know if you see someone not being responsible, and I'll keep an eye out for them, as we certainly don't want any conflict to arise. Thanks in advance for helping us with this dilemma.

## FAQs about COVID-19

Can we have indoor assemblies?

The Department of Education have stipulated that assemblies that involve parents or carers can only go ahead if the density limits of 1 person per 2sqM can be met, and this includes students and staff. Unfortunately, this means we cannot have indoor assemblies until the Chief Health Officer removes this requirement. We'll continue to have outdoor assemblies when the weather is fine in Term 2. In the case of bad weather the assembly will move indoors and will be staff and students only. A notification will be made using XUNO in this instance.

### Monitoring Online Behaviour during School Holidays

No doubt our students are very much looking forward to their Easter break with their family, and everyone has certainly worked very hard and deserves a good rest. The impending school holidays however, always poses a risk that children will increase their time online, including access to movie content, gaming and/or general internet surfing. This is a time of increased risk in this space and portals such as, You Tube, and social media in general can be difficult to monitor. It might be a good moment to revise your family rules and expectations about the way children use technology, and what they are



accessing, and for how long. And remember, it does keep kids busy, so it's easy to ignore the fact they are not spending time outdoors or socialising with friends.

# Looking Ahead to Term 2

There's a great deal for our students and staff to look forward to in Term 2. Our Grade 3/4s and 5/6s will both have their annual school camps to Camp Manyung and Camp Kangaroobie respectively. These events are always a great highlight of the school year. 

# FROM THE SCHOOL OFFICE...

## **Family Account Information**

Each time a new fee is processed to family accounts, (swimming, camp, etc) a statement will be sent home via email. You may notice two different types of credit notes listed on your statement. Regular credit notes can be applied to any outstanding invoices, including outstanding 2021 Essential Education Item fees. CSEF credit notes can only be allocated to invoices relating to camps, sports, excursions etc. All credit notes are shown with a negative symbol, -\$10.00. There may also be an unallocated receipt amount, this is also shown as a negative. These unallocated receipts are a result of a payment being made without the relevant paperwork handed in to notify us of what is being paid for.

2021 Fees & Charges – Please carefully check if you have a credit /unallocated receipt amount on your family account that could be used to offset any outstanding fees. Please adjust your payment accordingly to avoid further overpayments.

BPay is the preferred method of payment, followed by credit/debit card.

If you have any queries regarding your family account, please contact the office.

A reminder to please settle any outstanding fess as soon as possible. Let us know when you have made a BPay payment by sending an email to <a href="mailto:amsleigh.park.ps@education.vic.gov.au">amsleigh.park.ps@education.vic.gov.au</a> to advise us which fees are being paid so the correct receipt allocations can be made.

**2021 Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF**) – Eligible families can now claim the 2021CSEF allowance. New families to the school who hold an eligible Centrelink pension or health care card should collect an application form from the office. We are required to sight and make a copy of your eligible card. Existing families who did not claim last year and have recently become eligible should also collect an application form from the school office. Families who claimed last year through our school do not need to complete an application form, the CSEF system uploads details from last year and will advise us if families are no longer eligible.

# **Absences / Late Arrivals**

A reminder that all absences should be reported first to the General Office. Admin staff process all attendance data, teachers are notified during this process. Absences can be notified by Xuno, email or phoning the school and selecting 1 when prompted to leave an absence message. Students arriving late to school must be signed in at the office by a parent. Please complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip", hand this to your child so they can then proceed to their classroom and parents can then depart from the general office.
