## **Principal's Report**

I feel most fortunate that I was able to spend extended time with my family, and we enjoyed some time away on the mighty Murray River. Echuca is a lovely town to visit and has some great history to take in. I trust that our students enjoyed getting out in the fresh air and had plenty of time to recharge the batteries.

In Term 2 we can also look forward to many great school events such as: Education Week, Grade 3-4 Camp, Grade 5-6 Camp, Cross Country, the Mother's Day Stall, Winter Sport, School Aerobics competitions and with some luck, the School Disco. Most of our classes will also be attending and participating in some great incursions and excursions. I am greatly looking forward to a busy and productive term of learning!



#### **Easter Raffle**

A very sincere thank-you to the whole Amsleigh Park PS school community for your support of our Easter Raffle in Term 1. We had over 30 prizes on offer, and this generated the regular amount of excitement for our students. I'm pleased to report that we made a handsome profit of about \$800.00 to add to our locally raised funds.

## **Open Morning 2021**

In 2021 we are holding an Open Morning on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> May to promote the school to prospective parents. The target group are families for children in 3 or 4 year old kindergarten in 2021. On the day we will have student leaders doing some tours of our school, and lots of staff will be in attendance to answer questions and showcase our learning programs. It's really important that we continue to promote our school effectively, and make sure that everyone in our local community knows where we are located.

If you have friends who might be interested please encourage them to come along. There will be a jumping castle and FREE sausage sizzle for our little visitors. <u>Existing families with children in pre-school</u> are also welcome to come along, even if just to have some fun on the Jumping castle. As I have said before our best promotion is 'word of mouth' between parents, so we are ever reliant on our community to help out.

#### School Garden Upgrade

Works are currently being completed the install artificial grass in our inclusion garden to fix up the mandala maze. The initial solution to paint the maze was not successful, and the contractor has been good to undertake these remediation works at their expense. Working around some wet weather this week, the contractor is hoping to finish ASAP. The artificial grass solution should provide a low maintenance space for years to come, and the bright colours look terrific.

#### **Swimming Program**

## **Computer Upgrades**

We follow an ongoing cycle of upgrades to our computer equipment, and recently added 20 new I-pads to the fleet. We are actually very well equipped across our whole school offering I-pads in Prep – Grade 2, Netbooks (mini laptops) in Grade 3/4 and Chrome Books in Grade 5/6. Our students get ample opportunity to use technology as a resource to support their learning, and are often very engaged in this aspect of the classroom program. To complement this our students also have subscriptions to Mathletics/Maths Seeds and Reading Eggs, which can be used both at home and school.

The use of technology as a key resource to support learning is important, as it can provide valuable opportunities to broaden understandings, consolidate learning from class and explore new skills and knowledge. It does not however take the place of effective instruction (teaching) in the classroom, and it is not intended as a tool for this purpose. It's an important distinction, and as a person who has always been very strong in advocating for technology, I also understand that it works best when it's used as a resource to support effective teaching. Our current fleet of nearly 200 IPads, laptops and PCs offers our students ample opportunities to access technology to support their learning.

## **Library Helpers**

Our Library Technician retired in 2020 and we have recently readvertised this part time position, and hope to appoint someone to the role very soon. In the past we have also been fortunate to have some volunteer parents helping out in the library, covering new books, and helping to keep it in shape. If anyone has some time to assist please let us know, we can always use some extra help.

## Front Garden Improvements

We have recently embarked on some improvements to our front garden areas, cleaning off the existing paved areas, and removing some old wooden seating. It's already looking better, and we'll continue to get this area back into shape over the coming months. At our next community working bee on Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> May we will focus on this area, removing some old foliage from the garden beds.

## **OLD PCs for Free**

After a recent upgrade in our STEM lab we have about 15 old desktop computers that are destined for the recyclers. If anyone would like one please come to school. They are still working and have a Windows 7 license. Contact the office and they will pass the message onto myself.

## **School Uniform Reminders**

Sun Smart ends at the start of May, but please be aware of the weather, which can be variable at this time of year. Hopefully we will still get some sunny days, and if so then a sun smart hat is a wise choice. The UV rays can still be just as strong as in summer.

As we head into the colder months lost property becomes a big challenge, with students often misplacing their jackets or windcheaters. Having these items of clothing clearly labelled is vital, as they can quickly be returned to their owner. We are sometimes surprised to see near new jackets in the lost property box without being labelled.

For girls who prefer to wear a school dress they must wear navy leggings rather than track pants under the dress. Wet weather jackets are OK, but they are not a replacement for a bomber jacket or windcheater.

Thanks in advance for assisting us to meet our uniform policy. We believe it's a fair and practical policy that offer lots of choices, without having unrealistic expectations. This policy is well supported by our non-profit uniform shop that is run for the benefit of everyone in our school community. Many schools no longer offer a uniform shop on-site and we are grateful to Libby Jumas who generously gives her time to provide this community service. It also means that our uniforms are a good deal cheaper, as we sell them at the wholesale price we pay for them.

## Year 6-7 Transition 2021-2022

The state wide Victorian Government School Year 6-7 Transition process has commenced, with all year 6 students receiving their Transition Information Packs earlier this week. This pack included the 'Application for Year 7 Placement 2022' form, which all students, including those attending an independent school in 2022, must return by Friday 14<sup>th</sup> May. Please ensure you have returned this form by the due date so your child's form may be sent off to the relevant secondary school in a timely manner.



If you would like your child to attend an Independent Secondary School, please contact them directly about the application and enrolment process, as they work with a different process than Government Secondary Schools.

If you are yet to decide on the secondary school you wish your child to attend, we encourage families to attend the Open Days and/or Nights of many secondary schools in the area to see the broad array of educational opportunities they may offer your child. Some of our local Secondary Schools have already had their open night for this year, however we encourage you to contact any schools you are interest in for a tour.

## FROM THE SCHOOL OFFICE...

## Family Account Information

Each time a new fee is processed to family accounts, (swimming, camp, etc) a statement will be sent home via email. You may notice two different types of credit notes listed on your statement. Regular credit notes can be applied to any outstanding invoices, including outstanding 2021 Essential Education Item fees. CSEF credit notes can only be allocated to invoices relating to camps, sports, excursions etc. All credit notes are shown with a negative symbol, -\$10.00. There may also be an unallocated receipt amount, this is also shown as a negative. These unallocated receipts are a result of a payment being made without the relevant paperwork handed in to notify us of what is being paid for.

# 2021 Fees & Charges – Please carefully check if you have a credit /unallocated receipt amount on your family account that could be used to offset any outstanding fees. Please adjust your payment accordingly to avoid further overpayments.

BPay is the preferred method of payment, followed by credit/debit card. If you have any queries regarding your family account, please contact the office.

A reminder to please settle any outstanding fess as soon as possible. Let us know when you have made a BPay payment by sending an email to <u>amsleigh.park.ps@education.vic.gov.au</u> to advise us which fees are being paid so the correct receipt allocations can be made.

**2021 Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF)** – Eligible families can now claim the 2021 CSEF allowance. New families to the school who hold an eligible Centrelink pension or health care card should collect an application form from the office. We are required to sight and make a copy of your eligible card. Existing families who did not claim last year and have recently become eligible should also collect an application form from the school office. Families who claimed last year through our school do not need to complete another application form, the CSEF system uploads details from last year and will advise us if families are no longer eligible.

## Absences / Late Arrivals

A reminder that all absences should be reported first to the General Office. Admin staff process all attendance data, teachers are notified during this process. Absences can be notified by Xuno, email or phoning the school and selecting 1 when prompted to leave an absence message. Students arriving late to school must be signed in at the office by a parent. Please complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip", hand this to your child so they can then proceed to their classroom and parents can then depart from the general office.

#### Our Biodiversity audit on March 1st by Gemma and Eloise

On March 1st the Enviro Stars had an amazing visit from one of the workers at CERES. We learnt all about Biodiversity from our incursion leader, Mairead. Mairead is our Resource Smart School Coordinator who is helping us to become a more sustainable school.

We were put in to little groups and counted different biodiversity features at our school. We counted understorey and shrubs (trees under 6 metres), canopy (trees over 6 metres), ground cover (what you find on the ground) and native animals.





At the end of our incursion, we brainstormed many different ideas of how we can increase our biodiversity at school.

We thought of bird/animal houses, frog ponds, more trees and shade.



## Getting ready for Nude Food Days in Term 2
