Principal's Report

Welcome to Term 3

It's a pleasure to welcome the Amsleigh Park Primary School community back for Term 3. I hope that the school holidays gave you time to spend together as a family and that our students were able to recharge their batteries after a big Term 2. For our staff it was a time to rest up after a very intensive semester, and I encouraged them to focus on rejuvenating in preparation for the term ahead. The mid-year break is a good moment for teachers to take a decent break before we move into the second half of the school year.



On Monday we had a special whole school get together to set the tone for the term ahead. To start it off we all enjoyed a special performance of our Victorian State Champion School Aerobics team, the Rip Curls. Miss Hayes also presented the winners of the Lego Masters from Term 2, and we marvelled at their creations.

Towards the end of our assembly, I reminded our students and staff that Term 3 is the 'hardworking term.' It's traditionally described this way because it is a time that students can really accelerate in their learning. I challenged our students to make each day count, and to persist when things are difficult. In the second half of Term 3, we will undertake our whole school production, which is appropriately named, 'There's no Business like Show Business.' The Grade 6s are currently auditioning for roles in the main cast, and around week 5 the classes will start to learn their songs and dances. We are not aiming for a live performance given the current constraints, and instead we are planning to make a special movie to share with our community.

Amsleigh Rip Curls are State Champions

Our fantastic Aerobics program continues to achieve success, with our team for 2021, the Rip Curls, winning the Victorian State Championship in their division. It's an outstanding success for team members who have all worked very hard for a number of years to develop their skills. I want to say a huge congratulations to them for this wonderful success, which is well deserved. A very special thanks our coaches, Miss Hayes and Miss Carr, who continue to show great dedication to this program on behalf of Amsleigh Park. 100 Days of Prep

Our Preps are looking forward to celebrating their 100th day of school in Term 3. This is a big milestone for our Preps, and a marvellous celebration of their first year at school. I visit our Prep classes nearly every day and I am constantly amazed at their progress and learning development. It's a wonderful community of learners, who dazzle every day at school!

200 Nights of Reading

At the start of this year, we once again set a goal for all Amsleigh Park students to reach at least 200 Reading nights for 2021. The idea behind setting this goal was to really highlight the importance of completing reading practice at home. There is no doubt that children who read regularly improve their literacy skills, including reading, spelling and writing.

In the early years of schooling, parents will normally have to support and assist their child with this reading practice, however as their fluency increases many children are able to read independently. As a general rule a fluent reader (Grade 2-4) should be able to read for at least 15 to 20 minutes without losing concentration. Older students (Grade 5 – 6) should be able to build up their reading stamina around 25 to 30 minutes.

We have been very pleased to see how many of our students have taken up this challenge and it is our hope that the vast majority of children all read for a minimum of 200 nights this year. Children should now be at the halfway point (100 nights), and there is still plenty of time to catch up. It's also very pleasing to see that some of our students have already completed 150 reading nights. Anyone who completes 300 reading nights should come and see me for a special acknowledgement.



Being a COVID Safe School

The COVID situation in Australia remains variable at present. After the events this week in Victoria, we can see how quickly things can change. The staff and I are very conscious of maintaining our well-established routines such as hand washing and sanitising. We also have enhanced our daily cleaning, with sanitising of all high touch points in focus. We also need the support of every family to make sure that students do not come to school if they are unwell. We don't want to inconvenience our families, but it's vital that everyone helps to keep our community safe.

Currently masks are not required when outdoors, but social distancing is a must. Masks are required to be worn indoors. In addition, anyone who visits the office needs to sign in using the Victorian Government QR code, which is now a law in Victoria and must be done. If you are picking up or dropping off students you are not required to use the QR codes providing you remain outdoors.

The next few days are crucial in Victoria if we are going to avoid more restrictions. The practical things we can all do is to follow the rules, and make sure to be checking for exposure sites, including the way the site has been classified for risk. For example, a Tier 1 exposure site means you have to get tested and isolate for 14 days (even if you get a negative result) whilst continuing to monitor for symptoms for the 14 days, and a Tier 2 site means to get tested then isolate until you get a negative result. Vanilla Café was a Tier 1 exposure site on Friday between 2.45pm and 4.15pm, so anyone at this site at this time must isolate for 14 days even if returning a negative test. Once again I thank you all for helping us to manage the ever changing nature of these times, your support and partnership with Amsleigh Park is highly valued and appreciated.

Parking around Amsleigh Park PS

We sometimes receive concerns from neighbours about parents parking across or in their driveways. Please make sure that you park in the marked carparks, and don't park across driveways, even if it's for just a few minutes. I'm aware that some neighbours have complained to the City of Monash, and are pushing to change parking rules, which concerns me greatly as any changes could make parking more difficult. I know that our families are very considerate, but please be aware of this situation.

Trivia Night is Postponed

Due to the current situation in Victoria, we have decided to postpone our Trivia night which was due to happen this Saturday 17th July. We hope that you understand this common sense decision made to maintain community safety. A new date will be set once things settle. Our sincere apologies for this, we were all looking forward to a night of community fun.

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support

At Amsleigh Park Primary, we understand that promoting student wellbeing at school can substantially improve social, emotional and academic outcomes of young people. School-wide positive behaviour support (SWPBS) is a whole-school framework, which provides school professionals with an approach to promote improved behaviour at their school. SWPBS has been developed from evidence and data, demonstrating the most effective ways to prevent and respond to unwanted behaviour at school. Research has shown that SWPBS is successful in improving school culture and increasing academic performance. We have been implementing SWPBS at Amsleigh Park since 2019.

The beginning of this term has marked the reinvigoration of the tangible acknowledgement system as part of our School Wide Positive Behaviour Support implementation. This week, at a special assembly, some of our Year 6 leaders presented to all of our students about School Wide Positive Behaviour Support, to refresh our collective understanding of our token reward system and how SWPBS works.

All staff are using tokens to acknowledge students who are demonstrating our expected behaviours and school values. The tokens are colour coded to the school value the child was displaying:

Blue – Respect **Red - Motivation**
Yellow- Inclusion **Green – Resilience**




Students collect their tokens in their classroom and then once a week, students deposit their tokens into the whole school reward boxes of their choice. Here they are working towards a whole school reward. The three rewards students can vote for are this term are: a casual dress day, a crazy hair day; and a teacher swap session. It was also announced that from last term's hard work, the students have earned a Pyjama Day this Friday 16th July!

The students have been so proud this week of the tokens they have earned and have enjoyed depositing them into the reward boxes. To support this implementation at home, you could ask your child about the tokens they have earned this week and what values they were acknowledged for.

We have included the behaviour matrix for parents to familiarise themselves with. You will see that the matrix is based on our school values, with a breakdown of how people can show that value in different settings.
