### From the Principal Team

#### **Back to School**

It brought great joy to all staff at Amsleigh Park to welcome our preps, Grade 1s and 2s back to school for Term 4. It's been another long road for our students, so seeing them reconnect with friends and their teachers was great. I imagine they are all very tired after their school days this week. Learning stamina is like physical fitness, so it takes time and effort to build it up. In saying that our students coped very well.

Reconnecting with friends is the highlight for many students, and it shows the important place this has in school life. It's delightful to see kids at play again, and it brings a real joy to each day. I especially enjoy welcoming our students in the morning drop off, knowing they are so glad to be back at school. It's nice to reconnect with many of our parents and carers too. Monitoring student wellbeing is a high priority for teachers. If you do develop any concerns about your child, please let us know. Learning in Literacy and Numeracy is also a priority, and for the rest of 2021 we are spending extra time on consolidating these important curriculum areas.

### **Practising Kindness**

'In a World where you can be anything you want, be kind!' This quote really resonates with us, and we have put up lots of colourful posters all around our school to remind students about it. As they return to school,

we are reinforcing the message to them about being kind to each other. As it has been considerable time away from school life it is important to get our students reconnecting with each other positively. Learning to socialise with a range of people is a vital life skill, and it might be that some children have fallen out of practice, so we will focus on supporting children to renew their understanding.



### **COVID Safety is a Priority**

The safety of all students and staff is our highest priority as children return to school. We are following our 3Vs – ventilation, vaccination and vital COVID safe steps. When used together, these measures form the core of our safety plan. Having observed this in action this week all is working as expected. Wearing a mask can take time to adapt to and we are very mindful of this. We are very appreciative of the effort everyone is making to support our COVID safe plan.

### **Annual Enrolment Census**

Many thanks to all families who have responded to the annual enrolment census. We have 195 responses from families so far covering a large proportion of our community. As we are now planning for 2022, it's of great importance to know exactly how many students we need to plan for. If your child is not returning in 2022, we would appreciate knowing this information as soon as possible by completing the survey or emailing us at <a href="mailto:amsleigh.park.ps@education.vic.gov.au">amsleigh.park.ps@education.vic.gov.au</a> We need a reply from every family please to account for every student.

### Prep 2022 is on Track

I'm very pleased to say that our Prep classes for 2022 are taking shape. Despite a challenging year for promoting our school we still have a very healthy enrolment, and we will be having three classes. This week we held a special online information session for Prep 2022 families to get the ball rolling. We can always accommodate 1-2 more preps, so if you get new neighbours, I hope you can send them down to Amsleigh Park. Prep Transition will commence on Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> November and continue each week for four sessions. We will be staying in touch and updating all families if there is a need to make any changes. Stay Tuned.

#### **Student Placement 2022**

In mid-November we will start to form classes for 2022. It's a highly complex and challenging process to get this balance right and takes many hours. During this process we will also consider any information or requests that has been passed onto us by parents and carers. It can be helpful and highly relevant to have this information, so if any parents or carers would like to take this opportunity, please email us and mark it 'information about class placement 2022'. This information needs to come to me, as I keep track of it all throughout the process. We do take this information into consideration, and make sure that we are setting our students up for success. **Please note that requests for specific teachers are not considered**. It's also helpful to keep in mind that learning to get along with a range of children is an essential life skill and builds resilience and coping skills. Information or requests are disregarded after 2 years, and parents should contact us if they believe it is still relevant.

### **Curriculum Day**

We have a Curriculum Day on <u>Monday 1st November</u>, which is the Melbourne Cup Weekend. There is no school on this day for students. Our staff will be working on this day and undertaking professional learning related to our Strategic Plan. All day care will be available with Youth Leadership Victoria, so please contact them to make a booking. Tuesday 2nd November is Melbourne Cup Day and is a public holiday.

#### **Uniforms**

Kids keep growing, so we understand that it is likely there will be a need for some new uniform. The process at present is to order through our school office. We will fill your order and then you can either click and collect, or it can be passed onto the child. If you order anything please check it for size before removing the tags, as it can be easily exchanged so long as it still has the original tags. It will help immensely if all items of uniform are clearly named. With changeable weather children are often removing jackets and jumpers which can be easily misplaced. If it's named, it usually makes its way back to the owner very quickly.

#### **Sunsmart**

A reminder that as the UV levels increase at this time of year, we need to be sunsmart! The Cancer Council recommend a combination of sun protection measures:

- 1. Slip on some sun-protective clothing that covers as much skin as possible.
- 2. Slop on broad spectrum, water resistant SPF30+ (or higher) sunscreen. Put it on 20 minutes before you go outdoors and every two hours afterwards. Sunscreen should never be used to extend the time you spend in the sun.
- 3. Slap on a hat broad brim or legionnaire style to protect your face, head, neck and ears.



5. Slide on some sunglasses – make sure they meet Australian Standards.

Our Sun Smart Policy specifies that all students must wear a sun smart hat whenever they are outdoors at school. Please support our Sun Smart policy by providing a 'sun smart' hat for your child. Hats are available for purchase at the uniform shop via the office.

### **Traffic Safety**

As we return to face-to-face school, a reminder to parents and children about safety at pick up and drop off times. Please be patient and take care when driving around the school at these times, especially as our younger students return to learning about how to safely cross the road etc.. Please use the school crossings where possible and follow one way directions and parking restrictions. Thanks for your help with keeping our school community safe.

### **Family Account Information**

Credit Notes for 2021 cancelled Camps and Excursions/Incursions have now been processed. A reminder to please settle any outstanding fees as soon as possible. Let us know if you would like credit notes allocated to outstanding charges and also if you have made a BPay payment by sending an email to <a href="mailto:amsleigh.park.ps@education.vic.gov.au">amsleigh.park.ps@education.vic.gov.au</a> to advise us which fees are being paid so the correct receipt allocations can be made.

Please carefully check if you have a credit note/unallocated receipt amount on your family account that could be used to offset any outstanding fees. Please adjust your payment accordingly to avoid further overpayments. BPay is the preferred method of payment, followed by credit/debit card. If you have any queries regarding your family account, please contact the office.

### **Student Medications**

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (eg. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office. We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. This does not include occasional antibiotics. Wherever possible, parents should request antibiotic prescriptions that can be taken at home, ie Antibiotics that are required 3 times per day can be taken at home in the morning, on return from school and again at bedtime. For students that do require antibiotics at school, a parent must complete a medication authority form when handing medication into the office. It is recommended that students with hayfever etc. take their medication at home before school. All medication must be stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

### **Absences / Late Arrivals**

A reminder that all absences should be reported to the General Office. Admin staff process all attendance data, including late arrivals and early exits. Teachers are notified of the absence/late arrival during this process. Absences can be advised using Xuno, email or phoning the school and selecting "1" when prompted to leave an absence message. **Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.** Parents should complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip" and hand this to their child who will proceed on their own to their classroom and give the late slip to the teacher.

### **Contacting The School**

When contacting classroom teachers or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the 'To' address. Several emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with many other daily external emails. Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner. When responding to a teacher's email, refer to their email address that appears within their message and copy & paste this address into the address field.

# PLANETARK RECYCLING WORKSHOP

On the 6<sup>th</sup> of October all the **Envirostars** from APPS and students from many other schools were invited to a special Planet Art workshop about recycling and reusing. It was presented by two ladies from Plant Ark who taught us lots of information about recycling. We learned that recycling is reusing things and that it is really good to recycle to reduce the amount of waste and garbage in the environment and protect our animals.

We saw the process of how things are recycled and turned into new things like tin cans being used to make new aeroplanes!

Everyone can help with recycling because many things in your house can be recycled like, cardboard, cans, plastics and soft plastics. It is important to use your recycling bins properly and put the right things in the right bin.

One fun fact I enjoyed learning is that metals never lose their strength and can be melted down and recycled thousands of times and turned into something different. Also it is very important to return soft plastics to the supermarket because if they get caught up in the recycling of other plastics they can wreck the whole batch of recycling.
