From the Principal Team

Each year our Grade 4-6 students complete a detailed survey about their experience of school life and learning. The survey is anonymous and asks them to rate how they feel about school, their learning, their connections to friends and teachers, the support they are provided, if they are excited by learning and so on. It's an important survey for us as it provides a window into our student's worlds, their perceptions, opinions and feelings.

The results for 2021 are now available and we are so pleased to see that our students are feeling very positive about their school lives. One of the important measures is a comparison between schools with the same characteristics and demographics as Amsleigh Park. We call this similar schools. This is an important comparison as it compares 'apples with apples'. There are also measures against our network, state-wide data and previous years survey results.

You would imagine we would be thrilled with the following:

- Our students' perceptions, attitudes and dispositions are <u>above</u> similar schools, network and state-wide measures for all areas. This includes area such as their confidence, motivation, perseverance, classroom behaviours, connectedness and even their overall life satisfaction.
- In all domains and factors our results are not only above, but they are well above all other measures.
- Our 2021 data is even higher than past years, which have also been fantastic.

The relevant question is why we are so consistently successful in this survey. Our view on this is that it highlights the deep levels of care, concern and support our teachers and support staff have for our students. Our teachers and support staff are dedicated and committed to their respective roles and always seem to go that 'extra mile' for our students. It's also about knowing our students well, understanding their individual needs and catering to them as often as possible. We also focus on social-emotional development in our teaching programs, which includes the Resilience Project in 2021.

Student wellbeing is a high priority for our school, and rightly so, as we know

that kids who have high levels of wellbeing are more successful in their learning. In recent times this has become more important than ever, so our long-term commitment to this means we are in a good shape. Of course, there is always more to do, and we intend to keep up our work in this area now and into the future.



Managing the Sniffles

Unfortunately, when anyone comes to school with a runny nose or a scratchy throat we have no choice but to contact parents and send the child home. It's a difficult situation to manage as it could just be a cold or hay fever, but we are not able to judge this as educators. In this instance a child needs to be cleared of COVID through a negative test result or a letter from a GP before returning to school. We appreciate your support and patience as we manage this. With so many cases in Melbourne we need to be extremely careful. Let's hope that the need to be so stringent about this will change over time.

COVID Case Management

With so many cases of COVID-19 in Melbourne at present it is highly likely that most schools will be affected at some time. As you know we did have a case in our community recently and during this time it was helpful to have a clear and comprehensive process to follow. The timing of the case meant we did <u>not</u> need to undertake contact tracing of primary close contacts or a school closure. We were most fortunate this time. For the record the identity of the case is never disclosed for privacy reasons.

If there was another case at our school and any of our students or staff were deemed a primary close contact (PCC), then the following would happen:

- 1. Anyone deemed a PCC would be phoned directly by our school to inform them of this. If you are not personally called, then you are not a PCC.
- 2. A letter would be sent to the whole community for their information to state we have a case. This is simply a general communication provided by DET so that everyone is kept informed.

Our aim is not to need this process, but we are prepared.

Parent Payments for 2022

All families will be receiving a letter from the school shortly with details of voluntary parent payments for 2022. The Department of Education and Training have made changes to the categories which now include curriculum contributions, other contributions and extra-curricular items & activities.

Our families will once again have the option to purchase a book pack from Office Corporate. We have negotiated excellent value for money using our bulk buying power, so the pricing is hard to beat but families also have the option to purchase their own supplies so long as each child has the required items. Parents will place their order directly with Office Corporate and the pack will be delivered to your home. Please note the date/deadline to place your order for **FREE** delivery to avoid any extra costs.

We ask our community to support our students by contributing financially to higher quality educational programs and enabling us to provide materials and resources **well above** the standard curriculum we are funded for. Curriculum contributions are used to support all learning areas inclusive of: Art materials, English and Mathematics materials, Science consumables, ICT equipment and leasing of laptop computers, Inquiry Leaning materials, printing consumables, photocopying of learning activities, access to Mathletics and Reading Eggs software and so on. We can only provide these items with this contribution from families, as they are not included in the funding we are provided as a government school to implement the standard curriculum.

Lunch orders

As students have returned to full time onsite learning, our lunch order provider, Classroom Cuisine, have recommenced service. From tomorrow, families may place an online order for their lunch to be delivered to school on Mondays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Family Account Information

Credit Notes for 2021 cancelled Camps and Excursions/Incursions have now been processed. A reminder to please settle any outstanding fees as soon as possible. Let us know if you would like credit notes allocated to outstanding charges and also if you have made a BPay payment by sending an email to <u>amsleigh.park.ps@education.vic.gov.au</u> to advise us which fees are being paid so the correct receipt allocations can be made. Please carefully check if you have a credit note/unallocated receipt amount on your family account that could be used to offset any outstanding fees and adjust your payment accordingly to avoid further overpayments. If you would like a refund of unallocated receipts/credit notes by EFT, please email the office for a Refund Request Form.

BPay is the preferred method of payment, followed by credit/debit card. If you have any queries regarding your family account, please contact the office.

Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (eg. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office. We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. This does not include occasional antibiotics. Wherever possible, parents should request antibiotic prescriptions that can be taken at home, ie Antibiotics that are required 3 times per day can be taken at home in the morning, on return from school and again at bedtime. For students that do require antibiotics at school, a parent must complete a medication authority form when handing medication into the office. It is recommended that students with hayfever etc. take their medication at home before school. All medication must be stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

Absences / Late Arrivals

A reminder that all absences should be reported to the General Office. Admin staff process all attendance data, including late arrivals and early exits. Teachers are notified of the absence/late arrival during this process. Absences can be advised using Xuno, email or phoning the school and selecting "1" when prompted to leave an absence message. **Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.** Parents should complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip" and hand this to their child who will proceed on their own to their classroom and give the late slip to the teacher.

Contacting The School

When contacting classroom teachers or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the 'To' address. Several emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with many other daily external emails. Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner. When responding to a teacher's email, refer to their email address that appears within their message and copy & paste this address into the address field.
