From the Principal Team

Rapid antigen tests

Huge thanks to families for supporting the rapid testing program for schools. It's may not be easy to get kids enthused about this, but it is worth it. We know this is working as it has identified children in our community who were otherwise showing no symptoms. Overall, this routine screening is helping our school to stay open and that's great for our students. The Victorian Government has now extended the COVID Safe measures by continuing rapid antigen tests (RAT) screening until the end of this term.

Department of Health modelling indicates that in the first two weeks of school returning, the program has already prevented more than 21,000 cases in schools alone. Their modelling indicates, assuming a 75 per cent compliance rate with screening of students, that by continuing RAT screening in schools for the full 10 weeks of Term 1, we will prevent:

- 61,000 COVID-19 infections in children aged 5 to 17
- more than 150,000 COVID-19 infections in the overall community (on average 15,000 per week over 10 weeks, or more than 2,100 per day)
- around 400 hospital admissions.

The department will continue to supply RATs to our school for your use. Once we receive them they will be sent home with the eldest child in each family. The program continues for teachers and support staff as well. Thanks again for your support, we really appreciate it.

District Swimming Sports

We are pleased to report that our students did well in the district swimming sports this week and four will progress onto the Divisional finals. Our swim team, Sofia, Riley, Rhys, Mia, Liana, Nevenka, Anastasia, Gia and Teila represented Amsleigh park very well and we were very proud of them. Thanks to Miss Hayes who was at the pool by 6.45am on behalf of our school, it's very much appreciated.



XUNO

Thank-you to families who are subscribed and regular users of XUNO. This online tool/App is our primary tool for communicating with our school community. Most messages go out via XUNO mail and therefore will be sent to the email accounts of all subscribers. In many instances this means that a family might receive the email to both parent's email account. It is very important that the email account is active and checked regularly. Please note that we will not send urgent messages via XUNO, and if we need to contact parents urgently, we will contact you via phone.

School Council Election Ballot 2022

For the first time in some years, we have more nominations for vacancies than spots on School Council and we will have a ballot of the school community. All parents and carers who have a child at Amsleigh Park are eligible to vote in this ballot. The ballots will be sent home with the eldest child in each family and need to be returned to Amsleigh Park and placed in the ballot box. All details will be sent out with the ballot slip.

Tutor Learning Initiative

The Victorian State Government has once again funded a large educational initiative in 2022 to support learning catch up. The Tutor Learning Initiative (TLI) is worth \$200 million across State Government Schools which is an unprecedented investment of a program on this nature. This funding is being used to employ tutor teachers to work with students who fell behind during remote learning. Typically, students participating in the TLI will have made less than 12 months of learning growth in 2021.

Our Tutor Learning Teachers are Mrs De Fazio, Mrs Dimopoulos and Mrs Kennedy. It's an excellent team who have done a fantastic job in getting the program established. Tutoring sessions commenced on Monday 14th Feb. Students in our TLI participate in 3 x weekly sessions (Small group) with the tutor teacher, focusing on areas that were identified by their teachers. The main focus areas for tutoring are Number, Reading and Writing, and there are also many incidental benefits, such as the development of confidence, independence, building self-esteem and persistence.

Parental Communication Policy

At Amsleigh Park PS we are committed to effective communication and ensuring that appropriate opportunities exist for parents to raise any concerns and ask questions related to their child's education, wellbeing and progress.

Typically, parents will need to make an appointment to meet with their child's teacher, especially if the matter needs an in-depth discussion. A meeting such as this is best done at a mutually convenient time, where there is enough time to have a proper discussion. Please contact the office if you wish to make an appointment with one of our teaching staff. You can also contact the teacher via XUNO or email.

Before school is usually <u>not</u> convenient to contact teachers as they are usually making final preparations for teaching. A brief message is usually Ok before school, so long as a long discussion is not required. After school is the best time and our teachers will endeavour to fit this in around our regular meetings, which are held on Mondays and Wednesdays. If anyone has any questions about this policy, which was developed and approved by the School Council, please contact me. School Promotion

Each year we conduct a range of promotional activities so that prospective families find out about our school. Being hidden away in Oakleigh East is great, but it also means that some families do not even know we are here, even after we have placed materials at all local pre-schools and childcare centres. One thing we do know is that 'word of mouth' is one of the best forms of promotion, and a positive word often brings families along for a look. If anyone asks, encourage them to come along for a tour, and they can see all the great things that are happening. If you are still involved in local pre-schools or childcare please encourage other local families to visit Amsleigh Park for a tour.

CCTV

I want to inform our community, as a courtesy, that we have CCTV cameras all around Amsleigh Park PS. The purpose of these cameras is to provide security for our school campus out of school hours. CCTV is a very effective deterrent and helps us to ensure we are not subject to vandalism. The footage is kept for a period of two weeks and is only accessed if there is an issue.

Developing a Mathematical Mindset – Comment from Mr Cormick

As a long time educator, I have always loved Mathematics, and I have a passion for teaching in this area. I'd like to share with you some insights I have developed more recently.

Recent research on Mathematics has shown the influence of parental attitudes towards Mathematics can impact on student's attitudes and confidence. I sometimes hear a parent say 'I was never any good at Maths' or even 'I hate maths' which children can pick up on. This negative messaging can influence a child's mindset and what we sometimes find is that this attitude can become a 'blocker' for the child. Learning in Mathematics can sometimes be challenging, but there is no reason why most students are not be able to build skill, knowledge and confidence in this vital learning area.

As Mathematics is a Strategic Priority at Amsleigh Park, we are working on a process of continuous improvement. Many of our students do very well in this learning, and we want to make sure that all children have every opportunity to reach their learning potential. One of the important ingredients is the development of a positive mindset, through which the child has the belief that they will learn and make progress over time. If your child complains that it's hard, that's OK, just encourage them to persist. And importantly avoid sending any 'negative' messages that might influence their persistence or confidence.

VHAP

The Victorian High Ability Program (VHAP) has begun for 2022 at Amsleigh Park, with a group of our Grade 5 & 6 students having been selected by the Department of Education to be a part of the enrichment program for English and Mathematics.



The Victorian Government has again funded the Victorian High-Ability Program. This provides up to 48,000 Victorian high-ability students in Years 5 to 8 (Year 5-6 at Amsleigh Park) at government schools the opportunity to participate in a 10-week online extension and enrichment program, in English and mathematics.

The virtual program, delivered by Virtual School Victoria, will focus on extending and developing students' mathematic and English abilities.

The Department of Education has centrally managed the selection process for the program based on students' academic performance. The students at Amsleigh Park who are participating in this program commenced their first classes two weeks ago and have enjoyed meeting high ability students from other schools and their teacher from Virtual School Victoria. Congratulations to the students who have been selected to be in the program.

The Resilience Project – Save the Date: Evening of March 9th



In 2022, Amsleigh Park Primary School is again a partner school of the Resilience Project.

The students have begun working on their Resilience Project journals during SEL sessions in their classes, as it makes up a part of their social emotional learning.

On the evening of March 9th, there will be an online Resilience

Project Parent Session, with Resilience Project founder, Hugh Van Cuylenburg. We hope many parents will be able to attend to enjoy a positive experience for their mental health and also learn about supporting their child/ren's mental health. Details coming soon.

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support ~ SWPBS

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) is implemented at Amsleigh Park to improve the learning and wellbeing of all students. SWPBS is a whole school approach for creating a positive, safe and supportive school climate in which students can learn and develop.



All staff are responsible for teaching the behaviour expectations, providing consistent positive feedback to students, and delivering consistent corrective feedback. The entire school, including the learning areas, walkways, toilets and playgrounds are all considered part of the total learning environment.

Staff at Amsleigh Park Primary School have continued their Professional Learning about implementing the School Wide Positive Behaviour Support approach. Supported by our Department of Education SWPBS Coach, we have continued to work through the phases of implementation, with SWPBS being a part of our social and emotional learning program.

We have included the behaviour matrix on the next page for new parents to become familiar with. You will see that the matrix is based on our school values, with a breakdown of how people can show that value in different settings.

Our students have been demonstrating many of the expected behaviours and have been acknowledged for their great choices in these areas. We look forward to celebrating our next school SWPBS reward very soon! Stay tuned!

Family Account Information

Please ensure that a **completed Payment Advice is sent to the office** so invoices can be processed, and payments allocated correctly.

Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (eg. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office. We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. This does not include occasional antibiotics. Wherever possible, parents should request antibiotic prescriptions that can be taken at home, ie Antibiotics that are required 3 times per day can be taken at home in the morning, on return from school and again at bedtime. For students that do require antibiotics at school, a parent must complete a medication authority form when handing medication into the office. It is recommended that students with hayfever etc. take their medication at home before school. All medication must be stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

Absences / Late Arrivals

A reminder that all absences should be reported to the General Office. Admin staff process all attendance data, including late arrivals and early exits. Teachers are notified of the absence/late arrival during this process. Absences should be be advised using Xuno, email or phoning the school and selecting "1" when prompted to leave an absence message. **Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.** Parents should complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip" and hand this to their child who will proceed on their own to their classroom and give the late slip to the teacher.

Contacting The School

When contacting classroom teachers, or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the 'To' address. Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with many other daily external emails. Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner. When responding to a teacher's email, refer to their email address that appears within their message and copy & paste this address into the address field.

Information for families

Since the beginning of 2021, Amsleigh Park commenced using Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders; and coming soon, permission forms and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management software that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno. Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email, to create a Xuno account and password in your browser.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events.

Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.


You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

2022 Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities, including school swimming programs.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made directly to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 9544 1553 to request an application form. A copy of your eligible card will also be required to submit your application.

You can also find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page.

Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.
