#### From the Principal Team

**Bullying – National Day of Action** Amsleigh Park PS is a harmonious school most of the time, but as we know children can be unpredictable and not always at their best. On occasion we are called upon to manage 'bullying' type behaviours, although we find they are not always necessarily bullying in the truest sense. Whilst being subject to anti-social behaviours from another student is distressing, it becomes bullying when the behaviours show a repeated pattern. Usually there is also a power imbalance between the individuals, with one person using this power to hurt (physical, verbal, exclusion) the other. Often this kind of behaviour is covert (kept secret), so it is not always obvious or easy to see.

At our school 'bullying behaviours' are unacceptable and we work hard to maintain an environment in which children know and understand this. We do this is in a variety of ways focusing on prevention rather than reaction. Our school follows 'School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS), so one of our primary aims is to teach children to behave in a positive manner by showing them what the behaviours look like and why they are important. All our expected behaviours follow our school values of respect, inclusion, resilience, integrity and motivation. We call these the 'universal behaviours', and most children follow them well. In addition to this we also explicitly teach other important social skills through the Resilience Project, Daniel Morcombe personal safety program and the Zones of Regulation.

Friday 18<sup>th</sup> March is the National Day of Action for Bullying. Next week we will be undertaking some learning about being 'kind', focussing on the positive, and also reminding children that bullying behaviours are not a welcome or acceptable. One of my favourite quotes comes to mind here, '**in a world where you can choose to be anything, be kind!**' This reminds us that we have a choice and choosing to be kind is easy and does not require anything other than a positive mindset.

If parents are worried about any persistent behaviours directed towards your child, please discuss this with your child's teacher as a first step. It helps to be aware that it takes some time to investigate the situation properly and during that time we ask for your patience whilst we get a clear understanding. Rest assured the matter will not be closed until we have a plan in place that addresses the situation. Our aim will always be to maintain the safety and wellbeing of our students and bullying or other distressing behaviours will not be tolerated.

#### **Swimming Helpers**

Our Swimming program is kicking off in just over a week, and all is ready to go. This year we have a bumper year of swimmers, which is great. Classroom teachers may be seeking some parents to assist with the program. Any parents who are acting as a volunteer need to adhere to the following requirements:

1. Have a Working with Children Check Card (Volunteer Card)

2. Be fully vaccinated for COVID-19 (minimum 2 vaccinations)

Please note that the vaccination requirement is not intended to exclude parents, but the pool will check each adult's certificate upon entry, including the staff. It is also school policy to follow Department of Education (DET) guidelines for school volunteers. Thanks in advance for your support for our swimming program.

#### XUNO APP Upgrade

XUNO have released a new version of the XUNO Family mobile app. In this new version of the Family app, they are optimising the push notifications and paving the way for new and exciting features to come. After upgrading, the app will automatically log users out, requiring them to log in to the app again. Parents and students can use the same login details as they have used in the past to re-register and log back in. Here's what to do:

- 1. Upgrade to the new XUNO family APP (It's Free)
- 2. Use the same details you used originally to complete the registration form on the App
- 3. Log back in and away you go.

#### Prep Enrolments for 2023

School tours have commenced for Prep 2023 and we have already started taking enrolments. If anyone has a child in pre-school please encourage other families to come along for a tour of our school, as positive 'word of mouth' is always the best marketing tool. Any family with a child starting school in 2023 should come in and collect an enrolment form, as it's very helpful to get an idea of how many siblings we will have next year as soon as possible. This year for the first time the Department of Education has set a common date for Prep enrolment as Friday 12<sup>th</sup> August. We have space for no more than 3 prep classes in 2023, so please get your enrolment in early.



#### **Open Morning - Promotional Real Estate Boards**

We are hoping to undertake some promotion of our school in 2022 to further build our profile in the local community. If anyone has a street frontage on Ferntree Gully Road, and you would be willing to have a promotional board up for 6-8 weeks, please let us know. Our quiet suburban location is a great advantage most of the time, but it does mean we are very hidden away. Sometimes families are not even aware that a primary school is located in Oakleigh East. \*\*Breaking news\*\*...Prep Expo for 2023 enrolment will be held on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> April from 10.00am – 12.00noon. More information soon.

#### Cyber-Safety

Every year we become increasingly aware of situations involving both our students and other young children who are exposed to graphic content via the Internet. This is a concern Australia wide and we even have an e-Safety Commissioner who is tasked with promoting safe use of online spaces. You might think that this kind of thing is not going to happen to primary school kids, but unfortunately this is just not the case. It can be as easy as just Google searching the wrong word. One thing that has come up recently is the character 'Huggy Wuggy' which is found in a teen horror online game. The image is ok for some children, but distressing for others, so we need to be careful that it does not come into our school.

#### **ICT Upgrades**

We are thrilled to report three big improvements to our ICT resources.

- 1. Our Grade 3-4s have a new bank of 50 netbooks for use at school. The new Lenovo netbooks have been welcomed by our students.
- 2. We had a bandwidth upgrade from 50mps to 300mps, so our Internet continues to keep pace with the online world.
- 3. We are doing a second stage of upgrades of display screens for use in classrooms. This time we are upgrading Grade 1C, 3A, 3B, 4A and 4/5C. These displays are 75" and the clarity of the display is a significant improvement.

The <u>display screens are being funded by parent voluntary contributions</u> to our ICT program and are an excellent use of this generous contribution. All our classrooms now have an excellent display board which is an important tool for teaching and learning. The new screens will be installed over the next couple of weeks. We would be unable to do these kinds of upgrades without the financial support of our families, and it's a great example of how our school uses parent contributions to provide better resources for our students.

## FROM THE SCHOOL OFFICE ADMIN TEAM.....

#### Family Account Information

Thanks to the families that have paid 2022 Parent Contributions. Please ensure <u>a completed Payment Advice</u> Form is sent to the office so invoices can be processed, and payments allocated correctly.

#### **Student Medications**

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (eg. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office. We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. This does not include occasional antibiotics. Wherever possible, parents should request antibiotic prescriptions that can be taken at home, ie Antibiotics that are required 3 times per day can be taken at home in the morning, on return from school and again at bedtime. For students that do require antibiotics at school, a parent must complete a medication authority form when handing medication into the office. It is recommended that students with hayfever etc. take their medication at home before school. All medication must be stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

#### Absences / Late Arrivals

A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno. This ensures that Admin staff, who process attendance data, including late arrivals and early exits are receiving the information in the first instance. Teachers are notified of the absence/late arrival during this process. If you wish to pass on any further information to teachers, please send them an additional email. If unable to report via Xuno, absences can be advised by emailing the General Office or phoning the school and selecting "1" when prompted to leave an absence message. **Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.** Parents should complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip" and hand this to their child who will proceed on their own to their classroom and give the late slip to the teacher.

#### <u>Contacting The School – Check the email address you are replying to</u>

When contacting classroom teachers, or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the **'To'** address. Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with many other daily external emails. Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner. When responding to a teacher's email, refer to their email address that appears within their message and copy & paste that address into the address field.

#### **Xuno Information for families**

Amsleigh Park PS uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders; and coming soon, permission forms and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management software package that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family'' for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno. Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email, to create a Xuno account and password in your browser.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of our school information and events. Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent.

# FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

#### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

**JCATIO** 

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

#### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
