150 Years of Education in Victoria

This Year we are celebrating 150 years since the start of State Government Education in Victoria, and in Term 2 this will be the big feature of Education Week. Here's a few facts about this significant event in the history of State education in Victoria.

- The Education Act of 1872 was the first of its kind in the world.
- It was the first act of its kind in the Australian colonies of the time.
- Under the act, Education was free and compulsory, so the whole community would benefit.
- All children aged 6-15 years had to attend school unless they had a reasonable excuse.
- Education was secular, which meant there was no control by any church.
- In the last 150 years, a lot has changed. But public education remains a vital part of the Victorian community.
- Victoria's oldest school which is still in operation today is Bacchus Marsh Primary School. It was built
 on the traditional Country of the Wada Wurrung people and opened in 1850. Europeans first arrived
 on the Country of the Wurundjeri Woi Wurrung and Bunurong peoples 15 years earlier in 1835. This area
 is now known as greater Melbourne.
- In 1872 483 schools were established, and this has now grown to over over 1500 Government schools. It's a great school system and I look forward to highlighting this further in Term 2.

Parking Inspectors

Just a reminder that the City of Monash will often sending parking inspectors to the area around our school to make sure drivers are adhering to parking rules. Dropping off in a non-standing zone attracts quite a hefty fine so please be very careful. Our School Council is currently working on a proposal to increase the amount of Kiss and Go (2 Min) parking on State Street, which could help to ease congestion in this area. The proposal is to have an extra four bays of Kiss and Go parking out front of the school. This parking is for quick drop off and pick up but please keep in mind you must stay in your car or you might be fined.

The Smile Squad is Coming

The Victorian State Government has funded a FREE dental service for all government primary school children. We will be participating in this program later in 2022.

What is Smile Squad?

Smile Squad is the Victorian Government's school dental program. Smile Squad will offer free dental care to all Victorian primary and secondary government school students. This initiative is led by the Department of Health (DH) and Dental Health Services Victoria (DHSV), with input from the Department of Education and Training (DET). Smile Squad services are provided by community dental agencies. Regular dental checks can prevent or address dental health issues before they become serious. Many students do not see a dentist regularly and have poor dental health.

What does Smile Squad include?

All services below will be available free of charge to all Victorian government school students. Annual oral health examination Each school will be visited by Smile Squad who will provide a free oral health check-up to each student.

- Services provided: examination, x-rays when required, oral health and dietary advice, coaching and preventive interventions, including application of fluoride varnish. Follow-up treatment Free follow-up treatment will be provided to all students who need it.
- Services provided: scale and clean, fissure sealants, root canals, restorations (fillings), extractions, and all other treatment required. Smile squad does not include orthodontics, e.g., teeth braces.

STEM Research Survey

I sent out an invitation to families of Grade 3-6 student to participate in a special research survey investigating trends in the study of STEM (Science – Technology-Engineering-Maths) subjects. The research is being conducted by a PHD candidate at Monash University in conjunction with the Education and Engineering faculties. It's not compulsory but it is important that we participate in research projects that grow the body of knowledge in this area. Family Account Information

Thank you to the families that have paid 2022 Parent Contributions. Please ensure <u>a completed Payment</u> Advice Form is sent to the office so invoices can be processed, and payments allocated correctly.

Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (eg. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office. We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. This does not include occasional antibiotics. Wherever possible, parents should request antibiotic prescriptions that can be taken at home, ie Antibiotics that are required 3 times per day can be taken at home in the morning, on return from school and again at bedtime. For students that do require antibiotics at school, a parent must complete a medication authority form when handing medication into the office. It is recommended that students with hayfever etc. take their medication at home before school. All medication must be stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

Absences / Late Arrivals

A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno. This ensures that Admin staff, who process all attendance data, including late arrivals and early exits are receiving the information in the first instance. Teachers are notified of the absence/late arrival during this process. If you wish to pass on any further information to teachers, please send them an additional email. If unable to report via Xuno, absences can be advised by emailing the General Office or phoning the school and selecting "1" when prompted to leave an absence message. Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class. Parents should complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip" and hand this to their child who will proceed on their own to their classroom and give the late slip to the teacher.

Contacting The School – Check the email address you are replying to

When contacting classroom teachers, or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the 'To' address. Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with many other daily external emails. Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner. When responding to a teacher's email, refer to their email address that appears within their message and copy & paste that address into the address field.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- · \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.


You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.




