Kirrily from 6A won the election, starting at Gympie then, Queensland representative, finally the Prime Minister or Principal for the day.

It is also a place to reflect on the sacrifice many have made in defence of our way of life.

Whenever I am fortunate to go out with students, I feel very proud of their respectful and cooperative behaviours and mindset. Our Tour guide also stated how great our students were on the tour and that it was such a pleasure to host them, so well done to our students and staff.

NAPLAN testing next week

The annual National Assessment Program in Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) tests will be conducted next week. The NAPLAN tests will involve all students in years 3, 5, 7 and 9 from all states and territories across Government, Catholic and Independent Schools. The NAPLAN tests are being conducted online this year for the first time, and we have been preparing for this change for some time.

NAPLAN assesses skills in Literacy and Numeracy that are developed over time, through the school curriculum. NAPLAN is not a pass or fail type test, but rather shows how students are progressing in Numeracy and Literacy skills against national standards for all Australian children. It also provides valuable information that allows schools and governments to better target effort and support to help all students achieve their potential and acquire the basic skills to help them build successful and happy lives.

All students (in Years 3 & 5) are expected to participate in these tests. Some students with very specific circumstances may be exempted from participating in the tests. For information about participation in NAPLAN, you can go to: https://www.nap.edu.au/naplan/parent-carer-support/

The best way you can help your child prepare for NAPLAN is to let them know that **NAPLAN** is just one part of their school program, and to urge them to simply do the best they can on the day.

An individual student NAPLAN report will be issued by the school later this year. Parents can use this information to monitor how their child is progressing and to identify any areas of concern. Parents may also wish to use their child's results to discuss progress with teachers. More information is available at www.naplan.edu.au

COVID Management

As we get into Term 2 it's great to have school continuing as normal and I want to thank everyone for their support. We need to continue to be COVID aware and careful each day as there is still quite a few cases still occurring. So, whilst it's great that the restrictions have eased, for us at school there is still a lot to manage and we need to be very cautious. You may notice some teachers are still wearing masks. We have had several staff who have contracted COVID at school and it's a wise move to continue to be super careful. Whilst some people might get a mild dose of COVID others can end up quite sick and there is also the possibility of long COVID. It's a hazard of our role as teachers, and we appreciate the support from parents.

Rapid Testing continues for the next few weeks and we expect another delivery soon. Thanks to families who continue to screen for COVID. Anyone who has a cold/flu should not come to school even if they have a negative rapid test. The rapid testing is not as accurate as PCR testing so if you have doubts then get a PCR test. Children who show even mild symptoms will be sent home as it's simply not worth the risk to other students and staff.

Isolation rules for close contact have changed so if you have any queries about this please contact us and we can help to clarify the current rules.

Road Safety

I want to remind everyone about the importance of road safety in and around our school. Children should be using the school crossings on State and Dublin Streets at all times, as they are supervised both before and after school. Oakleigh Street is also an area where great care is required, and as this is not supervised, we recommend that students cross with an adult.

Year 6-7 Transition 2022-2023 (Relevant for Year 6 families)



The state-wide Victorian Government School Year 6-7 Transition process has commenced, with all year 6 students receiving their Transition Information Packs last week. This pack included the 'Application for Year 7 Placement 2022' form, which all students, including those attending an independent school in 2022, must **return by Friday 13th May**. Please ensure you have returned this form by the due date so your child's form may be sent off to the relevant secondary school in a timely manner.

If you would like your child to attend an Independent Secondary School, please contact them directly about the application and enrolment process, as they work with a different process than Government Secondary Schools.

If you are yet to decide on the secondary school you wish your child to attend, we encourage families to attend the Open Days and/or Nights of many secondary schools in the area to see the broad array of educational opportunities they may offer your child. Some of our local Secondary Schools have already had their open night for this year, as advertised in previous newsletters, however we encourage you to contact any schools you are interest in for a tour.

Accessible Buildings Program – School Improvement works

We are pleased to report we have been successful in our submission for funds through the Accessible Buildings Program, from the Victorian Government this term. The Accessible Building Program is





designed to help schools make reasonable adjustments to school facilities for anyone in our school community with a disability. The \$24,345 will be used to make our campus more accessible for students, staff and community members with vision impairment, going toward dual roller blinds in the JLC classrooms and building, and high contrast safety markings around the school grounds. These works will be carried out this term. We look forward to these improvements and continuing to build on our facilities at Amsleigh Park.



Hoodie Up for Autism Day

Last Friday, we celebrated 'Hoodie Up for Autism' Day, to promote acceptance and inclusion of people with Autism. Grade 3-6 students heard from April in Grade 6, about her experience of having cousins with Autism, and were lucky enough to hear from April's Aunty and cousins about their experiences too. We thank Tarsha, Oscar and Leo for coming in to help us build our collective understanding and appreciation of people on the Autism Spectrum. Thanks to April and her family for their inspiring presentation, it was very warmly received by our community. Thanks to the Amsleigh Park parents who attended also.

Be Allergy Aware

As we have previously communicated, we have several children at our school who are allergic to various allergens such as peanuts, nuts, seafood and dairy. The more serious allergies can also result in anaphylaxis, which can be a life threatening allergic reaction. For this reason, we need the support of all families to make sure we are not exposing children to any risks. We ask specifically that children do not bring any foods with peanuts, nuts, or seafood to school. This includes Nutella, which includes Hazelnut and peanut butter. It's a small inconvenience but one that really helps. Be Allergy Aware and help keep our students safe.

Family Account Information

Thank you to the families that have paid 2022 Parent Contributions. Please ensure <u>a completed Payment</u> <u>Advice Form is sent to the office</u> so invoices can be processed, and payments allocated correctly.

Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (eg. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office. We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. This does not include occasional antibiotics. Wherever possible, parents should request antibiotic prescriptions that can be taken at home, ie Antibiotics that are required 3 times per day can be taken at home in the morning, on return from school and again at bedtime. For students that do require antibiotics at school, a parent must complete a medication authority form when handing medication into the office. It is recommended that students with hayfever etc. take their medication at home before school. All medication must be stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

Absences / Late Arrivals

A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno. This ensures that Admin staff, who process all attendance data, including late arrivals and early exits are receiving the information in the first instance. Teachers are notified of the absence/late arrival during this process. If you wish to pass on any further information to teachers, please send them an additional email. If unable to report via Xuno, absences can be advised by emailing the General Office or phoning the school and selecting "1" when prompted to leave an absence message. Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class. Parents should complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip" and hand this to their child who will proceed on their own to their classroom and give the late slip to the teacher.


Contacting The School – Check the email address you are replying to

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with many other daily external emails. Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner. When responding to a teacher's email, refer to their email address that appears within their message and copy & paste that address into the address field.


