#### **Principal Team Report**

#### Welcome Back for Term 3

A warm welcome back to all members of the Amsleigh Park Primary School community for Term 3. I trust that everyone enjoyed a great break away from the rigours of school life. Our teaching and support staff were exhausted by the end of Term 2 and this was a much needed break for them. It would have been a similar story for many of our students and we hope they are also well rested. Student Reports were distributed in Term 2 and a great chance to celebrate the achievements and progress their child/ren made at school so far in 2022. I enjoyed reading the wonderful general comments from class teachers, and I appreciate how personalised our reports are. It is important to celebrate each child's progress at school, which helps to build their self-esteem and learning confidence. This would have been supplemented and supported by the midyear conversations between teachers and parents.

In Term 3 I always talk about it as the 'hardworking term.' Traditionally it is during this term that students can make increased gains in their learning and use the improvement areas from their mid-year report to set challenging learning goals. Having consolidated themselves in their current Grade level for 2022 our students should start to accelerate in their learning by focusing their efforts every day at school. Parents can support this endeavour by checking in with their child/ren as the term progresses and reinforcing the need to really try hard every day and persevere when challenged.

We would like to give a warm welcome to Ms Ali Wright-Smith who started work in our Admin team this week. Ali is joining Karen and Jackie in our Admin team and will be working in the general office on Thursday and Friday. Having only just started it will take Ali some time to settle in and we are working through an induction process. We are looking forward to Ali taking over this role. #### Well Done Sofia!

One of our Grade 6s, Sofia, recently competed in the National competition for Artistic Swimming, placing a very creditable  $6^{th}$  place. Sofia won her way through to the Nationals after placing  $2^{nd}$  in the State Competition. Even though it is a National event in Australia, there are some international entrants who are

also allowed to compete.



So, what is Artistic Swimming? Artistic swimming can be performed as a solo, duet or as a team's event that you might know as synchronised swimming. The competitors perform routines that are essentially athletic movements performed in water and choreographed to music. It is an incredibly strenuous and skilful sport. Artistic swimmers need strength to perform twists and lifts and can hold their breath underwater for around a minute. They also need rhythm and flair to synchronise and interpret the music. A hearty congratulations to Sofia for this fantastic achievement, you never know one day it could mean competing at the Olympics.

#### The Grade 3-4 Camp

In the last week of Term 2 our Grade 3s and 4s had a great camp at Lady Northcote in Glenmore. The weather was kind and our students enjoyed two fun days of outdoor education challenges including the Giant Swing, Canoeing, Archery and Bike Riding. One thing that I noticed was the way our students accepted the principle of 'challenge by choice' and many of them gave things a go, even if they were feeling nervous. The giant swing was one such activity and I was proud to see the way they tackled this challenge. I was sometimes surprised by the children who chose to go all the way to the top (21m) as not always the young persons you

might expect. The proud smiles are truly priceless, and it is these moments that help to build a depth of resilience and courage. They even convinced me to have a go and whilst I had done it before it took a couple of deep breaths to prepare myself. Being on camp is a great opportunity to build self-confidence and self-reliance in a supportive environment.

Having a great camping program is a big plus for our school and we are indebted to the staff and parents who help out. The 3-4 team was Mr Arundale, Miss Hayes, Miss Colacitti, Ms Brown, Miss Vella and Mr Cormick, with great support from parents, Michael Meyborg and Sonya Moreland. Sincere thanks to this great team who all worked hard to make it a safe, enjoyable and memorable experience for our students.



#### **COVID-19 Safety Planning**

In the first few days of term, we have already had 5 students test positive to COVID 19. Given that most were at school during the infectious period it is highly likely that it will have spread to others. It is very challenging as children will initially have no symptoms even when they may be infectious. We are notifying our community via email of these cases in various years levels to keep families informed. With what we are hearing in the media it is fast becoming a time to increase our vigilance and care so that we can minimise the chance of large spreading events.

Rapid Tests will continue to be distributed to our community and if you run out, please come to our office and we can provide more. If a child tests positive they need to isolate for 7 days as normal. Please notify our general office of when they got a positive test result so we can mark our attendance roll accurately. Any siblings who test negatively can still attend school providing they have no symptoms and have a negative rapid test each morning before coming to school. They must also wear a mask when they are indoors at school.

Whilst mask wearing mandates seem to be a thing of the past, the focus is now on taking personal responsibility. To that end I am strongly encouraging staff to wear masks when in class and I would also include students to do the same, especially if others are testing positive in the same class. We will support any student who wants to wear a mask. I believe this is in the spirit of taking personal responsibility and it could just save them from catching COVID and then spreading it to their family.

I think it would be fair to say we might be in for a challenging time over Term 3 as the current 3<sup>rd</sup> wave of COVID spreads. As always, we appreciate the care and support of our whole school community and will do everything possible to protect the wellbeing of our students.

#### What are we Building?

Returning from the school holidays our students noticed quickly that a large building site had been established on our basketball courts surrounded by temporary fencing. There were lots of questions with everyone

wondering what was happening. I am very pleased to report that the answer is very exciting and that after some years in the planning we are getting finally our outdoor covered basketball/netball court underway. Known as a COLA (Covered Outdoor Learning Area) this structure will provide a large, sheltered area in our school yard. This idea was first proposed about 3 years ago but of course with numerous delays it has taken some time to get it to this point. This new structure will take shape over the next couple of weeks and the whole project, with luck, should be completed by the end of term which includes new artificial basketball-netball courts. The picture to the right will give you an idea of how ours will look.



#### The school production

There is a lot to look forward to across Term 3 with our annual School Production high on our list of exciting learning opportunities. We are very much looking forward to having this event, which has not be held for the past couple of years. The production will be performed on Tuesday 30 and Wednesday 31 August at Salesian College, so please save those dates. Children will do two performances of the show.

All classes will once again participate in the production through a dancing/singing performance. Costumes,

lights and a vibrant soundtrack will also be part of the fun. We run a very tight production schedule so that this event does not interfere with other learning programs. Students start learning songs in Week 4 and progress from there. In due course we will be looking for volunteers to assist with the production, as it is a whole community event. We really appreciate all the help and support we can get especially with costumes and sets. One of the areas I manage is the parking and traffic management on the nights and I am looking for volunteers to assist with this. Please let me know if you can help.

For those families who have never had the experience of an Amsleigh Production, it is a fantastic event, and the performances are a very special moment for all. Each family can purchase up to 4 tickets in the first offering of ticket sales. More information will be distributed as we get closer to the date.

#### 200 Nights of Reading

At the start of this year we set a goal for all Amsleigh Park students to reach at least 200 Reading nights for 2022. The idea behind setting this annual goal is to really highlight the importance of completing reading practice at home. There is no doubt that children who read regularly improve their literacy skills, including reading, spelling, and writing. Reading regularly also builds up each student's vocabulary which is a vital component of Literacy. Children who do not read regularly miss this important learning and it should not be underestimated. Please see some further information about the benefits of reading later in this edition of the Buzz.

In the early years of schooling parents will normally have to support and assist their child with this reading practice, however as their fluency increases many children are able to read independently. As a rule a fluent reader (Grade 2-4) should be able to read for at least 15 to 20 minutes without losing concentration. Older students (Grade 5-6) should be able to build up their reading stamina around 25 to 30 minutes.

We have been very pleased to see how many of our students have taken up this challenge and it is our hope that the vast majority of children all read for a minimum of 200 nights this year. It's very pleasing to see that some of our students have already completed 150 reading nights. Anyone who completes 300 reading nights should come and see me for a special acknowledgement.

#### New Shade Sails Coming Soon

It's a busy time for facilities improvements and during the holidays the posts were installed for a new shade sail over the mandala in our inclusion garden. When the warmer weather comes later in the year we will have created new large areas of shade for children to use. We are also working on a covered walkway between our main building and the Thelma Bailey Centre which will be constructed during the January school holidays.

#### Staying in Touch

Each week we do yard duty before and/or after school and this is a time I really enjoy, as I get to touch base informally with parents and students. Often, we are approached for a quick question, and we welcome these moments, as it's great to stay in touch. If you see us around the school, please come and say hello. Until next time,

#### Children who read often and widely get better at it.

After all, practice makes perfect in almost everything humans do, and reading in no different.

## Reading helps children to develop empathy.

As children develop they begin to imagine how they would feel in that situation.

## Reading develops a child's imagination.

As we read our brains translate the descriptions we read of people, places and things into pictures. While we are engaged in a story we are also imagining how a character is feeling. Young children then bring this knowledge into their everyday play.

#### Reading improves vocabulary and language skills.

Children learn new words as they read. Subconsciously, they absorb information on how to structure sentences and how to use words and other language features effectively in their writing and speaking.

#### Reading improves concentration.

Children have to sit still and quietly so that they can focus on the story when they are reading. If the read often, they will develop the skill to do this for longer.

Reading helps develop the mind and imagination and the creative side. It helps to improve (vocabulary and spelling) communication both written and spoken. It also plays an important part in building a good self-image. It is a function that is necessary in every day life. This is why it is important that we ensure that our kids are reading everyday.

#### Reading teaches children about the world around them.

Through reading a variety of books children learn about people, places, and events outside of their own experience.

#### Reading exercises our brain.

Reading is a much more complex task for the human brain rather than watching TV, for example. Reading strengthens brains connections and builds NEW connections.

#### Reading is a fun.

A book or an e-reader doesn't take up much space and is light to carry, so you take it anywhere so you can never be bored if you have a book in your bag.

## Reading is a great way to spend time together.

Reading together on the couch, bedtimes stories and visiting the library are just some ways of spending time together.

#### Children who read achieve better in school.

Reading promotes achievement in all subjects, not just English. Children who are good readers tend to achieve better across the curriculum.

#### 2022 Parent Contributions - Family Account Information

#### **Student Medications**

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (eg. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office. We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. This does not include occasional antibiotics. Wherever possible, parents should request antibiotic prescriptions that can be taken at home, ie Antibiotics that are required 3 times per day can be taken at home in the morning, on return from school and again at bedtime. For students that do require antibiotics at school, a parent must complete a medication authority form when handing medication into the office. All medication must be stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

It is recommended that students with hayfever etc. take their medication at home before school.

#### Absences / Late Arrivals

A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno. This ensures that Admin staff, who process all attendance data, including late arrivals and early exits are receiving the information in the first instance. Teachers are notified of the absence/late arrival during this process. If you wish to pass on any further information to teachers, please send them an additional email. If unable to report via Xuno, absences can be advised by emailing the General Office or phoning the school and selecting "1" when prompted to leave an absence message. Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class. Parents should complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip" and hand this to their child who will proceed on their own to their classroom and give the late slip to the teacher.

#### Contacting The School – Check the email address you are replying to

When contacting classroom teachers, or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the '**To**' address. Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with many other daily external emails. Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner. When responding to a teacher's email, refer to their email address that appears within their message and copy & paste that address into the address field.

#### Xuno Information for families

Amsleigh Park PS uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders; and coming soon, permission forms and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management software that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Parents can also check and update their family details including emergency contacts. It is critical that we have up to date contact details for all students, so please check your details carefully and update if necessary.

Parents should use Xuno to notify the school of any absences, late arrivals etc. Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email, to create a Xuno account and password in your browser.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of our school information and events. Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent.




