Principal Team Report

The Child Safe Standards

On July 1, the new Child Safe Standards came into effect across Australia. In Victoria we move from 7 standards to 11 standards which are aligned with the National Standards. The Child Safe Standards aim to:

- promote the safety of children
- prevent child abuse
- ensure effective processes are in place to respond to and report all allegations of child abuse

Child safety includes matters related to protecting all children from child abuse, managing the risk of child abuse, providing support to a child at risk of child abuse, and responding to suspicions, incidents, disclosures or allegations of child abuse. Importantly, the new standards are focused on making sure that schools involve parents and carers more in efforts to reduce child abuse. Child abuse is:

- any act committed against a child involving: a sexual offence or grooming
- the infliction, on a child, of physical violence serious emotional or psychological harm
- the serious neglect of a child

Whilst we would all like to think that it does not occur in our community, we must not assume that it doesn't. We have a unified responsibility to both reject and address any form of child abuse in our school community. Every child has the right to be safe and protected from harm.

Our school council plays a key role in making sure that our school complies with the new standards.

- The Education and Training Reform Act 2006 and Ministerial Order 1280 outlines Government school councils powers, duties and functions
- When performing these powers, duties and functions, school councils must comply with the Child Safe Standards and Ministerial Order 1359

Over the coming months we will progressively update our school policies and procedures taking into account the changes to the Child Safe Standards and also making sure we address new focus areas such as safety in online environments. At our most recent school council meeting we ratified an updated 'Code of Conduct' for our school.

Divisional Football Finals

This week our football team participated in the Divisional football finals, and on behalf of the school I want to congratulate them on reaching this stage of the competition after winning the District Championship. Many thanks to Mr Embury, Tim Moreland (parent) and George Ruzbacky (past student) who

accompanied the team, it was a great help to have you along. Our team competed well and were convincing winners on the day, taking home the Monash-Waverly Divisional pennant. It is a great group of students, and they deserve their success. Their attitude, teamwork and effort all excellent. The team now moves onto the next stage, the regional finals. Well done Amsleigh Park!



100 Days of Prep

Our Preps are looking forward to celebrating their 100th day of prep on Thursday 4th August. This is a big milestone for our Preps, and a marvellous celebration of their first year at school. I visit our prep classes nearly every day and I am constantly amazed at their progress and learning development. Many of them have been able to learn their letters and the corresponding sounds (phonics) and are now moving on to using this understanding as they learn to read. It is a great credit to their teachers and parents to see our Preps progressing so well. We are all looking forward to the celebration night.

I would encourage families to read over this important communication so they keep up with what our students will be learning across the term. We provide this information with the aim of helping parents to support their child at school and enhancing the partnership each parent forms with their child's teacher. The class newsletters are now distributed digitally via XUNO, and you should receive it to your email inbox.

Respectful Communications

As a school we work hard to maintain effective forms of communication with our parents and carers. Often our teachers and support staff go to 'extra' effort to contact parents face to face or via XUNO or phone calls

to touch base on things that are important. From my experience I know that communication on this level is not the norm for all schools and I commend our staff for the genuine care and concern they have for our students. I also know that many parents and carers really appreciate the efforts of staff in staying in touch.

In all communications our staff are committed to following our school values of respect and integrity, making sure they are always positive and supportive towards students and their families. We greatly appreciate it when we are given the same level of respect in return, which I am pleased to say is usually the case. This mutual respect, care and concern is a genuine feature of our community culture, and it is worth the effort.





It's Library and Information Week



NAPLAN Preliminary Data

Schools received preliminary NAPLAN data this week. As we moved to an online test in 2022 the 'big picture' data can be made available a lot earlier to schools than previous years. Our results when compared to previous years are very pleasing and show that despite disruptions to learning our students are progressing well in their learning. One highlight was our reading results with students in Grade 3 (69%) and 5 (55%) achieving above the expected level. Individual data is not yet ready and will be distributed in early September.

Year 6-7 Transition 2022-2023 (Relevant for Year 6 families)



The state-wide Victorian Government School Year 6-7 Transition process is nearly complete, with all Grade 6 students wanting to attend State Secondary Schools receiving their letters of offer last week.

As well as enrolling in your Secondary School, the last step for Grade 6 families is to return their Year 7 Placement Acceptance Slip to Amsleigh Park by Wednesday 10th August. This will allow us to have a finalised list of which schools our Grade 6 students will attend next year, so we can begin our transfer of information to the correct schools.

Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (eg. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office. We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. This does not include occasional antibiotics. Wherever possible, parents should request antibiotic prescriptions that can be taken at home, ie Antibiotics that are required 3 times per day can be taken at home in the morning, on return from school and again at bedtime. For students that do require antibiotics at school, a parent must complete a medication authority form when handing medication into the office. All medication must be stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

It is recommended that students with hayfever etc. take their medication at home before school.

Absences / Late Arrivals

A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno. This ensures that Admin staff, who process all attendance data, including late arrivals and early exits are receiving the information in the first instance. Teachers are notified of the absence/late arrival during this process. If you wish to pass on any further information to teachers, please send them an additional email. If unable to report via Xuno, absences can be advised by emailing the General Office or phoning the school and selecting "1" when prompted to leave an absence message. Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class. Parents should complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip" and hand this to their child who will proceed on their own to their classroom and give the late slip to the teacher.

Contacting The School – Check the email address you are replying to

When contacting classroom teachers, or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the 'To' address.

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with a huge number of other daily external emails. Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner.

When responding to a teacher's email, refer to their email address that appears within their message and copy & paste that address into the address field.

Xuno Information for families

Amsleigh Park PS uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders; and coming soon, permission forms and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management software that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Parents can also check and update their family details including emergency contacts. It is critical that we have up to date contact details for all students, so please check your details carefully and update if necessary.

Parents should use Xuno to notify the school of any absences, late arrivals etc. Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email, to create a Xuno account and password in your browser.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of our school information and events. Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent.
