## Great Feedback for Amsleigh Park

Last Term our Grade 5/6s participated in a special incursion day focused on the creation of a business making Smoothies. For all reports it was a great day, which students enjoyed immensely. The organisation that ran this day, Mini Boss, also made a point of saying how fantastic our students and staff were to work with and how engaged they are in learning. Given they see thousands of students each year, this kind of feedback is most welcome. I'm pleased to say we often hear this kind of feedback and it's a source of great pride for our school.

Given we often hear this kind of feedback, why is it that our students consistently behave and engage so well? The answer takes in several factors starting with the great work done by our teaching and support staff. As a school we implement School Wide Positive Behaviour Support and through the teaching of expected behaviours and interpersonal skills our students develop appropriate behaviours. In addition, as a school we aim for consistency and fairness in our expectations so when students see this they respond accordingly. Students also feel secure when things are both predictable and fair. Of course, the behaviour of students is also influenced by their values and family life, so we know and appreciate that important and pivotal role parents play in reinforcing this too. Hence, both staff and parents work in this partnership to support students as they grow and mature with highly successful outcomes. It's a great credit to all involved and we look forward to more of this great feedback in future.

## School Enrolment census (Grade structures)

Last week we sent out the annual enrolment census to all families via XUNO email. The census involves the completion of a short survey asking if students will be returning to Amsleigh Park PS in 2023. This census is important in helping to plan for the correct number of classes with the right number of students in each class. Having up to date information is vitally important and we appreciate it greatly when families let us know of any changes. ## Class Placements 2023

Later this term we will start the complex process of placing students into classes for 2023. We spend many hours undertaking this important work, which considers many different variables such as:

- Academic ability and performance
- Work habits e.g. ability to work independently
- Classroom behaviour
- Social network /friendships
- Social maturity
- Special needs e.g. twins, siblings
- Special factors such as 'anxiety'

During this process, changes and adjustments to the proposed class groups are made over several weeks. Draft class lists are then submitted to the Leadership team for final ratification and then finally teachers are assigned to class groups. For the record teachers do not ever pick students to be in their class, all classes are assigned by the Principal Class team once the groups are decided.

## Requesting Special Consideration for Student Placement in 2023

If any families have any requests for placement of children on educational grounds, please send this to me no later than Friday 21<sup>st</sup> October. Please note that **requests for specific teachers are not accepted** in this process. It is our important goal that we place children in a happy and secure learning environment. Whilst we do keep all previous requests from past years, they do become dated in terms of relevance, so we will only consider information from the past two years. If a previous request on educational grounds still exists, please take the time to bring this to our attention once again so that we are aware of any long-term considerations that might still be relevant.

## New Shade Sails

Just prior to the school holidays we had some new shade sails installed in our school yard, adding further shaded areas for our students and staff. Including the Pavilion, we have added nearly 700m<sup>2</sup> of new shade in our school yard in 2022, so there are now many options for children to seek shade in hot weather. The new sails were installed over the mandala area. Over the past few years, we have been able to increase the amount of shade all around our school considerably, so we are now a school that offers great options for being sun-smart.

This Friday night, our Year 1 and 2 students embark on the first event of their Outdoor Education program, with the Grade 1 fun night (5.30-8.00pm) and the Grade 2 Sleepover (5.00pm until the next morning!). The students are very excited to be spending the night at school along with their friends and teachers, with many fun games and pizza dinner planned. Thanks to the Grade 1/2 teaching team for their work in preparing for this event. We hope our students enjoy these events and it helps prepare them for future camps in middle school and senior school.

## Sovereign Hill Excursion

Last Friday saw the Grade 5/6 students and teachers enjoy a fantastic day out at Sovereign Hill. Part of the cost was subsidised by the Positive Start program, a government initiative designed to reengage students in outings and adventures post remote learning. Thanks to Positive Start for making this day financially viable for us.

The students engaged in a range of experiences over the day including gold panning, an education session, an underground mine tour, watching the blacksmith smelt gold, exploring the 1850s shops, houses and gardens and more! Lots of learning about what life was like in 1850s Victoria and how the events of that time have impacted our current experience of life in Victoria and our model of democracy in Australia.

Thanks to our students for engaging so positively in all aspects of the day and for their exemplary behaviour. We were once again complimented by staff at Sovereign Hill on the way our students conducted themselves. Well done!



## Sunsmart- Reminder

I did mention this in our newsletter at the end of last term, but worth a reminder now that we're into term 4: As the UV levels increase at this time of year, we need to be sunsmart! The Cancer Council recommend a combination of sun protection measures:

1. Slip on some sun-protective clothing that covers as much skin as possible.
2. Slop on broad spectrum, water resistant SPF30+ (or higher) sunscreen. Put it on 20 minutes before you go outdoors and every two hours afterwards. Sunscreen should never be used to extend the time you spend in the sun.
3. Slap on a hat – broad brim or legionnaire style to protect your face, head, neck and ears.
4. Seek shade.
5. Slide on some sunglasses – make sure they meet Australian Standards.

Our Sun Smart Policy specifies that all students must wear a sun smart hat whenever they are outdoors at school. Please support our Sun Smart policy by providing a 'sun smart' hat for your child. Hats are available for purchase at the uniform shop.





## Department of Education Scholarships

Scholarships are available for eligible students in Grade 4 to Year 11, and for Year 12 students planning to undertake tertiary studies in 2023.

The Department of Education and Training administers a number of scholarships that are available to eligible students who are currently enrolled in Grade 4 to Year 12 in 2022.

Applicants for these scholarships will be evaluated on their:

- participation in school activities
- community involvement
- academic record for the current year.

Scholarships are either one-off payments or cover the duration of the student's course or annual study.

Many of these scholarships have specific eligibility criteria so please refer to individual applications for more information. Applications are open and close on Wednesday 1 February 2023.

## COVID-19

We have a timely reminder that COVID 19 is still around with seven students testing COVID positive this past week. These cases are both in senior and junior school classes. It's great that things seem to be quite stable now, but schools remain highly vulnerable and susceptible to 'super spreading' events.

The department of Education provided clear guidance for schools this week. The following settings, based on advice from the Department of Health, will apply from 11.59pm Wednesday 12 October 2022.

It is strongly recommended that **students:**

- who test positive to COVID-19 stay home and **isolate for 5 days**
- should **not** attend school after 5 days if still symptomatic
- who are symptomatic but have not tested positive should not attend school
- advise the school of the COVID-19 positive test result

Where **students** become symptomatic at school they should:

- be collected by their parents/carers
- undergo testing for COVID-19

It is strongly recommended that **staff:**

- who test positive to COVID-19 stay home and isolate for 5 days
- should not attend after 5 days if still symptomatic
- who are symptomatic but have not tested positive should not attend school

In addition a child who has had 'gastro' or a tummy illness should not return until 24 hours after the symptoms disappear. Your support with this is greatly appreciated.

## The Term Ahead

There is a lot to look forward to across Term 4. Our core learning programs in English and Mathematics continue to be a high priority, but in keeping with our focus on the 'whole child' we balance this out with other learning opportunities. In Term 4 we look forward to lots of extra-curricular activities including Divisional sports finals, Amsleigh Idol, Grade 2 sleepover, Grade 1 Late-stay, School Aerobics 'Spring Challenge,' Grade 6 Graduation, Whole School Transition for 2023, Prep 2023 Orientation and Carols Night to round out an exciting term. ## FROM THE SCHOOL OFFICE ADMIN TEAM.....

### 2022 Parent Contributions - Family Account Information

Thank you to the families that have paid 2022 Parent Contributions. We greatly appreciate your financial support of our school. Please ensure **a completed Payment Advice Form is sent to the office** so invoices can be processed, and payments allocated correctly.

### Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (eg. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office. We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. Parents are required to provide up to date Action Plans and inform the school office of any changes to a student's medical condition / action plan.

This does not however, include occasional antibiotics. Wherever possible, parents should request antibiotic prescriptions that can be taken at home, ie Antibiotics that are required 3 times per day can be taken at home in the morning, on return from school and again at bedtime. For students that do require antibiotics at school, a parent must complete a medication authority form when handing medication into the office. All medication must be stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

It is recommended that students with hayfever etc. take their medication at home before school.

### Absences / Late Arrivals

**A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno.** This ensures that Admin staff, who process all attendance data, including late arrivals and early exits are receiving the information in the first instance. Teachers are notified of the absence/late arrival during this process. If you wish to pass on any further information to teachers, please send them an additional email. If unable to report via Xuno, absences can be advised by emailing the General Office or phoning the school and selecting "1" when prompted to leave an absence message. **Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.** Parents should complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip" and hand this to their child who will proceed on their own to their classroom and give the late slip to the teacher.

### School Emails – Check the email address you are sending / replying to

When contacting classroom teachers, or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the **'To'** address.

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with a huge number of other daily external emails. Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner and creates extra work for Admin staff.

When responding to a teacher's email, please refer to their email address that appears within their message and copy & paste that address into the address field.

## **Xuno Information for families**

Amsleigh Park PS uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders; and coming soon, permission forms and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management software that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family' for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

**Parents should use Xuno to notify the school of any absences, late arrivals etc.** Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

**Parents can also check and update their family contact details, student medical conditions and emergency contacts. It is critical that we have up to date medical & contact details for all students, so please check your details carefully and update if necessary.**

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email to create a Xuno account and password in your browser.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of our school information and events. Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent.
