#### From the Principal Team Welcome Back for Term 2

A warm welcome back to all for Term 2, I hope that you enjoyed a great school holiday, and some of the glorious weather in the second week I feel most fortunate that I was able to spend extended time with my family and we enjoyed some time away riding the Great Victorian Rail Trail. Getting outdoors is a great way to recharge the batteries and we hope that our students enjoyed getting out in the fresh air too!



In Term 2 we can look forward to many great school events such as: Education Week, Grade 3-

4 Camp, Grade 5-6 Camp, Cross Country, the Mother's Day Stall, Winter Sport and School Aerobics competitions. Most of our classes will also be attending and participating in some great incursions and excursions. I am looking forward to a busy and productive term of learning!

#### **Triennial School Review**

We will be participating in our school review in Term 2 undertaking an in-depth evaluation of our school Strategic Plan and the many other areas that go into operating as a government primary school. We participate in this major review every four years so it's a great opportunity to both celebrate the good work we have done and then plan for the next 4 years. During this review we will be seeking feedback from parents and carers in a range of areas with more information to follow.

The review panel is made up of an independent reviewer appointed by the Department of Education, our Senior adviser from the region (SEIL), two challenge partners from outside our school (Principals from other schools), School Council President, Principal class team and nominated staff. Students also have an opportunity to give feedback about their learning and school life and there will be focus groups for parents.

Following the review we will receive an in-depth report about our school and then use this to write a new Strategic Plan 2023-2026. Look out for more information about this review and opportunities to get involved.

A very sincere thank-you to the whole Amsleigh Park PS school community for your support of our Easter Raffle in Term 1. We had 35 prizes on offer, and this generated lots of excitement for our students.

### **Open Morning 2023**

In 2023 we are holding an Open Morning on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> May from 9.30am to 11.30am to promote the school to prospective parents. The target group are families for children in 3 or 4 year old kindergarten in 2023. On the day we will have student leaders doing some tours of our school. It's important that we continue to promote our school effectively, and make sure that everyone in our local community knows where we are located.

If you have friends or neighbours who might be interested, please encourage them to come along. <u>Existing</u> <u>families with children in pre-school</u> are also welcome to come along too. As I have said before our best promotion is 'word of mouth' between parents, so we are ever reliant on our community to help out. We are also happy to run tours at other times for anyone who cannot make it on this day.

#### **School Maintenance**

Amsleigh Park PS has a great campus for our students and the whole community to enjoy. One of the challenges of having such a big campus is the ongoing maintenance required to keep it in good shape. Rarely a week goes by where we are not engaging a contractor in maintenance work around the campus. During the school holidays we had important 'tree work' around the school completed, removing trees or undertaking significant pruning. Our trees are audited annually, and we continue to monitor them regularly. Connecting our new covered walkway to the storm water system was also undertaken during this time. It makes quite a bit of difference being able to get across our yard during wet weather.

#### **School Uniform Reminders**

Sun Smart ends at the start of May, but please be aware of the weather, which can be variable at this time of year. Hopefully we will still get some sunny days, and if so then a sun smart hat is a wise choice. The UV rays can still be just as strong as in summer.

As we head into the colder months lost property becomes a big challenge, with students often misplacing their jackets or windcheaters. Having these items of clothing clearly labelled is vital, as they can quickly be returned to their owner. We are sometimes surprised to see near new jackets in the lost property box without being labelled.

For girls who prefer to wear a school dress they must wear navy leggings rather than track pants under the dress. Wet weather jackets are OK, but they are not a replacement for a bomber jacket or windcheater.

Thanks in advance for assisting us to meet our uniform policy. We believe it's a fair and practical policy that offer lots of choices, without having unrealistic expectations. This policy is well supported by our non-profit uniform shop that is run for the benefit of everyone in our school community. Many schools no longer offer a uniform shop on-site and we are grateful to Libby Jumas who generously gives her time to provide this community service. It also means that our uniforms are a good deal cheaper, as we sell them at the wholesale price we pay for them.

#### School Camps 2023

During Term 2 our 5-6s and 3-4s will have the opportunity to attend their annual school camp for 2023. Our Camping program is a fantastic opportunity to build independence and confidence in a supported environment away from home. Our students develop many fond memories of these kind of events which are a real highlight of school life.

#### Winter is Coming and So is the Flu Season

As we enter the colder months of the year, it is important to remind families that whilst the restrictive days of COVID are over, there are many things we can still do to prevent the transmission of illness such as COVID/Flu/Coughs/Colds.

- 1) Stay home if unwell.
- 2) Ventilation (Air purifiers on in school)
- 3) Vaccinate
- 4) Wash hands thoroughly after going to the toilet.
- 5) Sneeze into elbow
- 6) Sanitize hands on entry to buildings.
- 7) Mask wearing

Our combined efforts to implement these above-mentioned strategies will go a long way to ensuring the overall health of all students, staff, and parents.

### Year 6-7 Transition 2023-2024

The state wide Victorian Government School Year 6-7 Transition process has commenced, with all year 6 students receiving their Transition Information Packs this week. This pack included the 'Application for Year 7 Placement 2024' form, which all students, including those attending an independent school in 2024, must **return by Friday 12<sup>th</sup> May**. Please ensure you have returned this form by the due date so your child's form may be sent off to the relevant secondary school in a timely manner.

If you would like your child to attend an Independent Secondary School, please contact them directly about the application and enrolment process, as they work with a different process than Government Secondary Schools.

If you are yet to decide on the secondary school you wish your child to attend, we encourage families to attend the Open Days and/or Nights of many secondary schools in the area to see the broad array of educational opportunities they may offer your child. Some of our local Secondary Schools have already had their open night for this year and some are scheduled for the upcoming weeks, however we encourage you to contact any schools you are interest in for a tour.

Please remind your child to have their hat at school every day, to ensure they are able to be out in the sun playing at break times.

### FROM THE SCHOOL OFFICE ADMIN TEAM.....

#### Family Account Information

Thanks to the families that have paid 2023 Parent Contributions. Please ensure that a <u>completed Payment Advice Form is sent to the office</u> so invoices can be processed, and payments allocated correctly.

Copies of the 2023 Parent Contributions letter and Payment Advice forms were sent out by email and are also available from the school office or on our website. <u>www.amsleigh.vic.edu.au</u>

#### **Student Medications**

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (eg. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office. **We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor**. Parents are required to provide up to date Action Plans and inform the school office of any changes to a student's medical condition / action plan.

This does not however, include occasional antibiotics. Wherever possible, parents should request antibiotic prescriptions that can be taken at home, ie Antibiotics that are required 3 times per day can be taken at home in the morning, on return from school and again at bedtime. For students that do require antibiotics at school, a parent must complete a medication authority form when handing medication into the office. All medication must be stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

It is recommended that students with hayfever etc. take their medication at home before school.

### Absences / Late Arrivals

<u>A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno</u>. This ensures that Admin staff, who process all attendance data, including late arrivals and early exits are receiving the information in the first instance. Teachers are notified of the absence/late arrival during this process. If you wish to pass on any further information to teachers, please send them an additional email. If unable to report via Xuno, absences can be advised by emailing the General Office or phoning the school and selecting "1" when prompted to leave an absence message. Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class. Parents should complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip" and hand this to their child who will proceed on their own to their classroom and give the late slip to the teacher.

### <u>School Emails – Check the email address you are sending / replying to</u>

When contacting classroom teachers, or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the 'To' address.

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with a huge number of other daily external emails. Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner and creates extra work for Admin staff.

When responding to a teacher's email, please refer to their email address that appears within their message and copy & paste that address into the address field.

### Information for families

Since the beginning of 2021, Amsleigh Park commenced using Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, permission forms and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno. Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email, to create a Xuno account and password in your browser.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events.

Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent.




