#### Safety Week

As we roll through Week 5, we have our normal safety week activities in focus. During this week we make sure that we are prepared in case of an emergency at school. One of the activities during safety week is to practice one of the emergency drills such as an evacuation.

Safety week is also a time to think about how we are implementing the Child Safety Standards, which are mandated across Australia. Whilst it's an uncomfortable topic to think about, we know that child abuse is still occurring for Australian children. You might have recently noticed a TV commercial encouraging parents to talk to their children about this in an age-appropriate way. The basic message is to talk to a trusted adult if you are feeling uncomfortable about a situation or the way someone is treating you, and that's it's not OK for someone to do this.

#### **Changes to Parking on Gamble Street**

The City of Monash have been in touch to advise us of changes to parking on Gamble Street. The school was <u>not</u> consulted on these changes and had no say in the decision. All families parking in this area should now take note of the permit parking along the northern side of Gamble Street. It also resulted in a small change to parking on Dublin Street with removal of one carpark space opposite the T-intersection. We are anticipating that parking inspectors will be around to enforce these new restrictions. For the record I don't support putting too many parking restrictions in around schools as it just makes life difficult. Families dropping off might consider using the **kiss and go** parking on State Street if parking is more difficult on Dublin Street or Gamble Street. Children can enter the school grounds straight away so it is a good option. Please remember to remain in your car when dropping off at kiss and go parking as you will be booked if the car is left unattended.

### **Thunderstorm Asthma**

Grass pollen season, which typically runs from October to December each year in Victoria, brings an increase in asthma and hay fever symptoms. It also increases the risk of thunderstorm asthma. For people with asthma or hay fever, especially those who experience wheezing or coughing with their hay fever, thunderstorm asthma can be sudden, serious and even life threatening.

Amsleigh Park Primary School will implement a range of measures to keep our school community safe as the risk of thunderstorm asthma increases.

Many of our staff are trained in asthma first aid, and we will monitor the Vic Emergency app to receive thunderstorm warnings, and, where appropriate, keep students indoors when weather forecasts identify greater risk.

During the season, there are some things you can do to prepare and protect yourself and your family:

- If your child has ever had asthma, talk to your doctor about what you can do to help protect them from the risk of thunderstorm asthma this pollen season, including updating your asthma action plan. Taking an asthma preventer properly and regularly is key to preventing asthma, including thunderstorm asthma.
- If your child has hay fever, see your pharmacist or doctor for a hay fever treatment plan and check if you should have an asthma reliever puffer. These are available from a pharmacy without a prescription.
- If your child has hay fever and experiences wheezing and coughing, it is important to make sure they don't also have asthma. Speak to your doctor about an asthma action plan.
- Where possible, avoid being outside during thunderstorms from October to December, especially during the wind gusts that come before the storm. Go inside and close your doors and windows. If you have your air conditioning on, turn it to 'recirculate'.

Protect yourself this pollen season – managing asthma and allergies matters.

A reminder that parent vehicles should not enter the school grounds at any time (with the exception of families using the accessible car park, with a valid disability parking

permit). We thank you for your support in keeping our community safe.

## Information for families

Since the beginning of 2021, Amsleigh Park commenced using Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno. Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email, to create a Xuno account and password in your browser.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events.

Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent.
