Principal Team Report

Foundation Transition 2024

It was a great pleasure to welcome our new Foundation students and their families to Amsleigh Park PS on Wednesday 15th November. It's always lovely to see the excited faces of our pre-schoolers as they arrive with great anticipation of going to 'big school.' As you will have noticed Prep has been renamed as Foundation which brings us into line with the Department of Education. It does not roll off the tongue as easy so our Foundation students will be known by their short form 'Foundies.'

This is the first of five transition sessions for our new Foundies starting in 2024. The first week includes activities in the classroom and a specialist session all designed to familiarise children with our school environment. During this week's transition session, parents and carers attended an information session about our school. We were pleased to outline lots of information about Amsleigh Park PS as the journey starts for each family. We have another four sessions to come so there is a lot more for our Foundies to experience in preparation for their school life.

Performance Assembly

We had a huge performance assembly on Thursday this week with many classes involved in showcasing their musical, singing, dancing and Aerobics Skills. The performances included some fun traditional dances, the Hokey Pokey & Chicken Dance by our Preps, recorder and instrumental ensembles from Grade 4-6, a special Tongan work song by Grade 2s, all capped off nicely with the Leigh Club singing Levitating by Dua Lipa.

Our aerobics teams also showcased their routines from 2023 with one team winning the State Championship in their division and the other winning the Spring Challenge.

It was a great morning of entertainment all performed in front of a full house of parents and carers. Congratulations to our students for their fantastic performances and many, many thanks to the wonderful Mrs Kennedy for organising the assembly. We look forward to having more regular performance assemblies in 2024 and they will be more spread out.



Class Structure 2024

Planning a fair and equitable class structure for 2024 is underway. Through this process we must decide on the number of classes required at each level, so we can provide an optimal learning environment for all. There are several considerations we must make when planning our class structure which include:

- Government funding All schools are funded for the number of students enrolled and we need to have staff for classroom, specialist and support programs
- The number of students in each year level
- Class size and equity for all
- Organisation of the Curriculum

Of course, the key factor in all schools will always be quality teaching, so whilst the grade structure is important, we know that it is not as important as the work our teachers do every day.

Whole School Transition

As our students progress from one Year level to the next, it is important that they feel prepared for what lays ahead. Our Whole School Transition Program supports our students with their level-to-level transition, through multiple sessions, over late November and through December. During these visits, students go as a cohort to spend time in the next year level's learning spaces, with



the current teachers of those levels. Here the students get to know other teachers and the key differences between their current year level and the one ahead. Students have a chance to ask questions and get to know students they may not have been in a class with before. The program culminates with our Smart Start session on Tuesday 12th December, where students will meet with their 2024 grades and teachers where possible. The program begins with our first session on Thursday 30th November.

Student Late arrivals / early exits



A reminder to families that when a student arrives late to school, they must come via the office and be signed in by a parent. It is important we have an accurate record of who is on site at school at all times, to ensure we can keep all of our students safe. Similarly, if a student needs to leave early as happens from time to time, parents must sign their children out at the office and Admin staff will call for the student to come to the office. Thanks for your help

with this procedure.

No 'nuts' at Amsleigh park PS

Amsleigh Park PS has several students who have serious nut allergies requiring the use of an epi-pen if experiencing a reaction. As a result, all students will now participate in a full year of STEM rather than one semester as it has been for the past few years.

Our specialist programs are also complemented by lots of extra-curricular programs such as; Inter-school Sport, Camps, Aerobics, Bike Education, Mathematics Extension, School Production, Leigh Club, State Schools Spectacular and so on.

I also want to acknowledge our dedicated specialist teachers who make it all possible, we are most fortunate to have your expertise and skills in our school community.

Information for families

Since the beginning of 2021, Amsleigh Park commenced using Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno. Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email, to create a Xuno account and password in your browser.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events.

Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent.
