Principal Team Report


Congratulations Mrs Kwong!

Parent Voluntary Contributions

When the information went out regarding parent voluntary contributions for 2024 there was a letter attached with information about why we ask for these payments. I have received some feedback that the link is down the bottom of the XUNO email, and it might not be obvious, so we have included the letter in this edition of the Buzz.

It would be fair to say that in recent years parent voluntary contributions have not been as strong as they were previously. Previously, more than 90% of families contributed so that we can provide our students with a <u>higher standard</u> of education. This has now fallen to about 55-60% and as a result we are not able to provide what we could previously. Parental contributions are a direct investment in your child's education and the amount requested is modest. Please take the time to read and consider the attached letter to get an idea of why we request this contribution and how we can use the funds. We need your ongoing help and support including a financial contribution to maintain the standards we all aspire to.

In saying this there is support for families who might be in a difficult financial position and if this is the case please contact our Business Manager, Karen Hogan.

We will be placing students in classes over the next couple of weeks in preparation for our Class Orientation on Tuesday 12th December. Our classes are finely tuned to balance out many factors including size, gender, academic ability, behaviour, participation, friendship and needs. We look for effective working relationships above friendship to ensure that learning is not hampered by distractions, but all students are guaranteed to have a person from their preference list.

Specialist Programs for 2024

We are pleased to say that our fantastic specialist program will be increased in 2024 and we will have 5 programs for the whole school year. This is due to the government providing further time for teachers to undertake planning so it's a win-win for everyone as we can now broaden out the scope of our STEM program to incorporate more Information and Communications Technology. Our specialist programs in 2024 are: Visual Art, Physical Education, Performing Arts, German Language and Science-Technology-Engineering and Maths (STEM). All students from Foundation to Grade 6 do a session in each specialist each week.

The Tutor Learning Initiative



The State Government has once again funded the Tutor Learning Initiative for 2024. This great program has been going since 2021 and has enabled schools across Victoria to provide targeted learning support for children who are not progressing as expected in a learning area. At Amsleigh Park, we have had more than 50 students receive support through this program in 2023, and it makes a great difference in their learning. Students who participate in the TLI are generally about 6-12 months behind in a certain area of learning. For example, it might be

that they are progressing well in English but need extra support in Mathematics. In this instance they would receive 2-3 sessions of small group-targeted learning support with one of our tutors for about 1-2 terms depending on how students' progress.

Parental Curriculum Contributions in 2024

November 14, 2023

Dear Parents and Carers,

It is our ongoing aim to provide the highest standards of education to all Amsleigh Park PS students. An important component of a quality education is making sure that we provide a high standard of resources and learning materials. We believe that our students deserve this, and we know that it makes a difference in the outcomes that they achieve.

To achieve the highest standards of teaching and learning our teachers and support staff need quality resources and materials, and we need the support of our school community to achieve this. Whilst we do get some funding from the Department of Education most of it is used to pay for our utilities – electricity/gas/water, relief teaching, plumbing, electrical work, photocopying, furniture, first aid equipment, cleaning consumables, rubbish removal and professional development. This leaves only a small amount to support learning in the standard curriculum.

To provide the high standard we believe our students deserve we ask our parents for a moderate parental contribution (previously known as school fees). Let me reassure you that parental contributions are spent on student learning and curriculum resources & materials. The Department of Education has a strict rule that we must call them voluntary financial contributions, but we simply cannot fund the items we want for our students without your help.

In 2023 the number of contributions did improve but we are still not back at the previous years when over 90% of families contributed. We have maintained the requested contribution for 2024. This modest amount is less than \$2.00 per week so we believe it's a fair and reasonable contribution. In comparison to many other programs for children it represents good value. E.g., One day of childcare can cost the equivalent to a year's contribution at school. Anyone who is experiencing financial hardship should contact us so we can provide support and assistance.

Here are some of the enhancements made possible through the generous support of families in 2023. Just think what would be possible if we had more resources to use.

In 2023 we

- ✓ once again purchased new literacy and numeracy resources for student use. This includes more decodable reading materials, hands-on mathematics kits for classrooms and lots of new Library books. This year we spent \$30,000+ on these resources
- √ maintained sets of the Apple iPads to further enhance our performing Arts and STEM programs
- √ provided class sets of Apple I-pads, Netbooks and Chromebooks for our students to use in their learning. In 2023 we procured a set of new laptop computers for use in Grade 2
- ✓ enriched the standard curriculum with a comprehensive specialist program. (Physical Education, Visual Arts, Performing Arts, German and STEM classes). Each specialist area received their budgeted requests for 2023 so they could continue to provide high standards of materials and equipment
- √ purchased additional curriculum materials and consumables for Inquiry learning and Social-emotional learning. For example, every child received a Resilience Project booklet to a total cost of \$6500 for the whole school
- √ acquired and/or replaced sports equipment to improve the Health & P.E. program
- √ purchased new 'Squircle' chairs and other furniture for classrooms
- √ contributed towards the cost of a new covered walkway connecting our buildings
- √ replaced shade sails over the 3-6 playground

In 2024 we would be hoping once again to continue to provide high standards of learning resources and materials, but this will only be possible with your support. We ask that you please consider making this contribution in 2024.

Information for families

Amsleigh Park uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email, to create a Xuno account and password in your browser.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events and can easily inform the school of their child's absences and contact detail changes.

Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent.
