### **Principal Team Report**

#### Grade 6 Graduation 2023

We enjoyed a wonderful Graduation ceremony in 2023. Well organised by our Grade 6 teachers, Mrs Arvanitis and Mr Embury, with great support from the Grade 5 teachers, Mrs Jonga and Miss Kirton, this event was an enjoyable night of celebration and reflection. The formal ceremony was beautifully presented by our Grade 6s who shared their memorable moments and sang with plenty of emotion. We were all super impressed to see our graduates work without notes during the event. Our Grade 6s acknowledged everyone involved in their school life that began in 2017. How quickly time goes, and with the passing of this time, it is wonderful to see how these students have matured into warm and caring young people. The end of the year for Grade 6s always comes with the mixed emotions of excitement but also some sadness as they realise their time at Amsleigh Park is nearly done. Looking at this group I can see they are ready for their next challenge, and we wish them every happiness and success as they commence their secondary years. We will certainly miss them all.

On behalf of our students, I want to thank Mrs Arvo and Mr Embury, with support from many parents and staff, for organising such a great event. It was truly a special occasion and will be a memorable one for all. Special thanks to our Grade 5 parents who helped to set up and serve the graduation dinner. #### Our Priorities in 2024

After a successful school review in 2023 we now have a new strategic plan to implement from 2024-2027. Our plan includes two goals, one to continuously improve our teaching in English and Mathematics and the other to strengthen and enhance wellbeing and student engagement. This is consistent with the priorities of the government school system which places equal emphasis on learning and well-being as central to success in schools.

In 2024 we have an exciting plan to strengthen and enhance the way we teach Mathematics. We have formed a strategic partnership with Mathematics consultant and expert, Dr Angela Rogers, who will work with us across the whole year, providing important professional learning for our teaching staff. This professional learning will focus on building teacher knowledge and skills in implementing evidenced based strategies that supports the teaching of important foundational knowledge of Mathematics. This foundational knowledge is essential in the early years of primary school and includes counting and place value skills. Both might seem fairly simplistic, but research shows that many children have learning gaps in these areas which lead to difficulties in learning more complex concepts.

#### **Grade 6 Final Farewell**

We will undertake a final farewell for our Grade 6 students on **Wednesday at 1.00pm.** Please add it to your diaries. Our Grade 6s will walk down our traditional isle of honour to symbolize the completion of their primary school years. As they move down the aisle all our students clap and cheer for them. ### Information for families

Amsleigh Park uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email, to create a Xuno account and password in your browser.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events and can easily inform the school of their child's absences and contact detail changes.

Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent.




