### **Principal Team Report**

I would like to extend a warm welcome to everyone in our school community for 2024. Special welcome to all new families joining us for the first time, we hope you are enjoying being in our wonderful school community so far. A big welcome to our new teachers, Miss Fiona MacNally (5A), Mr Jacob Darlow (3A) and Mrs Nuala Martin (Tutor) and education support, Mrs Melissa Winters. We are thrilled to have you all join our staff.

Our students have made a terrific start to this school year, and as I walked around the school this week, I was pleased to see how settled our classrooms are. There is a sense of calm all across the school and that's a great start to the year. Amsleigh Park is a wonderful school with a great staff, great students and a terrific and supportive school community, so we have all we need to flourish in 2024.

### Learning to Learn

For the first two weeks of the school year all our classes are participating in our 'Learning to Learn' program. This program helps our students to settle into their new classes, get to know their classmates and new teacher, establish

clear expectations and build a productive classroom tone for the year. It's a very important time, and it's vital that everyone develops a positive mindset towards school. This year we have a special focus on building a 'growth mindset' for all students, and this is one of the concepts our classes will learn about during learning to learn sessions.



At our student's welcome assembly on Tuesday I reminded students of our school values, Respect, Integrity, Inclusion, Motivation and Resilience. We expect that all students, staff and parents will uphold to our community values. Additionally, I made it very clear that students should also play in a friendly and inclusive manner, and any rough play was not welcome.

For the record our students are overwhelmingly fantastic, which is well supported by having a consistent expectation for all. However, kids will have their moments, and that is to be expected, as its part of learning for life. Our aim is to be fair and consistent, following the principles of School Wide Positive Behaviour Support, and teaching children the skills they need to be happy and successful at school.

### Parent Voluntary Contributions 2024

We are now accepting parental voluntary contributions for 2024 (previously known as school fees) with the hope that our community will see the benefit

of investing a modest amount to support their child's education. Comparatively, our requested contribution is very reasonable and I know for a fact that many schools are asking for much more. This money is used to fund our curriculum programs so they are a much better standard than we could achieve otherwise. Payments can be made via XUNO so it's quick and easy. Many thanks to those families who have already made their contribution/s, it's greatly appreciated.



## Thanks to our School Administration Team

Our fantastic office team, Karen, Ali and Jade, have been very busy at school since 22<sup>nd</sup> January getting things organised so we have a smooth start to the year. Many thanks to them for their dedication to our school. Office hours are 8.30am – 4.15pm, and you can make contact with us during this time. A voice mail option is provided out of those times to leave messages for us. Please join with us in appreciating their great work.

## No Nuts at Amsleigh Park

At Amsleigh Park PS we have a number of students who are allergic to nuts, and will experience a serious anaphylactic reaction if exposed. We ask that parents do not send nuts or nut based products to school, including peanut butter or Nutella. We appreciate your support as this can be a life threatening condition. Children can enjoy these items at home and on weekends.

## Developing a Partnership with Amsleigh Park Families in 2024

Our teaching and support staff are looking forward to a productive partnership with you to ensure all students can achieve their best. We recognise that to be successful in school, our children need support from both home and school. We know a strong partnership with you will make a great difference in your child's education. As partners, we share the responsibility for our students' success and want you to know that we will do our very best to carry out our responsibilities. We ask that you guide and support your child's learning by ensuring that he/she:

- 1) Attends school daily and arrives on time ready for the day's learning program
- 2) Completes all homework given by teachers
- 3) Reads daily to develop a love for reading and to improve literacy skills

4) Shares school experiences with you so that you are aware of his/her school life.

This partnership is one of the very important components to a successful and happy school life.

## Get to Know You Interviews

We have set aside very important time for 'Get to Know You Interviews' on <u>Wednesday 7th February</u>. These meetings provide a timely opportunity for our teaching staff to form an effective partnership

with each child's family. Working in partnership and having consistent expectations between home and school leads to better outcomes for our students. The Interviews are strictly 10 minutes. If families need a longer time, then a follow up time should be organised. The bookings for interviews are all done using XUNO and an email was distributed on Tuesday this week with details. Bookings are open until next Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> Feb.

## Foundation 2024

Special welcome to our 55 new foundation students (Foundies) who commenced school on Tuesday. We have 3 Foundation classes this year and we are all looking forward to getting to know our new students and their families. Welcome also to the students who have joined us at other year levels, we hope you are all settling in well and enjoying making new friends. Our enrolment is very stable, and we actually started the school year on the same number as 2023, 341 students.

## **Recent Improvements**

During January we had some work done around the school. Our gym floor has been resurfaced and is looking shiny and new. Having a new surface means that it's safer for sports, offering better grip, whilst also looking great. In addition, we have reorganised some of our resource storage consolidating some of the space on offer. This has freed up a new space for our intervention centre in the main building where students will participate in tutoring and other learning supports. The latter is not quite finished and we have new pinboards and whiteboards as well as a new door and window. Finally, we had some tree maintenance completed to follow up from our recent tree audit. These works are a high priority and any trees with identified problems are either removed or pruned.

# Student Insurance – Reminder from DET

Parents are reminded that the Department of Education (DE) does not offer any form of 'student accident insurance'. If families are concerned about this they are advised to make their own arrangements. Ambulance cover could be one consideration as the school will not hesitate to call an ambulance if we are concerned for a child's wellbeing.

# Personal Goods brought to school at the 'Owners' risk

The Department of Education (DE) does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools. All schools are requested to remind students and parents/guardians of this at the beginning of each academic year and to discourage parents/students from bringing any unnecessary or particularly valuable items to school. Please avoid bringing these items as it can be most upsetting for all concerned if items go missing or are damaged.







## Annual Swimming Program 2024

We will be running our annual swimming program in the last two weeks of Term 1 at the Doug Ellis Pool at Monash University. The program for P-4 will be 9 days, whilst the Grade 5-6s will do 5 days before heading off to their annual school camp in the final week of term. More details soon on costs etc.

## **Reading Nights**

Nightly reading not only develops a child's reading skills, but also their writing and spelling skills; as well as growing a love of reading over time. I explained that all children should aim to reach 300 nights of reading this year as part of their homework and to ensure their reading skills continue to develop. I look forward to celebrating the first '50 reading nights' certificates being awarded at assembly toward the end of February. It was excellent to hear about all the reading that has already happened this year!

## **Traffic Safety**

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It is extremely important for student and community safety, that drivers observe all traffic rules and signage around schools to ensure our families stay safe. We thank you for your support with this, as we're sure all families would agree, the safety of our children is of upmost importance. In particular, adhering to the one way street rules in part of State Street, as well as the permanent 40km speed zone around the school. Additionally, Monash council often patrol the 2 minute drop off zones, as well as the other parking restrictions in State Street, so we urge all families to adhere to these regulations. ## Student wellbeing Resources

At Amsleigh Park, the wellbeing of our students is a top priority. We focus on wellbeing at school through different programs including School Wide Positive Behaviour Support and can also access wellbeing supports from the Department of Education. In addition to this, we wanted to share with you a range of wellbeing resources that you and/or your child can access to support their wellbeing outside of school, should you be interested. These resources are designed to support students in maintaining their mental, emotional, and physical health and wellbeing, as well as addressing developmental and educational concerns.







Some resources families may be interested in accessing are:

- Parent-line Victoria 13 22 89: Telephone support for parents and carers, available 8am to midnight, 7 days a week including public holidays.
- ELMHS <u>https://monashchildrenshospital.org/mental-health/</u>: Early in Life Mental Health Service (ELMHS) is a place where young people who are experiencing emotional, behavioural or mental health problems can get help. Parents can refer their child to ELMHS without a GP referral. Parents and carers can call the triage line on 1300 369 012 to refer their child.
- Kids Help Line: <u>https://kidshelpline.com.au/</u> or 1800 55 1800. Kids Help line is available to all young people 24hrs a day. They also have a fantastic website with child friendly information on wellbeing concerns such a bullying, friendships, school concerns, family conflict.
- Link Health and Community Services: <u>https://www.linkhc.org.au/services/children-youth-and-family-services/</u>. Link Children and Youth Services provide information on how to access services such as Occupational Therapy and Speech Therapy in the Oakleigh area.
- A visit to the GP is also a good starting place to discuss concerns for your child's health, wellbeing or development. GPs can refer to other practitioners as appropriate.

We encourage all our students and families to take advantage of these resources and to reach out to their teachers or the principal team if they have any concerns or questions, as we are always here to support wellbeing.

## **School Birthdays**

Celebrating a birthday on a school day is a lot of fun, and we know that students often like to share a little treat with their class. All treats need to be individually wrapped, so they can be shared safely with the class. A Freddo Frog is a great example of a quick and easy treat to share. Please note we are unable to share large birthday cakes, as this is no longer considered hygienic for school. The Birthday Buckets have been a huge

hit and they will continue to run with the generous support of our PFA and especially the Shaw family who keep it all ticking along. A very happy belated Birthday to everyone who celebrated in January.

### **Camps Sports and Excursions Fund**

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$150 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 9544 1553 and ask for an application form. You can find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page. Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

### **Being COVID Safe**

I know that people don't like to talk about this anymore, but it is an important part of our roles to maintain a safe community for all. Now that COVID is endemic we are just living with it and carrying on with life. However, this does not change the need for isolation when a student, their family members or our staff become infected. The expectation is that students will isolate at home until their symptoms are cleared and they are not testing positive anymore. At an absolute minimum this would be for at least 3 days and preferably 5 days to ensure it will not be passed on to classmates and their families.



We do understand that parents and carers need to work, but having a serious outbreak of

COVID can impact our school severely with a potential to have staff on sick leave for extended time and children missing important learning opportunities.



There are also increasing cases of long COVID which is a life changing long term illness. I personally know of one young, otherwise healthy person in their early 30s who has been severely impacted. We would greatly appreciate your support and understanding in this regard.

### **Excursion Costs**

As a school we aim to keep our costs as reasonable as possible but one thing we have no control over is inflation. When it comes to excursions, we are starting to see that the cost of buses is increasing. As a result, the cost of excursions is increasing, and we don't want that to come as a shock to families. For example, a typical whole day excursion will involve a bus fare around \$25.00 per student, plus the cost of the place being visited and any programs students are participating, about \$15.00. Adding that up you can see that the cost we will need to charge is \$40.00+ per student. Excursions are a great way to broaden student's understanding and the experiences a very valuable part of learning, so it would be a shame not to offer them. Hopefully this helps to keep all our parents and carers fully informed, and if you have any questions or comments please let us know.

### Arriving at School on-time

Thank-you to the many families who ensure their child arrives on time to school every day. Punctuality is an important life skill and a great habit to form early in life. Students ideally should arrive at school around 8.45am, which allows enough time to enjoy a quick catch up with friends before the preparation bell at 8.52am. At 8.45am, a teacher is on 'yard duty' and therefore supervision is provided from this time onwards. We ask that children do not arrive at school early unless they remain in the care of an adult until 8.45am to ensure they are supervised adequately.

### And Finally...

It's a great privilege to lead such a wonderful school and we are looking forward to supporting all our students in their learning and development in 2024. Helping each student to achieve their potential in a safe and supportive environment is our most important goal, and we look forward to working with our fantastic teaching and support staff to make this happen.

# Information for families

Amsleigh Park uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email to create a Xuno account and password.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events and can easily inform the school of their child's absences and contact detail changes.

Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent or a password reset.

# FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

### The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students

#### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.





### MORE INFORMATION
