## Principal Team Report

### Storm Update

After a few busy days, it's pleasing to note that school life is back to normal, and we are moving forward from the big storm event. There's some clean up work to do but the impacted areas around the school have been made safe or roped off. Teachers and students have been given clear instructions about out of bounds areas.

The large gum tree near the pathway has been brought to ground level by the arborists and they will be back later to chip the branches. The area remains roped off to keep students away from the many large branches and broken trunk, but it is otherwise safe. Trees that suffered damage will be inspected by a specialist arborist early next week to identify any trees and/or branches that pose a risk.

The 3-6 playground will remain closed for now until we can get the damaged poles removed. The playground itself was not damaged so we will hope to get this area reopened soon. The shade structure will be assessed so we can also work out the next step. Fortunately, damage to our buildings was minor and everything is back in good order for our classes.

Overall, we are all very relieved that students, staff and parents are safe. It's natural to feel curious about this storm event, and how it occurred. Thunderstorms are common in Melbourne, but I can't remember one this serious before. After a bit of googling and some research I can now understand how this event happened and why some locations are worse impacted than others. It's an interesting science but I hope this is a genuine 1 in 50-year storm.

### District Swimming Sports

We are pleased to report that our students did well in the district swimming sports this week and we are proud of the ten students who represented APPS. Thanks to Miss Hayes who was at the pool by 6.15am on behalf of our school, it's very much appreciated. A number of students have progressed onto the Divisional Swimming sports so congratulations and good luck!

Each week our classroom teachers select one student to receive a student excellence award based on our school values, respect, integrity, resilience, inclusion and motivation. These awards are designed to encourage our students to aspire to meeting our values, rewarding and encouraging high level behaviours and mindsets. During the course of the year we aim that every child will be recognised with a school award. Parents are notified if their child is receiving an award if they would like to attend our Friday afternoon assembly to watch.

### Curriculum Day

We want to remind everyone that on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> March we will have a curriculum day at APPS. There is no school on this day. There will be all-day care with Youth leadership Victoria, please contact them for bookings.

## Principal Team changes for 2024

I would like to let everyone know that I will be working a nine-day fortnight in 2024 as part of a special pilot program for Principals. This pilot is a new initiative that enables principal class to have more flexible working options. It's a very positive initiative, and whilst it is only a pilot for 2024, it is an option that exists in many other professions.

One of other positive advantages of this pilot is giving other staff the opportunity to work in senior leadership roles. As an experienced leader, Miss Carr will take on the role of Acting Principal every 2<sup>nd</sup> Friday. I know Miss Carr will enjoy this opportunity and is ideally placed to undertake this role. As a result, we have been able to offer a role of Acting Assistant Principal and I'm pleased to say that Miss Trish Jones has been selected to undertake this role. Miss Jones is highly experienced in student wellbeing and inclusion, which are two key roles for the Assistant Principal. I know the school will be in good hands and the fact I'm not at school every 2<sup>nd</sup> Friday will not change much for the operation of our school.

Just for the record this is not the start of an early retirement plan for me, but the opportunity presented itself for 2024 and I thought I would give it try. As a participant I will be required to report on my experience and what it might mean for the future work of principals. Having this option could extend the career of some principals of retirement age who would love to keep working but do not want to work full time. Whilst I'm not quite at retirement age myself, it will be interesting to see if the extra time off every 2<sup>nd</sup> week has an impact on the stressors that often accompany the work of the principal class.

We are fortunate at APPS that we have quality leaders who can easily step into these roles and I am grateful to Miss Carr and Miss Jones for supporting me as I undertake this opportunity.

## School Library

Our Librarian Martin reopened our school Library this week and he reports that many students enjoyed the opportunity for a lunchtime visit. Doing some quiet reading or playing a board game with a friend were popular choices. At this stage the library is open for Foundation to Grade 2 on Mondays and Grade 3-6 on Wednesdays.

## XUNO

Thank-you to families who are subscribed and regular users of XUNO. This online tool/App is our main option for communicating with our school families. Most messages go out via XUNO mail and therefore will be sent to the email accounts of all subscribers. In many instances this means that a family might receive the email to both parent's email account. It is very important that the email account is active and checked regularly. Please note that we will not send urgent messages via XUNO, and we will always contact parents via phone in this instance.

Information regarding excursions and events is also available via XUNO and includes payment and electronic permission/approval. The permission/approval is a two-step process that includes a special SMS code. These events can be accessed from the XUNO dashboard, and it is a relatively easy process to complete. You will still have the option to pay with unallocated receipts, CSEF or credit notes from your family account, please contact the general office for assistance with processing these payment types.

## School Promotion

Each year we conduct a range of promotional activities so that prospective families find out about our school. Being hidden away in Oakleigh East is great, but it also means that some families do not even know we are here, even after we have placed materials at all local pre-schools and childcare centres. One thing we do know is that 'word of mouth' is one of the best forms of promotion, and a positive word often brings families along for a look. If anyone asks, encourage them to come along for a tour, and they can see all the great things that are happening. If you are still involved in local pre-schools or childcare, please encourage other local families to visit Amsleigh Park for a tour.

## CCTV

I want to inform our community, as a courtesy, that we have CCTV cameras all around Amsleigh Park PS. The purpose of these cameras is to provide security for our school campus out of school hours. CCTV is a very effective deterrent and helps us to ensure we are not subject to vandalism. The footage is kept for a period of two weeks and is only accessed if there is an issue.

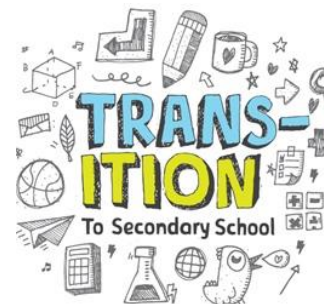
### School Picnic

### School Wide Positive Behaviour Support ~ SWPBS

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) is implemented at Amsleigh Park to improve the learning and wellbeing of all students. SWPBS is a whole school approach for creating a positive, safe and supportive school climate in which students can learn and develop.

All staff are responsible for teaching the behaviour expectations, providing consistent positive feedback to students, and delivering consistent corrective feedback. The entire school, including the learning areas, walkways, toilets and playgrounds are all considered part of the total learning environment.

## Information for families

Amsleigh Park uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family' for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email to create a Xuno account and password.

**As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events and can easily inform the school of their child's absences and contact detail changes.**

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students

### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

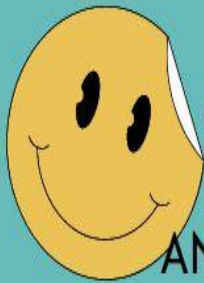
You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:
