### **Principal Team Report**

### Vale Mel Lyons

We are deeply saddened with the passing of Mrs Mel Lyons, mother of Cooper, Tyler and Brody Lyons. Along with her husband, Tony, Mel was a dedicated supporter of Amsleigh Park PS over many years. Mel was generous in her support for school events and was a regular volunteer on excursions, sports days and community functions. As a member of the Parents and Friends Association Mel also contributed to numerous PFA events and initiatives, putting her exceptional organisational skills to good use. Mel was much loved



in our school community and the funeral service was attended by many Amsleigh families who had the good fortune to call her a friend. We offer our deepest condolences to the Lyons Family. Our Parents and Friends Assoc have organised for the following community support and if anyone would like to help, this is one option for you from our PFA.

In honour of Mel, and also in response to the great outpouring of love for her husband Tony and her 3 boys, many people have asked how they can help. Some families might recall the special donation Cooper Lyons made in March 2023 when he grew a long ponytail in support of his mum. After cutting it off at school assembly Cooper's donated his hair to provide wigs for people undertaking chemotherapy. This achievement was mentioned in Federal parliament recently by our local member, Clare O'Neil, who was honouring student leaders in the Hotham electorate. I was very proud to hear his contribution was honoured in this way and is now recorded in the official records of the Federal government of Australia in the Hansard.



### **Family Sports Night**

Next Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> March is our Family Sports Night for 2024. We rotate the twilight sports night with a bush dance every second year. We would love to see everyone come along for a get together and catch up with other members of our school community.

### **Curriculum Day**

Don't forget that Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> March is a curriculum day. Our staff are working with Mathematics teaching consultant, Dr Ange Rogers, as we seek to undertake professional learning in evidenced based teaching. All day care is available with Youth Leadership Victoria (YLV).

#### **Kaboom Kids**

Last Friday we had a wonderful surprise for our students with a visit from Kaboom Kids for a fun sports event. The event was organised as a reward for our students who have been earning tokens by showing our school values in class. As they save up their tokens, they get a choice of 3 activities they want to support and place their tokens in the box. When the box is full the reward is earned and provided to students. It's all part of what we know as school wide positive behaviour support, through which we support our students to develop positive behaviours at school. This event was paid for by a grant for wellbeing we received from the Federal

government.





### **Extreme Weather Events**

We have reviewed the actions that happened during the recent extreme weather event that happened at Amsleigh Park. Whilst this is an unprecedented situation, it does help to reflect on what actions were taken and if there is anything we can learn from this experience. Some reflections:

- In the case of extreme weather students will not be dismissed until it is safe to do so. This could mean students remain indoors after the dismissal bell. (Fortunately, our staff did this anyway.)
- If any parents or carers find themselves in our school yard during an event such as his then you should find shelter indoors. The foyer of the Thelma Bailey Centre, Library Foyer, General Office and JLC corridors are all places that parents and carers can shelter in place. You do not need to ask permission to shelter in an emergency.
- Do not shelter under trees in high winds or rain. We have several covered outdoor spaces such as the Sports Pavilion and covered walkway where you can seek shelter.

It might reassure you to know that we do regularly check the weather reports and have the Vic Emergency App set for notifications. We take a conservative approach to the weather, and we normally bring students indoors on days of extreme heat or wind.

### **Storm Damage Work**

We have been working with various contractors to fix up the damage from the storm. The largest part of this work has been our trees and I am pleased to report that this has been completed. All areas have undergone what we know as a 'make safe' so you will notice there are still a few areas cordoned off. We are currently working on the 3-6 playground, but getting a new shade sail will take some time. The playground is due to be reopened now that the damaged pole has fencing around it. Thanks for your support and patience as we have worked through this process.

### **Allergies and Asthma Management**

Each year we undertake staff briefings and training in the management of anaphylaxis and asthma as we

have a number of students who have these illnesses. We are well prepared to handle any emergencies in the unlikely instance we must support one of our students. If you have a child with Asthma you do need to update their management plan annually with your GP so that we have the latest information. Anaphylaxis is a severe life-threatening illness so we have clear protocols in place for this. All students not only have their own Epi-pens, but we also have a stock of school owned Epi-pens in case they are needed. We also ask that students do not bring 'nuts' or nut based products to school at any time. This might include common foods such as muesli bars that contain nuts, Nutella and peanut butter. We simply cannot take the risk as even a small exposure can lead to a reaction.



Thanks for your support with this, children will have to enjoy these foods outside of school hours. If you have any questions about the management of Asthma or Anaphylaxis, please contact us.

### Safety Week - Term 1

Week 5 of each term is Safety Week and it's that time of the term we focus specifically on important reminders. During safety week our students undertake learning that is focused on their personal safety and knowing when they are at risk. The lessons come from the Daniel Morcombe curriculum and it's important learning for all children.

In Safety week we typically have an evacuation or other safety drill, so students know what to do in an emergency. During safety week our staff also reflect on our 'Child Safety' policies and the important role they play in making sure we identify and report any abuse we might become aware of. All teachers are mandated reporters and if a child discloses something they are bound by law to report it to the Department of Families, Fairness and Housing. ### **Coffee Morning**

We are so looking forward to hosting our first 'Coffee Morning' for 2024, later this term! #### **Family Account Information**

### **Student Medications**

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (eg. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office.

We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. Parents are required to provide up to date Action Plans and inform the school office of any changes to a student's medical condition / action plan.

This does not however, include occasional antibiotics. Wherever possible, parents should request antibiotic prescriptions that can be taken at home, ie Antibiotics that are required 3 times per day can be taken at home in the morning, on return from school and again at bedtime. For students that do require antibiotics at school, a parent must complete a medication authority form when handing medication into the office.

### All medication must be stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

It is recommended that students with hayfever etc. take their medication at home before school.

### Absences / Late Arrivals

<u>A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno</u>. This ensures that Admin staff, who process all attendance data, including late arrivals and early exits, are receiving the attendance information in the first instance. Teachers are notified of the absence/late arrival during this process. If you wish to pass on any further information to teachers, please send them an additional email. If unable to report via Xuno, absences can also be advised by emailing the General Office or phoning the school and selecting "1" when prompted to leave an absence message.

Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.

Parents should complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip" and hand this to their child who will proceed on their own to their classroom and give the late slip to the teacher.

### School Emails – Check the email address you are sending / replying to

When contacting classroom teachers, or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the 'To' address.

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with a huge number of other daily external emails.

Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner and creates extra work for Admin staff.

When responding to a teacher's email, please refer to their email address that appears within their message and copy & paste that address into the address field.

Any items not available at time of order will be placed on back order and provided as soon as possible.



### Information for families

Amsleigh Park uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email to create a Xuno account and password.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events and can easily inform the school of their child's absences and contact detail changes.

Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent or a password reset.

# FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students

#### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.


You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.


