Principal Team Report

Swimming Program 2024

Issue 4

I hope that our students are looking forward to our swimming program which commences on Monday 18th March. This annual program is a great opportunity to further develop swimming skills and water safety knowledge. Given that Australians often enjoy water sports it is vital that all children learn to swim with proficiency. It might just save their life one day.

Parents can attend the pool to observe sessions, but at no time should anyone interfere in the session or talk to instructors. In the unlikely event that anyone has a concern this should be raised with the classroom teacher or principal class team. We would also ask that no photos are taken at the pool, which infringes the rules of Centre and compromises student safety.

Please note that all <u>helpers</u> for swimming need to have a valid Working With Children Check card. This can be organised online and is a straightforward and FREE process for volunteers. If you are helping with swimming, please visit the office with your Working With Children Check Card for sighting & copying. **NAPLAN**

Our Grade 3s and 5s have been sitting their annual NAPLAN tests this week, which are now conducted online. The way NAPLAN is reported to parents changed in 2023. Instead of the old 10 band system used previously, students will now receive one of 4 ratings for each test area. The new ratings are:

- Exceeding A child has met the proficiency standard
- Strong A child has met the proficiency standard
- Developing A child has not met the proficiency standard
- Needs additional support A child has not met the proficiency standard

The new standards are designed to provide a clearer understanding of your child's achievement levels. A result in strong or exceeding shows that a child is achieving at the expected standard for their age level.

As is always the case at Amsleigh Park, we use the information from NAPLAN and our testing to inform planning and then cater to the point of need of each of our students. The NAPLAN tests will provide information as to what areas our Year 3 and 5 students need to focus on next. NAPLAN provides each student with a snapshot of their learning and this information is cross referenced with school-based assessments to provide a rounded view of each child's progress. NAPLAN results should be received in Term 2.

School Promotion

Each year we conduct a range of promotional activities so that prospective families find out about our school. Being hidden away in Oakleigh East is great, but it also means that some families do not even know we are here, even after we have placed materials at all local pre-schools and childcare centres. One thing we do know is that 'word of mouth' is one of the best forms

of promotion, and a positive word often brings families along for a look. If anyone asks, encourage them to come along for a tour, and they can see all the great things that are happening. If you are still involved in local pre-schools or childcare, please encourage other local families to visit Amsleigh Park for a tour.

Changes to Foundation Enrolment Process for 2025

In 2023 the Department of Education introduced a new process for Foundation (Prep) enrolment that included a timeline to follow. Having a set date for enrolment worked very well in 2023 and this was an effective change and provided schools with more certainty earlier in the school year.

This year the Department of Education are taking this a step further with the introduction of a new online

system for putting in applications for enrolment. Families will put in an online application to enrol via the new **'Insight'** Portal using a quick and easy process. Basically, it will be a matter of entering your child's name, residential address and then choosing Amsleigh Park PS as your school. Like any new process we will work through it in good faith with the hope that is functions well. A reminder will be sent out to our community in Term 2 with instructions.



Bullying Prevention

Amsleigh Park PS is a harmonious school most of the time, but as we know children can sometimes make poor choices. On occasion we are called upon to manage 'bullying' type behaviours, although we find they are not always bullying in the truest sense. Whilst being subjected to anti-social behaviours from another student is distressing, it becomes bullying when the behaviours show a <u>repeated</u> pattern (more than a one off). Usually there is also a power imbalance between the individuals, with one person using this power to hurt (physical, verbal, exclusion) the other. Often this kind of behaviour is covert (kept secret), so it is not always obvious or easy to see. At our school 'bullying behaviours' are not acceptable, and we work hard to maintain an environment in which children know and understand this. We focus on prevention rather than reaction and our school follows 'School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS). One of our primary goals of SWPBS is to teach children to behave in a positive manner by teaching them what the behaviours look like and why they are important. All our expected behaviours follow our school values of respect, inclusion, resilience, integrity and motivation. We call these the 'universal behaviours', and most children follow them well. In addition to this we also explicitly teach other important social skills through the Resilience Project, Daniel Morcombe personal safety program and the Zones of Regulation.

If parents are worried about any persistent behaviours directed towards your child, please discuss this with your child's teacher as a first step. It helps to be aware that it takes some time to investigate the situation properly and during that time we ask for your patience whilst we get a clear understanding. Rest assured the matter will not be closed until we have a plan in place that addresses the situation. Our aim will always be to maintain the safety and wellbeing of our students and bullying or other distressing behaviours will not be tolerated.

Parental Communication Policy

At Amsleigh Park PS we are committed to effective communication and ensuring that appropriate opportunities exist for parents to raise any concerns and ask questions related to their child's education, wellbeing and progress.

Typically, parents will need to make an appointment to meet with their child's teacher, especially if the matter needs an in-depth discussion. A meeting such as this is best done at a mutually convenient time, where there is enough time to have a proper discussion. Please contact the teacher via XUNO or email if you wish to make an appointment with them.

Before school is **not** a convenient time to contact teachers as they are usually making final preparations for teaching. A brief message is usually Ok before school, so long as a lengthy discussion is not required. After school is the best time and our teachers will endeavour to fit this in around our regular meetings, which are held on Mondays and Wednesdays. CCTV

I want to inform our community, as a courtesy, that we have CCTV cameras all around Amsleigh Park PS. The purpose of these cameras is to provide security for our school campus out of school hours. CCTV is a very effective deterrent and helps us to ensure we are not subject to vandalism. The footage is kept for a period of two weeks and is only accessed if there is an issue.

Safety on our School Crossings

Having our school crossings on State Street and Dublin Street is vital in supporting us to maintain community safety. Our crossing supervisors have a very important role to play in assisting all families to arrive at school safely. We need to make sure that we support our crossing supervisors to undertake their role by following some simple and easy to understand rules:



- always use a crossing
- wait for the whistle before crossing
- always cross between the 2 white lines, remaining in front of the crossing supervisor

As we have a crossing on both Dublin Street and State Street, we discourage families from crossing the road within 100m of the crossing. Walking out from behind a parked car can be dangerous as drivers may not see you or your child. Recently we've become aware of some unsafe behaviour, and we all need to work together to ensure there are no accidents.

Illness

From time to time, children are unwell and are unavoidably absent from school. Although we would like students attending school every day where possible, it is important to keep sick children at home. This prevents other children becoming unwell and a bug spreading through the school. We have spoken to our students about the importance of hand washing and personal hygiene and appreciate your support in reinforcing this at home with your child.

School Uniform

We are very lucky at Amsleigh Park to have an onsite uniform shop, run by fantastic parent volunteers, lead by Libby. Having parents undertake this role enables the school to continue to provide uniforms at a 'wholesale' price as our shop is non-profit. The uniform shop is open Tuesdays from 3:00-3:45pm. On the topic of uniforms, as we've visited classes this week we

were pleased to see that our students were looking smart in their uniforms. A reminder that our policy states that students should wear a light or dark coloured shoe, and this offers lots of scope in the design of shoe. Fluorescent shoes should not be worn as part of the school uniform, and we ask for community support to meet the school policy in this regard. It really does look fantastic when our whole school is in uniform. It creates a sense of connectedness and pride in our school.



Community Working Bee

As communicated via Xuno, on Saturday 16th March from 1pm-4pm, the PFA are holding a whole school working bee. We would love to see as many families as possible attend, to help keep our school yard looking areat. Please bring along (if you have them) gardening gloves, gardening tools (including pruning tools, shovels, garden material collection bags, brooms/rakes; garden weeders etc), a hat and enthusiasm! Year 6-7 Transition (Relevant for Year 6 families)

The State-wide year 6-7 transition process will begin in the first week of next term, with all Grade 6 students in Victoria receiving a transition information pack. This pack will detail the transition process, including the relevant paperwork required to apply for secondary schools. Please keep an eye out for this very important information early next term. In the meantime, we encourage our senior students and their families to attend open days/night and tour



Secondary Schools in the area to become familiar with the possible schools your child may attend. If interested, please contact your local Catholic or Independent Secondary Schools to inquire into their enrolment process, as they differ from the shared process of all Government Secondary Schools. Family Account Information

Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (eg. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office.

We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. Parents are required to provide up to date Action Plans and inform the school office of any changes to a student's medical condition / action plan.

This does not however, include occasional antibiotics. Wherever possible, parents should request antibiotic prescriptions that can be taken at home, ie Antibiotics that are required 3 times per day can be taken at home in the morning, on return from school and again at bedtime. For students that do require antibiotics at school, a parent must complete a medication authority form when handing medication into the office.

All medication must be stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

It is recommended that students with hayfever etc. take their medication at home before school.

Absences / Late Arrivals

<u>A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno</u>. This ensures that Admin staff, who process all attendance data, including late arrivals and early exits, are receiving the attendance information in the first instance. Teachers are notified of the absence/late arrival during this process. If you wish to pass on any further information to teachers, please send them an additional email. If unable to report via Xuno, absences can also be advised by emailing the General Office or phoning the school and selecting "1" when prompted to leave an absence message.

Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.

Parents should complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip" and hand this to their child who will proceed on their own to their classroom and give the late slip to the teacher.

<u>School Emails – Check the email address you are sending / replying to</u>

When contacting classroom teachers, or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the **'To'** address.

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with a huge number of other daily external emails.

Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner and creates extra work for Admin staff.

When responding to a teacher's email, please refer to their email address that appears within their message and copy & paste that address into the address field.

Information for families

Amsleigh Park uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email to create a Xuno account and password.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events and can easily inform the school of their child's absences and contact detail changes.

Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent or a password reset.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
