Principal Team Report

Our Fantastic Camping Program

Our grade 3-6 students have now attended their annual school camp as part of our Outdoor Education Program for 2024. Having the opportunity to attend a camp in a highly supported environment is an excellent learning experience, building independence, self-reliance and self-care routines. Having attended the recent Grade 3-4 camp, I observed that our students generally thrive in this experience, even though it can be a challenge to be away from the security of home.

At Lady Northcote, our students enjoyed activities that included the giant swing, canoeing, bush cooking, orienteering, initiatives (teamwork) and bike riding. All are 'challenge by choice,' meaning that students are not forced to participate, but most did challenge themselves. The giant swing is a good example of this where you can go up a short way or right to the very top at 21m.

The 3-4s for 2024 were an outstanding camp group and we hope they all had a great experience. I personally enjoyed spending some quality time with them and helping to support their individual growth and development. I want to say well done to our campers and congratulate them on their participation and efforts.

Many thanks to the teaching staff who attended which included: Mr Darlow, Miss Colacitti, Miss Brown, Miss Maley, Miss Hayes; our education support staff Louise, Vicky and Josef; and finally, Pat McGlenchy, who generously gave up his time to come along and assist as a volunteer parent. I sincerely appreciate your dedication to our students but providing this experience. It's a lot to give up time from your personal lives and I thank you all sincerely. Later this year our Grade 2s will have the chance to do the sleepover at school for 2024, and our Grade 1s will do a late stay. Both are valuable preparation for the camping program.

Beating the Winter Chills

Unfortunately, we have experienced a lot of illness across our school in the past few weeks, with COVID-19 on the rise again and other nasty colds and tummy bugs going around. Schools always go through these times, so it is not unexpected. Given our staff work directly with students every day, they are highly susceptible to catching these illnesses too and (just like students) must be away from school when they are ill. We understand that it can be disruptive when the teacher is absent but it's not something we can avoid. Wherever possible we get relief teachers, but there is a nationwide shortage of teachers, so they are not always available. We hope you can understand this situation and we appreciate your patience.

One thing parents and carers can do to help is to make sure children are not sent to school when they are sick as this is the main reason that we get these illnesses spreading. Children typically need a few days off with a cold to get over the highly infectious stage, and at least five days for COVID. If children have a tummy issue, then they should not return until after 24 hours since last being sick or having diarrhoea. I say this as we are currently sending children home every day who are miserable and not feeling well due to illness. All we can do is work together as a community to try and keep it to a minimum. Hopefully the current surge will soon be over.

Excursions and Bus Costs

We would like to inform parents and carers that the cost of hiring buses for excursions and sports continues to be a challenge. It does concern us to see these increases and we always shop around for good value across the range of companies we normally use. Rest assured there is no compromise on the quality of the buses we hire which are all seat belted coaches. When we organise sport or excursions, we only charge what it costs our school which is normally the bus fare, the price of the event or venue being visited. If a child did <u>not</u> attend an excursion or event due to illness and where we have <u>not</u> incurred costs, we will refund that money. This is decided on a case-by-case basis as detailed in our refunds policy. We do hope that you can understand that providers will often not change the prearranged costings and we are obliged to pay even if a student did not attend. It's much the same as if you purchased a ticket to a sporting match and could not attend at the last minute, where you will not get a refund if you don't attend. Family Account Information

Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (eg. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office.

We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. Parents are required to provide up to date Action Plans and inform the school office of any changes to a student's medical condition / action plan.

This does not however, include occasional antibiotics. Wherever possible, parents should request antibiotic prescriptions that can be taken at home, ie Antibiotics that are required 3 times per day can be taken at home in the morning, on return from school and again at bedtime. For students that do require antibiotics at school, a parent must complete a medication authority form when handing medication into the office. All medication must be stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

It is recommended that students with hayfever etc. take their medication at home before school.

Absences / Late Arrivals

<u>A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno</u>. This ensures that Admin staff, who process all attendance data, including late arrivals and early exits, are receiving the attendance information in the first instance. Teachers are notified of the absence/late arrival during this process. If you wish to pass on any further information to teachers, please send them an additional email. If unable to report via Xuno, absences can also be advised by emailing the General Office or phoning the school and selecting "1" when prompted to leave an absence message.

Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.

Parents should complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip" and hand this to their child who will proceed on their own to their classroom and give the late slip to the teacher.

School Emails - Check the email address you are sending / replying to

When contacting classroom teachers, or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the **'To'** address.

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with a huge number of other daily external emails.

Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner and creates extra work for Admin staff.

When responding to a teacher's email, please refer to their email address that appears within their message and copy & paste that address into the address field.

Amsleigh Park uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email to create a Xuno account and password.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events and can easily inform the school of their child's absences and contact detail changes.

Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent or a password reset.

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and Amsleigh Park Primary School is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:


