Principal Team Report

Breaking News...Synthetic Phonics Mandated Across Victoria

The Minister for Education, Ben Carroll, has announced this week that all schools will be mandated to undertake the teaching of synthetic phonics in Foundation to Grade 2. This direction has been initiated due to the evidence clearly showing that this approach is highly effective in the teaching of reading and spelling. We are pleased to hear about this new mandate and want to point out to our school community that we made this change 3 years ago. Whilst the media would have you believe it's new, there are schools such as Amsleigh Park who recognised this a long time ago.

Our journey with the explicit teaching of synthetic phonics actually started back in 2015 and has been shaped and modified over several years before we formally adopted 'Sounds Write' in 2022. Under the expert leadership of our Learning Specialist, Miss Barker, the implementation of Sounds Write is already well embedded in Foundation to Grade 2 and in 2024 is being further extended into Grade 3-6. To support this our staff have undertaken extensive training as 'Sounds Write Practitioners' requiring about 50+ hours of professional learning. We have invested significant financial resources in this professional learning and in purchasing of decodable readers required to support this approach. As a result of both our foresight and investment, our students are already benefitting from this instructional approach, and we are well ahead of the curve. It's not often we 'toot' our own horns but I think that credit should be given where it's due. In this instance the credit goes to our teaching staff who have embraced the importance of evidenced based teaching and to Miss Barker who has led this work. Change takes a lot of time and effort and we have been highly successful in the way we have approached this. We now take the mindset that 'when you know better, you do better,' and apply this same lens to all areas of our teaching.

Boogie Fever

Next Thursday 20th June our students will be looking forward to the annual School Disco night. Organised and run by the Amsleigh Parents and Friends Association, this event is always a highlight for our students. I realise the term 'Boogie Fever' is a bit outdated these days but I'm sure there are still those who remember the classics! I would like to express sincere thanks to the PFA for organising this event, we really appreciate it. Thanks in advance to the many parents who will also be in attendance.

Aerobics Success

A big well done to our Aerobics teams who competed in the Victorian State championships recently. After good performances and with a good interstate competition, Team Dynamos will head to the national competition being held in Adelaide in Term 3. Our students and staff are all very dedicated to the aerobics program and train weekly to get the routines into shape. Student Achievement Reports



Teachers have recently been working on the mid-year student achievement reports. As part of this process, students have been completing various assessment tasks and it has been wonderful to celebrate the progress our students have made in their learning. The mid-year reports will be distributed to families on Monday 24th June, via Xuno.

An important part of Amsleigh Park's process in reporting achievement to parents and carers, is the Parent Teacher interviews. These interviews will be held at Amsleigh Park, on the afternoon and evening of Wednesday 26th June and allow for further discussion and questions regarding your child's written report. It is a time to share successes and future goals regarding your child. We encourage all parents and carers to attend.

Visit by Collingwood Footballers

We had a visit from some AFL players last week who came along to talk to our Gade 5/6s before heading out to the Auskick clinic after school. Meeting AFL players up close is always interesting and you very quickly realise they are just another person who just happens to have the skills required to play at the highest level of competition. It's important to see this human side of footballers who reinforce to students the importance or good health, fitness, training and preparation.



What's Happening in our Buildings and Grounds

We have a wonderful school campus, generous in size and with outstanding learning spaces and playgrounds. Keeping all in good order keeps us busy and in recent times we have achieved the following:

- We continue to clear up and repair damage caused by the big storm in February. We have now completed an insurance claim for damages to the 3-6 playground and works will soon commence to get it fixed and for sails to be installed in time for the warmer weather later in the year.
- Further works will be undertaken soon on damaged trees, some of which need to be either pruned or removed.
- With the generous financial support of the Amsleigh Park Parents and Friends Association, we have planned for a special picnic area to be constructed outside the Grade 2 classrooms. This project includes an artificial grass surface where we are unable to grow real grass, with room for 3-4 picnic tables. Works will commence soon and should make the area safer, more functional and also improve the look.
- Other areas of maintenance include fixing up and painting of damaged window frames outside the library, ongoing work to keep our grounds hazard free and lots of minor maintenance both inside and outside of our classrooms.

It's always a very busy space.

Advance Notice - Curriculum Day

Our next curriculum day will be held on Monday 22nd July. This will be a pupil free day and our teachers will continue the work we have been do in conjunction with Mathematics consultant, Dr Ange Rogers. Through this strategic partnership we have been working on further optimising the teaching of mathematics with a focus on the essential conceptual knowledge that children need to be successful in learning, which we know as the 'Big Ideas in Number'. Children need to be competent in the big ideas which include counting, place value, additive and multiplicative thinking. Learning gaps in these big ideas generally means a student will find it increasingly more difficult as the content get more complex so it is vital that we make sure all children build this knowledge.

We are currently taking Foundation enrolments for 2025. If your child has a younger sibling due to start school in 2025, please see https://students.educationapps.vic.gov.au/s/ for how to complete a digital enrolment application. Families need to submit their enrolments application before Friday 26th July. We look forward to getting to know our 2025 Foundation students through the Foundation transition program in Term 4.

Family Account Information

Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (eg. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office.

We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. Parents are required to provide up to date Action Plans and inform the school office of any changes to a student's medical condition / action plan.

This does not however, include occasional antibiotics. Wherever possible, parents should request antibiotic prescriptions that can be taken at home, ie Antibiotics that are required 3 times per day can be taken at home in the morning, on return from school and again at bedtime. For students that do require antibiotics at school, a parent must complete a medication authority form when handing medication into the office.

All medication, including over the counter types, must be stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

It is recommended that students with hayfever etc. take their medication at home before school.

Absences / Late Arrivals

<u>A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno</u>. This ensures that Admin staff, who process all attendance data, including late arrivals and early exits, are receiving the attendance information in the first instance. Teachers are notified of the absence/late arrival during this process. If you wish to pass on any further information to teachers, please send them an additional email. If unable to report via Xuno, absences can also be advised by emailing the General Office or phoning the school and selecting "1" when prompted to leave an absence message.

Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.

Parents should complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip" and hand this to their child who will proceed on their own to their classroom and give the late slip to the teacher.

School Emails – Check the email address you are sending / replying to

When contacting classroom teachers, or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the 'To' address.

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with a huge number of other daily external emails.

Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner and creates extra work for Admin staff.

When responding to a teacher's email, please refer to their email address that appears within their message and copy & paste that address into the address field.

Amsleigh Park uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email to create a Xuno account and password.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events and can easily inform the school of their child's absences and contact detail changes.

Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent or a password reset.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.


