Principal Team Report

PFA Update

On page 2 we have included an update from our Parents and Friends Association, who are always very busy behind the scenes organising special events for our students and school community. The generous support provided by our PFA is greatly appreciated by one and all and adds so much to our students experience of school life. Our teacher and support staff also value all the things PFA organise or support to enrich school life. We cannot thank our PFA enough and offer them '3 cheers' from us all! STEM Video Challenge

Mrs Dimopoulous and a group of keen users of technology have been busy with a special STEM video game creation project during Term 2. The Australian STEM Video Game Challenge seeks to:

- ENGAGE students in STEM subjects
- ENABLE students to develop real-world skills
- EMPOWER more students to choose STEM careers.

Mrs Dimopoulous reports that our students have some great ideas, and they are all doing well in this project. One group have created a game where the character woke up and there were no stars in the sky, so they go to NASA to find the stars. Another created a game where they must be the rocket and avoid the space rock to collect stars. Many thanks to Mrs Dimopoulos who initiated this project and well done to those children who have chosen to take part. I'm looking forward to seeing their ideas and creations as they develop.

Tutor Learning and Intervention

There has been some recent press coverage about the use of Government funding for the Tutor Learning Initiative. This program has been in place for four years and schools have been provided with extra funds that we use to employ teaching staff to provide learning support and intervention for children. The press coverage suggests that this money has been spent well in about 30% of schools and I'm pleased to say Amsleigh Park PS is one of them. In a recent review with the regional leaders, we were congratulated for the scope and implementation of our intervention program, and this is a great credit to the teaching staff and leaders who have been involved. Currently Mrs DeFazio, Mrs Martin, Mrs Kennedy, Mrs Dimopoulous and Melissa Winters are all part of the team providing this valuable support to students, working along with Miss Carr to ensure we make the most of this opportunity. Previously Mrs Jonga was also part of the team who set up the initial program in 2022. At present this program is funded for 2025 and we are ever hopeful that it might continue as it has proven to be an invaluable support for our students.

Teachers Duty of Care

From 8.52am every morning students come into class to prepare for the school day and teachers assume duty of care for their students. At this time teachers need to be focused on students and support them to get ready for the day. We hope you will understand that this means they are generally not able to talk to parents or carers other than to take onboard a quick message. We do want to be accessible, but it needs to be balanced out with the teacher's duty of care to their students. If you need to talk to the teacher about a concern this is important, this is best done at a time when the teacher can give you their full attention. If the concern is urgent, you could also come and talk to Miss Carr or myself and we will normally be able to assist as an initial step.

Get Your Move On

With holidays next week our students have a chance to recharge and enjoy and change of pace. It might be colder outside right now but this is no reason for children not to get out in the fresh air. Childhood Anxiety

We are often asked by parents and carers about how they can best support their child/ren with their worries, or anxious feelings. One thing to note is that all children are likely to experience these feelings at some point, and this is typical of all people. If you feel these worries are happening more often or impacting negatively on your child, a visit to the GP can be a great way to start the conversation about their mental health as GPs can provide referrals to the appropriate supports. We have included a flyer in this newsletter, promoting a clinic through Swinburn University, offering a program for



primary children aged 6-11, and their parents/carers on how to manage childhood anxiety. We encourage those families interested to utilise the self-referred program to help support their child/ren.

Family Account Information

Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (eg. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office.

We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. Parents are required to provide up to date Action Plans and inform the school office of any changes to a student's medical condition / action plan.

This does not however, include occasional antibiotics. Wherever possible, parents should request antibiotic prescriptions that can be taken at home, ie Antibiotics that are required 3 times per day can be taken at home in the morning, on return from school and again at bedtime. For students that do require antibiotics at school, a parent must complete a medication authority form when handing medication into the office.

All medication, including over the counter types, must be stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

It is recommended that students with hayfever etc. take their medication at home before school.

Absences / Late Arrivals

<u>A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno</u>. This ensures that Admin staff, who process all attendance data, including late arrivals and early exits, are receiving the attendance information in the first instance. Teachers are notified of the absence/late arrival during this process. If you wish to pass on any further information to teachers, please send them an additional email. If unable to report via Xuno, absences can also be advised by emailing the General Office or phoning the school and selecting "1" when prompted to leave an absence message.

Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.

Parents should complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip" and hand this to their child who will proceed on their own to their classroom and give the late slip to the teacher.

<u>School Emails – Check the email address you are sending / replying to</u>

When contacting classroom teachers, or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the 'To' address.

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with a huge number of other daily external emails.

Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner and creates extra work for Admin staff.

When responding to a teacher's email, please refer to their email address that appears within their message and copy & paste that address into the address field.

Amsleigh Park uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email to create a Xuno account and password.


As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events and can easily inform the school of their child's absences and contact detail changes.





The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and Amsleigh Park Primary School is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- · a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved
- the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by Friday 6th September. Many of these books are available at our school library or can be found at local libraries and online.

ONE STEP AT A TIME PROGRAM: PARENTSUPPORT FOR CHILDHOOD ANXIETY

Swinburne Psychology Clinic

Parents / guardians:

Do you have a primary school-aged child experiencing symptoms of anxiety?

Clinicians at Swinburne University have developed a program to help parents manage childhood anxiety in children aged 6-11 years.

Does your child experience any of the following?

- Difficulties sleeping at night due to worries
- · Fears and phobias
- Difficulty separating from you or worrying about parental safety
- Trouble sleeping alone in their bed
- · Fear of the dark
- · Scared of lifts, trains, and people
- · Fear of dogs and other animals
- Excessive worry and constant reassurance seeking
- Fear of germs and other health problems

The One Step at a Time Program involves:

- Comprehensive psychological assessment of your child's anxiety
- Seven sessions of online counselling through video conferencing
- Parent-focused cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT) skills to help you manage and support your child's anxiety
- Two combined parent-child sessions
- · Reflective parenting strategies
- Access to a website with selfhelp materials to supplement therapy.



Cost

\$20 per session/assessment. Treatment consists of seven therapy sessions plus one assessment session.


