STEM Challenge

Thirteen of our budding digital designers have been keenly participating in the STEM video games challenge for 2024. Their brief was to design and then create a video game focused on the theme, Stars, using a digital platform. Working in teams or individually, our students have been using Scratch, which is a programming platform. Through this project they were required to build their skills and apply them to create their functioning video game. It involved lots of testing, receiving feedback and improving, which is characteristic of this kind of software engineering. The designs are done and submitted, and they have now progressed through stage one of the judging process. We are super excited for our designers and a big congratulations to them for their efforts. As this is an optional project, we commend them for taking on this extra challenge and dedicating their own time to make it work. I want to make a special acknowledgement to our ICT specialist teacher, Mrs Lauren Dimopoulos, who initiated this project for these students. Many thanks on behalf of us all.

and ensuring that uniforms are available quickly and easily. Having a volunteer run our uniform shop also means that we can keep it as a non-profit entity and our uniforms are sold at the wholesale price that we pay for them. This is a big saving for all families and otherwise they would be 30-40% more expensive. Having a shop onsite is convenient and there are not many schools who can maintain this kind of service.

NCCD 2024 - Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD has no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information.

2024 Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents / caregivers / guardians think of our school. The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, and student engagement. The survey is optional, but we encourage all families to participate. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

In 2024 all families are invited to participate in the survey. The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey will be open from Monday 29th July to Friday 30th August 2024.

The survey will be conducted online, only takes 20 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic,

Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese.

The results of the survey are analysed by staff and the school council who look for trends that might need addressing in the community. For example, the survey might indicate that parents and carers would like more information about an area of the school, and we can then address this in the newsletter or other communications.





All families will be invited to participate in the survey and an email was sent on Tuesday with a link to the survey and the school's PIN number. Families should only complete the survey once.

Curriculum Days 2024

We have two remaining curriculum days left for 2024. The next day will be on Thursday 12th September. Our teaching and support staff will be learning about the new Statewide Disability and Inclusion model on this day. In Term 4 we will have a final curriculum day on Thursday 21st November for the purpose of assessment and reporting. All day care will be available for any families who require it with Youth Leadership Victoria. Please see YLV staff for bookings.

Solar System at Amsleigh Park PS

A few months ago, we had a large 24kw solar power system installed on the roof of our gymnasium. Reducing our carbon footprint is important and through this system we hope to generate a lot of our own electricity.

Since getting our system a few months ago we have generated about 4.3mwh of electricity. This is enough to power an electric car to drive for 3600kms, toast about 90000 slices of bread or power the average home for about 1.2 months. Let's not forget we are talking about the winter months when we are not expecting to generate huge amounts, so it is looking very promising for the warmer months of the year. This amount of electricity is worth about \$1200 so that's also the start of some savings in this area for the school. Thanks our school council for having the vision to support this important project, which will utlimately lead to our school saving money in future, whilst also making a positive contribution to protecting our environment.



Foundation Enrolments for 2025

We are currently working through the timeline for enrolling Foundation students for 2025. This year, along with all schools in the Inner East, we moved to an online system for applications, and we have now sent out all of our offers of a place. These families now need to accept the place in the next couple of weeks and we will then have a firm idea of our total number of Foundation classes in 2025.

Enroment and school promotion is always a busy space and we work hard to showcase our school to the local community. As always 'word of mouth' recommendations form other families are always the most powerful promotion for schools so please pass on our details to any new families in the area. In some instances families are not aware of the school as we are so nicely tucked away in the middle of Oakleigh East.

The Olympics....

Australia has a proud history as a sporting nation, and I think most would agree we perform very well given our population. Comparative to other nations we are right up there and seem to have a love of sports of all kinds. One of the things I feel very proud of is that we have many athletes competing in so many sporting disciplines, and our competitors give it their all. Just competing at an elite level is such an amazing feat and win-lose or draw they should rightfully feel very proud of themselves.

The great thing about sports is that there are so many of them, and just about anyone could find a sport to try out. Think about Archery, BMX riding, Equestrian as some examples of sports most of us only think about when the Olympics rolls around every four years. My point here is that participating in sport is a great thing, and something I would encourage all children to do. It can open a world of fun, camaraderie and teamwork for anyone willing to give it a go. You don't need to be the best; you just need to have a go.

Family Account Information

Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (eg. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office.

We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. Parents are required to provide up to date Action Plans and inform the school office of any changes to a student's medical condition / action plan.

This does not however, include occasional antibiotics. Wherever possible, parents should request antibiotic prescriptions that can be taken at home, ie Antibiotics that are required 3 times per day can be taken at home in the morning, on return from school and again at bedtime. For students that do require antibiotics at school, a parent must complete a medication authority form when handing medication into the office. All medication, including over the counter types, must be stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

It is recommended that students with hay fever etc. take their medication at home before school.

Absences / Late Arrivals

<u>A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno</u>. This ensures that Admin staff, who process all attendance data, including late arrivals and early exits, are receiving the attendance information in the first instance. Teachers are notified of the absence/late arrival during this process. If you wish to pass on any further information to teachers, please send them an additional email. If unable to report via Xuno, absences can also be advised by emailing the General Office or phoning the school and selecting "1" when prompted to leave an absence message.

Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.

Parents should complete the sign in register, fill out a "Late Slip" and hand this to their child who will proceed on their own to their classroom and give the late slip to the teacher.

School Emails - Check the email address you are sending / replying to

When contacting classroom teachers, or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the **'To'** address.

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with a huge number of other daily external emails.

Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner and creates extra work for Admin staff.

When responding to a teacher's email, please refer to their email address that appears within their message and copy & paste that address into the address field.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email to create a Xuno account and password.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events and can easily inform the school of their child's absences and contact detail changes.


