Mother's Day Stall



Safety Week at APPS

Each term we have a special safety focus during week 5 that includes the Child Safety Standards and Occupational Health and Safety. The Child Safety standards has many varied components, and one essential aspect is empowering students with their own personal safety. Through the Daniel Morcombe Personal Safety Curriculum our students are taught to recognise when they are not safe, react to stay safe and report any incidences or worries they have to a trusted adult. This learning is built up over time and introduces age-appropriate scenarios to discuss and explore as children build their understanding of personal safety.

The Child Safety Standards also focus on building community awareness about child abuse and taking a stand to protect children. Whilst it might be an uncomfortable topic in a primary school, we cannot be complacent when it comes to child Safety. Every child has the right to be safe and protected from abuse. Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge (PRC) is now open and Amsleigh Park Primary School is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- a modern user-friendly interface
- rewarding students with badges as new challenge milestones are achieved
- the option for students to mark books as favourites, give them a star rating or complete a book review.

The PRC is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition, but rather a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 7 September 2024. Children from Foundation to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books. All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers. Attitudes to School Survey

The Department of Education's annual Attitudes to School Survey (AtoSS) for students in Years 4 to 6 will be conducted from May 19 to June 12 2025. The AtoSS is a voluntary annual student survey offered by the Department of Education to assist schools and the department to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experiences of school. Student voice is a very important consideration when improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction. We will be asking your child about their thoughts and feelings in relation to their school, their learning, peer relationships, resilience, bullying, health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life in general.

The results are presented to our school in an aggregated form to protect student privacy. Our school reflects on the collective responses and identifies practices across our school that are strong and areas where we can improve. The data informs our Annual Implementation Plan ensuring we are supporting the learning and wellbeing needs of our students.

The data for our students collected over the longer term shows clearly that we are a school that is doing well in this area of schooling. Our data consistently shows that we are a school achieving strong results when compared with similar schools and state averages. For example, in 2024 the measure for 'stimulated learning' was 87% compared to 76% for similar schools and 77% for the State average; 'sense of connectedness' was 81% compared to 75% and 77% and 'effective classroom behaviour' was 85% compared to 76% and 77% for comparative measures. In fact, there was not one comparative measure in which our school was behind similar schools or the State average. We are doing very well in this space.

Whilst it's not a competition between schools we can use this comparison to evaluate our performance and then undertake improvements as they are needed.

Report Writing Day

Please remember that we have report writing day on Wednesday 4th June 2025. This is a mandated day for the teaching staff to support them to complete this large task. Rather than having to spend all their weekends and time at home on report writing there is a chance to get a good head start.

New 'Mathematics 2.0' Curriculum at Amsleigh Park in 2025

The Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCAA) have published its revised maths curriculum (Mathematics 2.0). All Victorian Government schools are using this curriculum in 2025, including Amsleigh Park Primary, who have been teaching this curriculum since the beginning of the year.

While similar to the previous maths curriculum, some skills have been moved and will now be taught at a different year level. There is also a change to the structure of the way the curriculum is organised. It is now structured in 6 interrelated strands:

- Number
- Algebra
- Measurement
- Space
- Statistics
- Probability (commencing at Level 3).

Along with the change to the curriculum itself, there has been a change in the reporting of achievement to parents and carers. On your child's previous report, the teacher reported against the 3 strands of the achievement standard for mathematics (Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry, and Statistics and Probability). Under the Mathematics 2.0, your child's teacher will report against the achievement standard as a whole, providing a <u>single</u>, aggregated score for 'Mathematics'. There will now be one 'progression point' on the report, rather than three.

As the achievement standards reported on have changed, the first time you receive a report under the Mathematics 2.0 curriculum (end of term 2, 2025), it will only show achievement and not progress. For all reports after this, progress will be shown against the single achievement standard. We cannot compare progress from last year, as the standards themselves have changed and it would be like comparing 'apples and oranges'.

You may notice a change in where your child is assessed as achieving. Please be reassured that it is likely that your child's learning and capabilities in Mathematics have

not regressed - rather, the curriculum targets have been changed to be more challenging in some areas.

As in previous years, your child's teacher will continue to report on skill achievement, as well as areas for future learning and will discuss these with you at the Parent/Carer Teacher interviews. If you have any queries about the new mathematics curriculum, or the changes to the reporting of achievement, please contact Bec or Michael.

FROM THE SCHOOL OFFICE ADMIN TEAM...



Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (e.g. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office.

We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. Parents are responsible to ensure up to date Action Plans and medications are provided to the school and must inform the school office of any changes to a student's medical condition / action plan.

All other medication must have a medication authority form completed by a parent at the Office. All medication, including over the counter types, <u>must be stored securely at the office</u> for the safety of all students. It is recommended that students with hay fever etc. take their medication at home before school.

Absences/ Late Arrivals

<u>A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno, including any family holidays</u>. Parents are responsible for addressing and updating their child's 'Unexplained Absences' in Xuno. Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office <u>by a parent before</u> going to class.

School Emails - Check the email you are replying to

When contacting classroom teachers or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the 'To' address.

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with a huge number of other daily external emails.

Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner and creates extra work for Admin staff.

Change of Details Updates

If you have any details that need to be updated – phone numbers, home address, emergency contacts, work details, etc this can all be done via Xuno.

You need to click Full Xuno > School > Students > Contact Details > Update details

It will then let you update any of your details and it will notify us of any changes that have been made. This is an instant update.

<u>CSEF – Do you have a healthcare/pension card?</u>

Parents - If you currently hold a Centrelink health care or pension card **and did not claim CSEF through our school last year**, please come and see the office team and we can help you to apply for the CSEF payment. This is a \$154 per child payment to financially assist families with the cost of Camps, Sports Excursions, Swimming etc.

Birthday Bucket Bookings / Payments

A reminder that all bookings for Birthday Buckets must be made with Admin Staff at the office, one week prior to your requested date. Payment by credit / debit card can be made in person at the office or over the phone.

SCHOOL SAVING BONUS (SSB)

Families wishing to use their School Saving Bonus for camp, excursions/incursions, activities <u>must take the</u> <u>following steps: -</u>

- 1. Reallocate your School Saving Bonus from the default "Textbooks/Uniforms" in the School Saving Bonus portal to "School Activities" It is recommended that the whole \$400 is reallocated in one transaction by parents of students going to camp this year. This will decrease the number of processes required by parents and also Admin staff.
- 2. Select SSB / CSEF in the Xuno payment section of the event and the enter either the SSB Voucher Number when prompted or type "CSEF" as the voucher code if selecting CSEF as the payment option

School Saving Bonus (SSB) Frequently Asked Questions:

• Can I use the SSB to purchase stationary/book packs?

No. The SSB cannot be used to purchase Book Packs/Book List Items. The Department of Education has included Textbooks only as allowable purchases using the SSB from authorised suppliers. Amsleigh Park PS students do not require any textbooks.

• Do I need to allocate money to uniforms in the SSB Portal?

No, because we have a school run onsite uniform shop. Parents will need to complete **a Green SSB uniform order form** and submit it to the school office for all uniform items. Admin staff will process then forward the order to the uniform shop for picking and packing. Orders will be sent to the child's classroom unless alternative collection is requested.

• Can I take uniforms on the day if I want to use the SSB?

No. You will need to submit a **Green SSB uniform order form** to the office for processing by Admin Staff. Once processed the order will be given to the Uniform Shop. Orders may take a week, or longer to be filled depending on processing times, submission day of the order form and stock availability.

• Can I only use the SSB on uniform purchases before June 30, 2025?

Yes. After June 30, 2025, the SSB money will automatically be allocated to school activities.

• Will I need to put the voucher code into the portal to re-allocate the SSB to activities?

Yes – For parents with students who will be attending camp in 2025, please allocate the whole amount of the SSB (\$400) in one transaction to "School Activities"

• Can I pay for events/activites in Xuno with SSB for activities

Yes. Each time you wish to use the SSB for payment of a school activity, you will need to select the SSB payment option in Xuno and enter the voucher code.

• Does the SSB money expire if I don't use it all in 2025?

No. The money will carry over to the following year

• Is the SSB only able to be used for each individual sibling?

No. The SSB is allocated to the family and can be used for any student in the immediate family

Incorrect payment methods made by parents, eg, Credit card instead of School Savings Bonus and vice versa cannot be refunded/re-processed.

Order will be processed by Admin Staff and then forwarded to our uniform shop for picking and packing. This may take up to a week, or longer depending on processing times, order form submission day and stock availability.

In the event of incorrect sizing, please return unworn items/s with tags intact, together with the original packing slip that includes the child's name, grade and the correct size required.

Amsleigh Park uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email to create a Xuno account and password.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that <u>all families are signed up</u> so they are aware of school information and events and can easily inform the school of their child's absences and advise us of any changes to family or emergency contact details.

Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent or a password reset.

EVERY DAY COUNTS

The IMPORTANCE OF REGULAR SCHOOL ATTENDANCE.

AT AMSLEIGH PARK, WE BELIEVE THAT EVERY DAY AT SCHOOL IS A CHANCE FOR YOUR CHILD TO LEARN, GROW, AND CONNECT WITH OTHERS. THAT'S WHY WE'RE COMMITTED TO WORKING WITH FAMILIES TO HELP EVERY STUDENT ATTEND SCHOOL REGULARLY AND MAKE THE MOST OF EVERY OPPORTUNITY.

When children come to school every day, they get to be part of the learning, Friendships, fun, and special moments that make school life so valuable. Regular attendance helps build strong routines, confidence, social connections and a love of learning.

LAST YEAR, OUR STUDENTS MISSED AN AVERAGE OF 16.6 DAYS OF SCHOOL-EQUIVALENT TO MORE THAN THREE WEEKS OF LEARNING. OVER SEVEN YEARS OF PRIMARY SCHOOL, THIS ADDS UP TO THE LOSS OF JUST OVER TWO FULL TERMS OF EDUCATION.

We understand that sometimes children need to miss school, for example, due to illness. But where possible, we ask families to book holidays or routine appointments (like the dentist or doctor) outside of school hours to help minimise disruption. If there is planned extended time away, please speak to your child's classroom teacher about creating a learning plan for their absence.

IF YOUR CHILD IS FEELING ANXIOUS ABOUT SCHOOL, WHETHER IT'S FRIENDSHIPS, SCHOOLWORK, OR SOMETHING ELSE—PLEASE ENCOURAGE THEM TO COME IN. AVOIDING SCHOOL CAN MAKE WORRIES FEEL EVEN BIGGER AND CAN CREATE A NEGATIVE PATTERN OF BEHAVIOUR.

IF YOUR CHILD IS HAVING TROUBLE ATTENDING SCHOOL, PLEASE SPEAK TO THEIR CLASSROOM TEACHER OR OUR INCLUSION LEADER, TRISH JONES. WE'RE HERE TO HELP AND SUPPORT YOUR FAMILY.

We know that parents and carers can be juggling challenges daily to get children to school. If your child must miss school, notify us as soon as possible preferably on the day of absence via Xuno and the reason for the absence.

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FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$154 for primary school students
- \$256 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments: your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure
