Principal Team Report

Teachers Duty of Care

From 8.52am every morning students come into class to prepare for the school day and teachers assume duty of care for their students. At this time teachers need to be focused on students and support them to get ready for the day. We hope you will understand that this means they are generally not able to talk to parents or carers other than to take onboard a quick message. We do want to be accessible, but it needs to be balanced out with the teacher's duty of care to their students. If you need to talk to the teacher about a concern this is important, this is best done at a time when the teacher can give you their full attention. If the concern is urgent, you could also come and talk to Miss Carr or myself and we will normally be able to assist as an initial step.

Our student Leaders

I want to highlight the great job our Student Leaders are doing in 2025. It's an important opportunity to develop their leadership skills and act as a role model for other students. Our leaders are also responsible for several daily tasks, such as the bike sheds and recycling, undertaking them with diligence and commitment. Well done and congratulations to our Grade 6 Student Leadership team, keep up the good work!



Screen Time

In more recent weeks I have read some interesting articles in The Age about increasing concerns about the impact of too much screen time on children's lives. One recent article provided details of some important findings from a study done by Deakin University. Article Link This newly published research looks at the links between digital technology use and young children's wellbeing, specifically for those aged four to six. The comprehensive analysis shows children who spend longer periods using digital technologies are more likely to have social, emotional and behavioural difficulties. This kind of finding could be just the tip of the iceberg when it comes to screen time, and I would encourage parents to take note of some of this research and look for ways to manage screen time at home.



Year 6-7 Transition Update

All families of year 6 students in Victoria (who have applied for enrolment at a State Secondary School) will be advised in writing, next Tuesday 1st July of their offer of placement for year 7, 2026. Student Achievement Reports

Teachers have recently been working on the mid-year student achievement reports. As part of this process, students have been completing various assessment tasks, and it has been wonderful to celebrate the progress our students have made in their learning. The mid-year reports will be distributed to families on Tuesday 1st July, via Xuno.

An important part of Amsleigh Park's process in reporting achievement to parents and carers, is the Parent/Carer Teacher interviews. These interviews will be held on the afternoon and evening of Wednesday $2^{\rm nd}$ July and allow for further discussion and questions regarding your child's written report. It is a time to share successes and



future goals regarding your child. We encourage all parents/carers to attend. If you haven't already booked, a time, bookings can be made via Xuno.

I CAN network

This term, as part of our proactive and preventative mental health supports, a group of Grade 5/6 students have participated in the 'Imagination Club' run by the I CAN Network Australia. Fortunately, this was funded through the Victorian Schools Mental Health Fund, and it has been wonderful to be able to provide a value-added program like this at Amsleigh Park at no cost to families.

The program was run by young adult mentors who supported the students in learning about teamwork, personal motivation, communication, leadership and developing a positive mindset. The program offered a safe, engaging environment where students were encouraged to recognise and celebrate their own strengths. Each session was designed to support students in developing peer connectedness, optimism, belonging and confidence.

We've had excellent feedback from students involved in the program, and hope to be able to run it again in future years.

Get Your Move On

With holidays next week our students have a chance to recharge and enjoy and change of pace. It might be colder outside right now, but this is no reason for children not to get out in the fresh air. The trick is to get children rugged up a bit and embrace the fresh air. Winter sunshine can also be quite pleasant and have a wonderful rejuvenating effect. Spending time out in the fresh air is invigorating and encourages children to be physically active. Current thinking is that at a minimum, children need to be active for 15 minutes about 4 times each day to build their fitness and wellbeing. The more time you spend on keeping fit, the healthier you will be and be more likely to enjoy being outdoors. The school holidays present an ideal time to get out and about, hope you make the most of it.

It's hard to believe that we only have one week of school to go for semester 1, before our winter break. We wish all families a safe and happy midyear break. We can't wait to see what our students will achieve in the semester to come!

Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (e.g. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office.

We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. Parents are responsible to ensure up to date Action Plans and medications are provided to the school and must inform the school office of any changes to a student's medical condition / action plan.

All other medication must have a medication authority form completed by a parent at the Office.

All medication, including over the counter types, <u>must be stored securely at the office</u> for the safety of all students. It is recommended that students with hay fever etc. take their medication at home before school.

Absences/ Late Arrivals

A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno, including any family holidays.

Parents are responsible for addressing and updating their child's 'Unexplained Absences' in Xuno.

Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.

School Emails - Check the email you are replying to

When contacting classroom teachers or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the 'To' address.

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with a huge number of other daily external emails.

Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner and creates extra work for Admin staff.

Change of Details Updates

If you have any details that need to be updated – phone numbers, home address, emergency contacts, work details, etc this can all be done via Xuno.

You need to click Full Xuno > School > Students > Contact Details > Update details

It will then let you update any of your details and notify us of any changes that have been made. Admin Staff will then update the school's data base which in turn flows through to Xuno.

CSEF - Do you have a healthcare/pension card?

Parents - If you currently hold a Centrelink health care or pension card **and did not claim CSEF through our school last year**, please come and see the office team and we can help you to apply for the CSEF payment. This is a \$154 per child payment to financially assist families with the cost of Camps, Sports Excursions, Swimming etc. 2025 applications close on Friday July 4 2025.

Birthday Bucket Bookings / Payments

A reminder that all bookings for Birthday Buckets must be made with <u>Admin Staff at the office</u>, one week prior to your requested date. Payment by credit / debit card can be made in person at the office or over the phone.



Amsleigh Park uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email to create a Xuno account and password.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$154 for primary school students
- · \$256 for secondary school students

APPLICATIONS CLOSE JULY 4 2025

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments: your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure




