Principal Team Report

We hope you have been enjoying this year's performance assemblies that showcase the wonderful talents of our students. These performances have been well received by our students and staff who have greatly enjoyed them. It's also been terrific to see so many parents and carers in attendance. We have one final performance on Thursday 27th November at 9.00am on our special Amsleigh Park 30th Birthday student celebration day.

Welcoming our New Foundation Students

Next Wednesday 19th November we are looking forward to welcoming our new Foundation students for 2026. With more than 50 students enrolled we have organised for 3 classes and it's all looking very promising. We run our special transition program over 5 weeks so the 'Foundies' get plenty of time to become comfortable with our school environment.

School Uniform

The wearing of correct school uniform is quite strong in our community. It does make life easy for families as school uniform does not require decisions about what to wear and means there is no competition between children about clothing. It also reduces pressure on parents and carers to be buying their children the latest clothing because others at school are wearing it. We have noticed children sometimes wearing jewellery to school that is not safe such as dangling earrings or neck laces/chains. Please be mindful that children are active at school and these items can sometimes present as an injury risk during active play. We would also appreciate it if children could stick to our policy of wearing light or dark coloured shoes. We do notice children wearing Fluro or brightly coloured runners and this creates a competition between students and in the end it's not very helpful for the teachers who must manage it when they have more pressing matters.

Pending Social Media Ban

The social media ban for children under 16 years of age will come into effect on 10th December 2025. The Australian Government has made this decision out of concern that our young people are not having enough time to build the life skills or understandings required to navigate this increasingly complex and sometimes very dangerous space for children.

'For example, the pressure to respond to streams of notifications and alerts and view disappearing content has been linked to harms to health - these include reduced sleep and attention, and increased stress levels. (e-Safety Commission)'.

From 10th December the major social media platforms will need to restrict the use of their platforms to young people who are 16 years or older. The office of the e-Safety Commissioner for Australia considers this...

'as a 'delay' to providing access to social media so that young people will have more time to develop important skills and maturity. It's breathing space to build digital literacy, critical reasoning, impulse control and greater resilience.' (e-Safety Commission)

So rather than seeing it as a ban, it's better to consider this as a 'common sense' delay so that children have the opportunity develop the maturity, knowledge and social skills to enjoy the online world.

'Age-restricted platforms won't be allowed to let under-16s create or keep an account. That's because being logged into an account increases the likelihood that they'll be exposed to pressures and risks that can be hard to deal with. These come from social media platform design features that encourage them to spend more time on screens and make it more likely that they will see negative, upsetting or manipulative content. (e-Safety Commission)'

As a primary school principal, I have observed an increase in the use of social media and messaging between students over the past couple of years. Whilst it's not all bad we have seen increases in problems occurring because most students 12 years and under are a long was off having the maturity or social skills to navigate the online environment. Typically, when complaints are made to the school these situations end up needing a lot of time spent on investigating what happened and then working with students to restore friendships. Often parents and carers have not been aware of what their child was doing in this space. Instant messaging is one very good example where we see issues arise between children out of school hours. It's easy to think that kids are safe in these spaces when they are just messaging their friends but increasingly, we see disagreements arise and the use of inappropriate language and bullying behaviours. Because children often don't seek assistance or don't understand the implications, then the situations can quickly get out of control. I encourage families to make careful considerations regarding how their child/ren are accessing the online world. You might be surprised what children are being exposed to as it's easy to click on links which can take you all kinds of websites.

Student Late arrivals / Early exits

A reminder to families that when a student is arriving late at school, they must come via the office and be signed in by a parent through our Xuno kiosk. It is important we have an accurate record of who is always on site at school, to ensure we can keep all our students safe. Similarly, if a student needs to leave early as happens from time to time, parents must sign their children out at the office. Thanks for your help with this procedure.



Assessment and Reporting

As we enter the second half of term four, your child may have let you know they have been begun undertaking some assessment tasks at school this week. As we move further into the assessment period, teachers and students are reflecting on the fantastic leaning that has taken place this semester. Assessment tasks are a valuable opportunity for students to demonstrate their growth, effort and achievement.

In preparation for end-of-semester reports, teachers are gathering a range of evidence to ensure each student's progress is accurately reflected. Part of this important process involves moderation across year levels, where teachers work together to review student work samples and data, share insights, and ensure consistent assessment practices. This collaboration forms part of the focus of our upcoming Student-Free Assessment and Reporting Day, next Thursday 20th November.

Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (e.g. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office.

We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor. Parents are responsible to ensure up to date Action Plans and medications are provided to the school and must inform the school office of any changes to a student's medical condition / action plan. All other medication must have a medication authority form completed by a parent at the Office.

All medication, including over the counter types, <u>must be signed in by a parent and stored securely at the office</u> for the safety of all students.

It is recommended that students with hay fever etc. take their medication at home before school.

Absences/ Late Arrivals

A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno, including any family holidays.

Parents are responsible for addressing and updating their child's 'Unexplained Absences' in Xuno.

Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.

School Emails - Check the email you are replying to

When contacting classroom teachers or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the 'To' address.

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with a huge number of other daily external emails.

Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner and creates extra work for Admin staff.

Change of Details Updates

If you have any details that need to be updated – phone numbers, home address, emergency contacts, work details, etc this can all be done via Xuno.

You need to click Full Xuno > School > Students > Contact Details > Update details
It will then let you update any of your details and notifies us of any changes that have been made. Admin Staff will then update the school's data base which in turn flows through to Xuno.

Birthday Bucket Bookings / Payments

A reminder that <u>all bookings</u> for Birthday Buckets must be made with <u>Admin Staff at the office</u>, one week prior to your requested date. Please do not contact PFA members directly to make bookings as the Booking Diary is kept at the General Office. Payment by credit / debit card only can be made in person at the office or over the phone.

Amsleigh Park uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family" for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email to create a Xuno account and password.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events and can easily inform the school of their child's absences and advise us of any changes to family or emergency contact details.

Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent or a password reset.



New and Returning Users

Already Registered? If you ordered school Book List supplies last year with Office Corporate, you don't need to create a new account. Simply go to www.booklistorders.com.au and reset your password.

New Users? First, go to www.booklistorders.com.au to register. Make sure to use the school code AMS26 when creating your account.



When you create your password, it must be at least 12 characters long and include:

- An uppercase letter (A-Z)
- A lowercase letter (a-z)
- A number (0-9)
- A special character (!@#\$%^&*)

For example: Booklist123!

Once you've set your password, check your email for a verification link. Click the link to activate your account and view pricing.



How to Place Your Order

- Log in to your account. Select your child's year level (Prep/Foundation to Year 6).
- 2. View Book Pack Details. The ordering page shows exactly what's included in each year level pack. All of the items & quantities have been requested by the year level teachers and are pre-loaded. You can modify quantities of any item in the Essential Category, items listed as Required, are fixed to the cart, and cannot be changed. Items listed as Optional can be retained from the previous year if still in good condition or purchased again if required.

Please note, that if you do reduce the recommended quantities, a \$5.50 individual packing fee will be incurred. Alternatively, if you add the full list to cart, the \$5.50 fee will be automatically discounted at checkout.

Add Your Student's Name. Please make sure to add your student's name on the ordering page. If
you have multiple children, add each student's name and their book pack separately. This helps
the school track which families have placed orders.
