Principal Team Report

Welcome to 2026

On behalf of our staff, we would like to extend a warm welcome to everyone in our school community for 2026. Special welcome to all new families joining us for the first time, we hope you are enjoying being in our wonderful school community so far. Special welcome to our new teacher, Mrs Katherine Keily (Grade 1A), and welcome back to Ms Jenny Brown (Grade 3A).

Our students have made a terrific start to this school year, and as I walked around the school this week, I was pleased to see how settled our classrooms are. There is a sense of calm across our school and that's a great start to the year. Amsleigh Park is a wonderful school with a great staff, great students and a terrific and supportive school community, so we have all we need to flourish in 2026.

Get to Know You Interviews



We have set aside time for our very important 'Get to Know You Interviews' on Wednesday 4th February. These meetings provide a timely opportunity for our teaching staff to form an effective partnership with each child's family. Working in partnership and having consistent expectations between home and school leads to better outcomes for our students. The Interviews are strictly 10 minutes. If families need longer than 10 minutes, then a follow-up time should be organized. The bookings for interviews are all done using XUNO and an email was distributed on Wednesday this week with details. Bookings are open until next Tuesday, 3rd February.

Learning to Learn

For the first two weeks of the school year all our classes are participating in our 'Learning to Learn' program. This program helps our students to settle into their new classes, get to know their classmates and new teacher, establish clear expectations and build a productive classroom tone for the year. It's a very important time, and it's vital that everyone develops a positive mindset towards school.



At our students' welcome assembly on Wednesday, we reminded students about our school values, Respect, Integrity, Inclusion, Motivation and Resilience. We expect that all students, staff and parents will uphold to our community values. Additionally, we made it very clear that students should also play in a friendly and inclusive manner, and any rough play was not welcome. The catch phrase, 'keep your hands and feet to yourself' was reinforced several times and there is no excuse for hurting anyone else.

For the record our students are overwhelmingly fantastic, which is well supported by having a consistent expectation for all. However, kids will have their moments, and that is to be expected, as its part of learning for life. Our aim is to be fair and consistent, following the principles of School Wide Positive Behaviour Support, and teaching children the skills they need to be happy and successful at school.

Our fantastic office team, Karen, Ali and Jade, have been very busy at school since 19th January getting things organized so we have a smooth start to the year. Many thanks to them for their dedication to our school. Office hours are 8.15am – 4.00pm, and you can contact us during this time.

Your Principal Class Team

A strong feature of Amsleigh Park is our highly effective team structures and processes designed to work collaboratively. This works in all levels of leadership including the principal class team. Our focus is always on students and making sure that they have a safe and effective learning environment.

In 2026 Mr Cormick (Michael) is continuing in the principal's flexible work initiative working 4 days from Monday to Thursday. This initiative is designed to enhance work-life balance for principals. On Fridays Miss Carr (Bec) is the acting principal and Miss Jones (Trish) steps into the role of acting assistant principal.

As a team we invite you to contact us if you have any questions or concerns. Often you will see us out in the school yard but if you would prefer to discuss a matter at length then please contact to the general office to make an appointment.

We look forward to continuing to work with staff, students, parents and carers in 2026.

Personal Goods brought to school at the 'Owners' risk

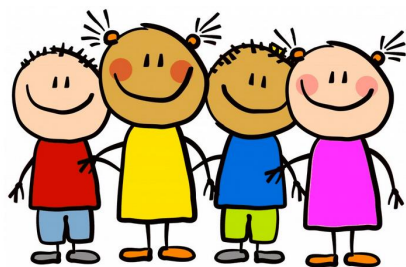

Student wellbeing Resources

At Amsleigh Park, the wellbeing of our students is a top priority. We focus on wellbeing at school through different programs including School Wide Positive Behaviour Support and can also access wellbeing supports from the Department of Education. In addition to this, we wanted to share with you a range of wellbeing resources that you and/or your child can access to support their wellbeing outside of school, should you be interested. These resources are designed to support students in maintaining their mental, emotional, and physical health and wellbeing, as well as addressing developmental and educational concerns.

Some resources families may be interested in accessing are:

- ELMHS <https://monashchildrenshospital.org/mental-health/> : Early in Life Mental Health Service (ELMHS) is a place where young people who are experiencing emotional, behavioural or mental health problems can get help. Parents can refer their child to ELMHS without a GP referral. Parents and carers can call the triage line on 1300 369 012 to refer their child.

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- Kids Help Line: <https://kidshelpline.com.au/> or 1800 55 1800. Kids Help line is available to all young people 24hrs a day. They also have a fantastic website with child friendly information on wellbeing concerns such as bullying, friendships, school concerns, family conflict.
- Link Health and Community Services: <https://www.linkhc.org.au/services/children-youth-and-family-services/>. Link Children and Youth Services provide information on how to access services such as Occupational Therapy and Speech Therapy in the Oakleigh area.
- A visit to the GP is also a good starting place to discuss concerns for your child's health, wellbeing or development. GPs can refer to other practitioners as appropriate.

We encourage all our students and families to take advantage of these resources and to reach out to their teachers, Inclusion Leader, Trish Jones, Mental Health and Wellbeing leader, Liana Bianco or the principal team if they have any concerns or questions, as we are always here to support wellbeing.

Family Financial Assistance

The 2026 Camps Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF) is available to parents who hold an eligible Centrelink Pension or Health Care Card. Please see information further on in this edition for application details. Parents who claimed CSEF at our school last year do not need to complete another application form, unless there have been changes to the family situation, ie younger sibling now enrolled at our school. Please contact our Business Manager, Karen Hogan, the Admin Team, Jade and Ali, if you have any further queries regarding CSEF applications.

School Attendance

It's great to start a new school year. We look forward to supporting our students to have a great year at school. One important factor is school attendance, which is vital for students' success at school and contributes to their overall wellbeing and mental health.

The Department of Education expects that students should have attendance of around 95% which means that they should be away from school only when necessary, due to illness, bereavement or a serious family matter. We also know that when students are absent too often it leads to loss of learning continuity and interruption to friendships.

Working for the Amsleigh Park PS Community

Rounding out our Leadership team is Learning Specialist, Miss Khalia Barker, who is our literacy leader. Together we are the executive team at Amsleigh Park, and we work closely together to ensure that we both lead the learning program and manage the broader operations of the school. At different times you might find Miss Barker overseeing the school whilst the senior leadership attend regional, network and state-based meetings, briefings and professional learning. Miss Barker is a highly experienced educator, and we are fortunate to have her at APPS.



In 2026 the Victorian Government provided funding for a new role in all primary schools for a mental health and wellbeing leader (MHWL). This role will be taken up by Ms. Liana Bianco who has been a member of the staff here at APPS for the past 5 years. Ms. Bianco has a passion for well-being and supporting students and we are most fortunate that she can take up this new role. MHWL's will be provided with significant training to undertake their role. As the year gets underway more information will be provided about how increased support for students will be available through this new role.

Our first fortnightly assembly for 2026 will be on Monday 2nd February at 9.00am. Assemblies are held outdoors under the sports pavilion. Everyone is welcome.

Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (e.g. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office.

We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor.

Parents are responsible to ensure up to date Action Plans and medications are provided to the school and must inform the school office of any changes to a student's medical condition / action plan.

All other medication must have a medication authority form completed by a parent at the Office.

All medication, including over the counter types, must be signed in by a parent and stored securely at the office for the safety of all students.

It is recommended that students with hay fever etc. take their medication at home before school.

Absences/ Late Arrivals

A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno, including any family holidays.

Parents are responsible for addressing and updating their child's 'Unexplained Absences' in Xuno.

Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.

School Emails - Check the email you are replying to

When contacting classroom teachers or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the 'To' address.

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with a huge number of other daily external emails.

Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner and creates extra work for Admin staff.

Change of Details Updates

If you have any family details that need to be updated – phone numbers, home address, emergency contacts, work details, etc this can all be done via Xuno.

You need to click Full Xuno > School > Students > Contact Details > Update details

You can then update any of your details. We receive a notification of the changes that have been made. Admin Staff will then update the school's data base, which in turn flows back through to Xuno.

Birthday Bucket Bookings / Payments

A reminder that all bookings for Birthday Buckets must be made with Admin Staff at the office, one week prior to your requested date. Please do not contact PFA members directly to make bookings as the Booking Diary is kept at the General Office. Payment by credit / debit card only can be made in person at the office or over the phone.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF) 2026

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF.

A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families.

The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$400 for primary school students
- \$400 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form. A copy of your eligible Centrelink concession or pension card is required.

If you applied for CSEF at our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments:** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances:** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

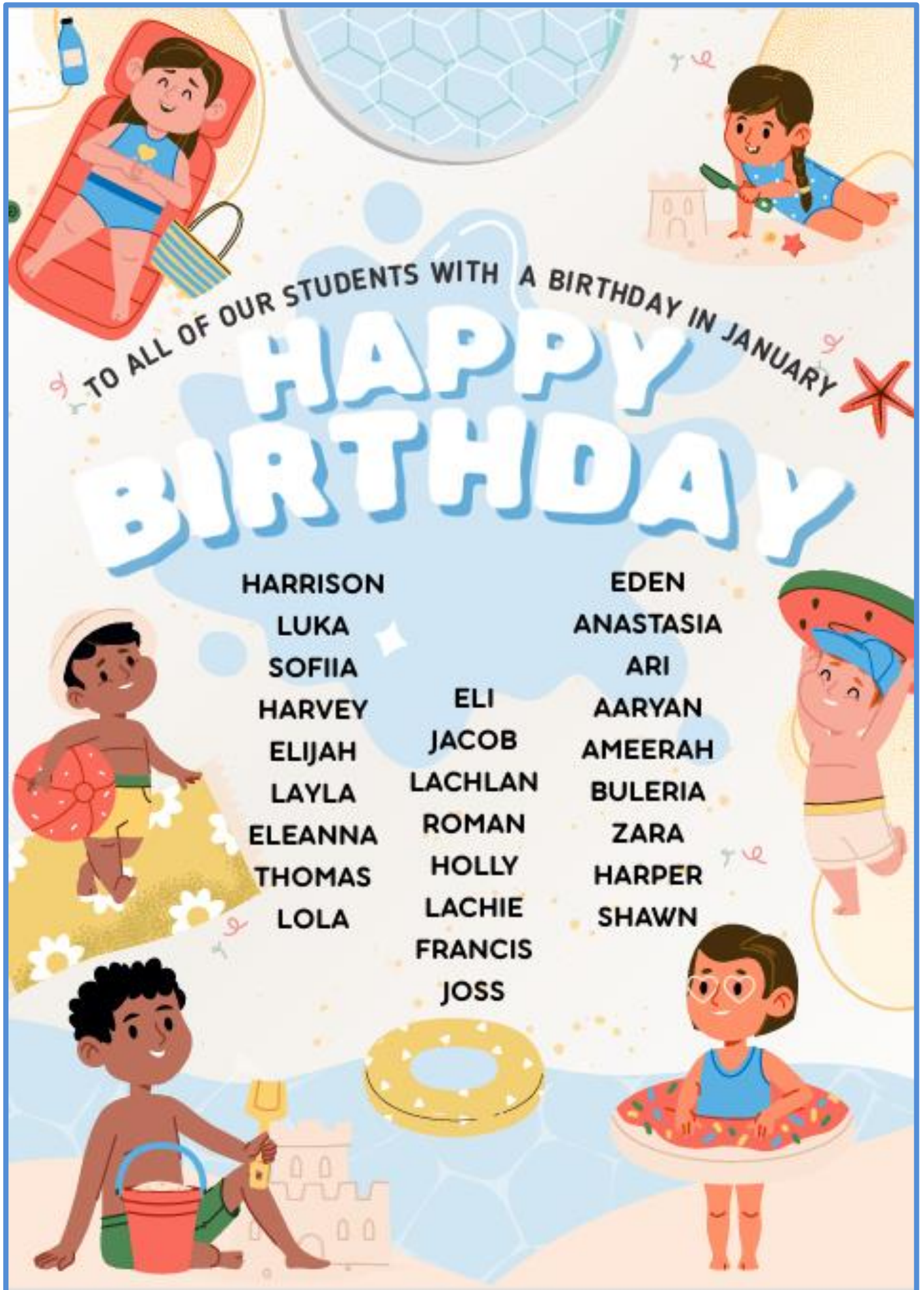

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family' for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email to create a Xuno account and password.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events and can easily inform the school of their child's absences and advise us of any changes to family or emergency contact details.

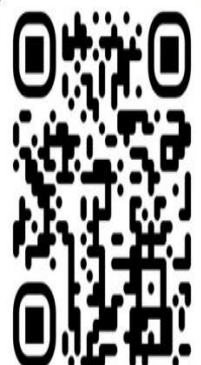
