Principals Report

Welcome to Kent Village

If you have visited the school in the past week, you will see our new village taking shape in the area adjacent to the Grade 3 portable classroom. It's a wonderful new play space for our students offering them hours of creative play options. The village (so far) consists of five shop fronts including a post office, hospital, hamburger shop, vet and milk bar. The idea is that students can engage in Imagine and interactive play which is different from other playground activities.

We have had lots of questions about the name 'Kent Village' and the story is a good one. When we first became Amsleigh Park PS 30 years ago the principal of this time was Mr Brian Kent. He had a great fondness for Amsleigh Park and very generously bequeathed an amount of money to us so we could undertake a project of benefit to our students. Our school council thought it was a fitting gesture to name this play space after Mr Kent as a long-lasting reminder of his kindness to our school.

The construction of the village is stage 1 of this project, and we will be looking to construct a meandering path through the village and see what other enhancements we can also make along the way. (See pics on p.3)

We are highly indebted to the APPS PFA for their ongoing support of many events at our school. This partnership is super important and adds great value and richness to school life. The main aim of the PFA is to provide a chance for parents and carers to build connections at Amsleigh Park. Being active in the school is both a rewarding and enjoyable experience for many parents and carers. Along the way the PFA also raises some funds that are put to good use in improving the quality of resources, equipment and infrastructure. We are very fortunate to have many dedicated folks who support the PFA.



Extreme Weather Events

In February 2024 we experienced an unprecedented weather event at Amsleigh Park in which the campus sustained significant damage to trees and playgrounds. Whilst we hope this was a once only event, it appears that extreme weather is on the rise. After this storm in 2024, we reviewed the actions that contributed to community safety at this time and came up with the following action plan that we will follow in any similar emergency.

- *In the case of extreme weather students will not be dismissed until it is safe to do so and will remain in classrooms as a shelter in place. This could mean students remain indoors after the dismissal bell.*

- *If any parents or carers find themselves in our school yard during an event such as this, they should find shelter indoors. The foyer of the Thelma Bailey Centre, Library Foyer, General Office Foyer and JLC corridors are all places that parents and carers can shelter in place. You do not need to ask permission to shelter in place during an emergency.*

- *Do not shelter under trees in high winds or rain. We have several covered outdoor spaces such as the Sports Pavilion and covered walkway where you can seek safer shelter.*

It might reassure you to know that we do regularly check the weather reports and have the Vic Emergency App set for notifications. We take a conservative approach to the weather, and we bring students indoors on days of extreme heat or wind.

Working Bee Wrap Up

The school is looking great this week after it had a big tidy up at last weekend's working bee. Many thanks to the families who came along to help, they powered through the jobs list which included spreading 20m3 of soft mulch under the 3-6 playgrounds. In addition, trees were pruned, garden beds weeded, grassed areas edged, areas swept and rubbish picked up. We greatly appreciate this support in helping to manage our large grounds and keeping them looking great. A shout out to Laura Harrison, who got the event organised.

Team Kids Important Information

If you are a regular user of the Teams Kids service, please be aware of 'no show' costs of \$5.00. This is when a child is booked in and does not show up. The following is from Team Kids:

When a child is booked but does not attend without prior notification, our staff must undertake additional safety protocols, including:

- Contacting parents/guardians
- Communicating with the school
- Conducting a search of the school grounds
- Engaging emergency services if necessary.

These steps require significant time and resources, impacting our ability to provide the best possible care for all children. The No Show Fee helps ensure families remain accountable for timely cancellations, allowing our team to focus on supervising children who are present.

How Families Can Avoid the No Show Fee...

To avoid this charge, families must cancel bookings as follows:

- Before 2:00 PM on the day of care: Cancel online via their TeamKids account.
- After 2:00 PM on the day of care: Call the onsite team before the session starts to notify their child will not be in attendance.

Team kids provide a quality service but like all providers they do have clear policies for payments. It pays to stay on top of this to avoid having to pay any late fees. If a child is sick, then you can call the service directly and they will then know not to look for a student.

VHAP

The Victorian High Ability Program (VHAP) has begun for 2026 at Amsleigh Park, with a group of our Grade 5 & 6 students having been selected by the Department of Education to be a part of the enrichment program for English and Mathematics.



The Victorian Government has again funded the Victorian High-Ability Program. This provides up to 48,000 Victorian high-ability students in Years 5 to 8 (Year 5-6 at Amsleigh Park) at government schools the opportunity to participate in a 10-week online extension and enrichment program, in English and mathematics.

The virtual program, delivered by Virtual School Victoria, will focus on extending and developing students' mathematic and English abilities.

The Department of Education has centrally managed the selection process for the program based on students' academic performance. The students at Amsleigh Park who are participating in this program commenced their first classes three weeks ago and have enjoyed meeting high ability students from other schools and their teacher from Virtual School Victoria. Congratulations to the students who have been selected to be in the program.

Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (e.g. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office.

We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor.

Parents are responsible to ensure up to date Action Plans and medications are provided to the school and must inform the school office of any changes to a student's medical condition / action plan.

All other medication must have a medication authority form completed by a parent at the Office.

All medication, including over the counter types, must be signed in by a parent and stored securely at the General Office for the safety of all students.

It is recommended that students with hay fever etc. take their medication at home before school.

Absences/ Late Arrivals

A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno, including any family holidays.

Parents are responsible for addressing and updating their child's 'Unexplained Absences' in Xuno.

Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.

School Emails - Check the email you are replying to

When contacting classroom teachers or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the 'To' address.

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with a huge number of other daily external emails.

Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner and creates extra work for Admin staff.

Change of Details Updates - Xuno

If you have any family details that need to be updated – phone numbers, home address, emergency contacts, work details, etc this can all be done via Xuno.

You need to click Full Xuno > School > Students > Contact Details > Update details

You can then update any of your details. We receive a notification of the changes that have been made. Admin Staff will then update the school's data base, which in turn flows back through to Xuno.

Birthday Bucket Bookings / Payments

A reminder that all bookings for Birthday Buckets must be made with Admin Staff at the office, one week prior to your requested date. Please do not contact PFA members directly to make bookings as the Booking Diary is kept at the General Office. Payment by credit / debit card only can be made in person at the office or over the phone.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF) 2026

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF.

A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families.

The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$400 for primary school students
- \$400 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form. A copy of your eligible Centrelink concession or pension card is required.

If you applied for CSEF at our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments:** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances:** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Amsleigh Park uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family' for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email to create a Xuno account and password.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events and can easily inform the school of their child's absences and advise us of any changes to family or emergency contact details.


