Principal Team Report

Education Week

- Our culture is embodied through the way our Parents and Friends and School Council work to make Amsleigh Park a great school that offers lots of opportunities for our students. Both groups are making a wonderful contribution to our community.
- We focus on the whole child which includes academic learning through the curriculum, balanced with social emotional growth/development and enhanced by a broad array of specialist programs and extra-curricular activities.

Shrine Excursion

It was my pleasure to accompany our Grade 6s to Victoria's National Shrine of Remembrance this week to take in this important national monument. As many of our students have not visited before we are pleased to provide them with this opportunity. Our National Shrine honours the service and sacrifice of Australians in war and peace keeping. It has an excellent museum of artifacts and many other interesting aspects that make it a very engaging place to visit. As part of our visit, we laid a wreath on behalf of Amsleigh Park Primary School in the tomb of the unknown soldier, and we were very proud to do so. On behalf of our Grade 6s I would like to thank the Rotary Club of Glen Waverley who provided funding for the bus for this excursion.



Safety Week

Week 5 is always Safety Week at our school, and we focus on health and safety for everyone. One key thing for students is knowing what to do in an emergency and we always practice one of our emergency procedures. Our 3 emergency procedures are an evacuation from classrooms, a shelter in place in the gymnasium and a lock down in classrooms.

National Education Support Staff Recognition Day

This week we celebrated our incredible Education Support team, as part of the National ESP Day. We are incredibly fortunate to have a wonderful team of ES staff, that allow the safe and successful running of Amsleigh Park. We have ES staff that work across administration, library and integration/inclusion, and we would be lost without them! Our inclusion team support students with their learning, self-care, social development and supported supervision; while our admin team keep us all organised and help support parent and carers with queries and finances, as well as support students with first aid and anything else that comes up in a day of school! In the library, Martin curates a wonderful space for our school to visit and manages the growing collection, which the students enjoy greatly!

Reporting Day – Tuesday 26th May

Don't forget we have a reporting day on Tuesday 26th May 2026 so there is no school for students on this day. Our teaching and support staff will be working on assessment and reporting for mid-year. They will be working on student reports and preparing for the mid-year parent/carers teachers interviews that will be held on 24th June. It's a busy time for teachers and we appreciate having the time and space to do this important work. Sorry to parents and carers for any inconvenience this might cause, please remember that all day care is available with Team Kids so there is an option for you to consider.

Reconciliation Week

Next week is National Reconciliation Week and a time to reflect on how we can work together to in the spirit of reconciliation. The theme for National Reconciliation Week 2026 is **All In**, a call for all Australians to commit wholeheartedly to reconciliation every single day. *All In* makes clear that reconciliation is not a spectator sport and that all of us must step away from the sidelines and take action to make change. The theme also reminds us that reconciliation and advancing Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples' rights isn't a passive activity, and it is not solely the responsibility of First Nations people, who have carried the weight of championing, explaining and acting for far too long. Reconciliation will not happen by itself, and it will not happen without all of us. At Amsleigh Park we want to pay our sincere respects to all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families in our school. We pay our respects that our school is on the traditional lands of the Wurundjeri-Woi Wurrung and Bunurong people and we thank them for being traditional custodians of these lands that we now live on and enjoy.

District Cross Country

About 54 students participated in the district cross country event on Monday 11 May. Running around the popular circuit of Nortons Park, our runners ran either 2km (10yo) or 3km (11yo and 12yo) which is a fair challenge. Excitingly, we have 10 runners who will head off to the next level, the Divisional Cross Country. To those younger runners going in this event for the first time, well done! We are so proud of our team and the way they took up the challenge of this event.

Sincere thanks to all the parents and carers who supported this event and to teachers, Miss Phoon, Mr Darlow and Miss Hayes who took along our students. It's very much appreciated.

Solar System at Amsleigh Park PS

We had a solar system installed at Amsleigh Park in 2024 and since then we have been producing our own electricity to power the school. During the life of this project, we have generated nearly 60mwh of electricity which is a lot! To put that in perspective we could power 60 average sized homes for a whole year, run a dishwasher 30,000 times or power an electric car to drive 400,000kms. We are proud to have this in place, and we both save money whilst also contributing positively to the future for our students. I want to thank our School Council for their vision in this project, it is something we can all be proud of.

Cakes for a Cause

Our Parents and Friends are amazing and continue to organise a range of fantastic events on behalf of our school. Last Friday 15th May we had our very first 'cakes for a cause' event and it was a huge success. It was so popular that we had a massive queue which was great but unexpected. Next time we will change locations in the school to plan for this. A heartfelt thank-you to the

Victorian Government High Ability Program

As shared previously, the Victorian Government has continued to fund the excellence program, The Victorian High-Ability Program. This provides up to 48,000 high-ability students in Years 5 to 8 (Years 5-6 at Amsleigh Park) at government schools the opportunity to participate in a 10-week online extension and enrichment program, in English and mathematics. The virtual program, delivered by Virtual School Victoria, focuses on extending and developing students' mathematic and English abilities.

The Department of Education centrally manages the selection process for the program based on students' academic performance. This year we've had students selected for both the maths and English, each term and again for next term, which is fantastic and a reflection of their hard work and dedication to learning. The students at Amsleigh Park who are currently participating in this program have enjoyed meeting high ability students from other schools and their teachers from Virtual School Victoria.

Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (e.g. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office.

We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor.

Parents are responsible to ensure up to date Action Plans and medications are provided to the school and must inform the school office of any changes to a student's medical condition / action plan.

All other medication must have a medication authority form completed by a parent at the Office.

All medication, including over the counter types, must be signed in by a parent and stored securely at the General Office for the safety of all students.

It is recommended that students with hay fever etc. take their medication at home before school.

Absences/ Late Arrivals

A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno, including any family holidays.

Parents are responsible for addressing and updating their child's 'Unexplained Absences' in Xuno.

Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.

School Emails - Check the email you are replying to

When contacting classroom teachers or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the 'To' address.

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with a huge number of other daily external emails.

Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner and creates extra work for Admin staff.

Change of Details Updates - Xuno

If you have any family details that need to be updated – phone numbers, home address, emergency contacts, work details, etc this can all be done via Xuno.

You need to click Full Xuno > School > Students > Contact Details > Update details

You can then update any of your details. We receive a notification of the changes that have been made. Admin Staff will then update the school's data base, which in turn flows back through to Xuno.

Birthday Bucket Bookings / Payments

A reminder that all bookings for Birthday Buckets must be made with Admin Staff at the office, one week prior to your requested date. Please do not contact PFA members directly to make bookings as the Booking Diary is kept at the General Office. Payment by credit / debit card only can be made in person at the office or over the phone.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF) 2026

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF.

A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families.

The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$400 for primary school students
- \$400 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form. A copy of your eligible Centrelink concession or pension card is required.

If you applied for CSEF at our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments:** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances:** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Amsleigh Park uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family' for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email to create a Xuno account and password.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events and can easily inform the school of their child's absences and advise us of any changes to family or emergency contact details.

Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent or a password reset.

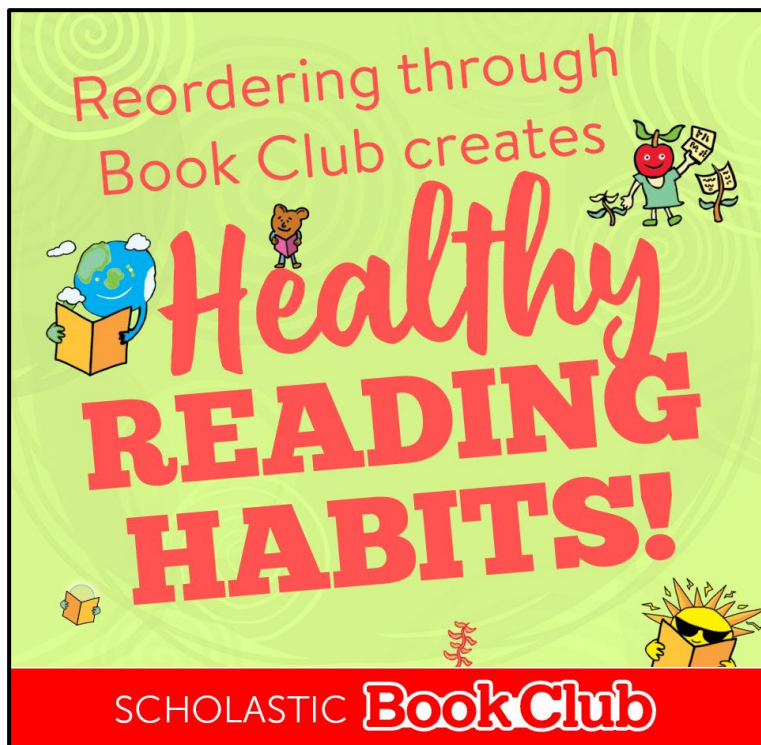
