Principal Team Report

Smile Squad at Amsleigh Park PS

We have been very lucky to have the Smile Squad undertake an extended visit to Amsleigh Park over the past 4 weeks. Free dental care and promoting oral hygiene are big advantage to all our students and their families and undertaking this at school saves valuable family time for other activities and priorities. During their visit the Smile Squad set up a temporary dental clinic in our theatre transforming this space completely with special dental chairs and other high-tech equipment. It was very impressive to see the set up. All up we had 210 students visit the Smile Squad. We also hosted students from Melbourne University who are training to be dental oral hygienists, and it was pleasing to be helping them get set up for their future. For the next little while we are hosting the dental van taking care of any more advanced work needed. It's been another great visit by the Smile Squad!



Divisional Cross Country

We had 9 students head off to the Divisional Cross Country this week and we are so proud of their efforts. Getting to this level is tough and you are racing against all the best middle-distance runners from each sports district. Miss Hayes reports that our competitors were awesome and all represented our school well. Special mention to Olivia L who came 4th in her race and will progress onto the Regional competition. Conditions were chilly and windy, so true to the winter cross country conditions you might expect, although fortunately it did not rain. I want to thank our runners and hope they feel proud of themselves. Thanks to Miss Hayes and the parents who supported students to participate, it is much appreciated. Addressing Racism

We have recently been working to review and update the Child Safety Standards and Wellbeing Policy at our school. This purpose of this policy is to enact the Child Safe Standards (CSS) which are mandated in **all** schools. There are 11 Child Safe Standards, which were designed by the government in response to the Royal Commission into Child Abuse. Standard One of the child safe standards requires that schools provide a culturally safe environment for Aboriginal children (and all children), and we are committed to this goal. There is no place for racism at our school or any school, and it will not be tolerated in any form. You will see on our website under the governance tab, that there is an option for anyone who might have experienced racism to report this to us. Parents and carers can also contact Miss Carr or myself at any time if your child has had any experience of racist behaviour. It will always be our aim to live up to our related school values of respect, integrity and inclusion and it's what we expect of all our students and staff.



Government Schools Principal Conference

Last week Miss Carr and I attended the Victorian Government School Principals' Conference. This annual conference provides principals with the opportunity to hear from a range of speakers on current education trends impacting our schools and the broader community. AI was a hot topic and particularly how quickly it is moving ahead. The Department acknowledged that they have been very cautious in their approach to AI, and that many schools are already exploring how we can best use AI to benefit students. This will be an area that will inform our practice over the coming years and there is no doubt that our students will be experimenting as well. Part of our role will be to provide students with the tools they need to ensure they use AI in a safe and productive manner.

In addition, the conference explored the new Victorian Teaching and Learning Model 2.0 and it was reassuring to hear that the work done by our school so far is well and truly on the right track. Principals also heard from experts in student wellbeing and how we as a school system can work towards delivering support pathways to students and families in the future.

Enrolments 2027



This term we have been super busy with running tours of Amsleigh Park for prospective parents and carers. Interest in our school is very healthy, and we often get good feedback from visitors who like our caring and friendly environment. We are currently taking Foundation enrolments for 2027. Families need to submit their enrolments application

by 31st July at the latest, but we encourage any existing families to get onto it as soon as possible. We look forward to getting to know our 2027 Foundation students through the Foundation transition program in Term 4.

What's Happening in our Buildings and Grounds

We have a wonderful school campus, generous in size and with outstanding learning spaces and playgrounds. Keeping it all in good order keeps us busy and so far in 2026 we have achieved the following:

- A new shade structure was constructed and sails installed over the F-2 Playground
- The annual audit of our trees has been completed
- A new play space, known to us as Kent Village, has been constructed
- The soft-fall mulch was topped up in our 3-6 playgrounds
- Our Grade 5-6 classes received an upgrade to their furniture to support a more structured classroom environment where students can work in rows.

Recently, the School Council has established a working party to plan for and prioritise some other projects that will improve our school facilities. The working party has developed a long list of possible improvements covering all areas of our school and will be developing a plan for how we might undertake some of these projects over time. There will be more information about this as we advance this plan.

Student Medications

A reminder that a Medical Action Plan, completed by a doctor, must be provided for any student medication (e.g. Ventolin, Epi Pens, severe allergy medication) stored at the school office.

We cannot store or administer any medication without an Action Plan containing instructions from a doctor.

Parents are responsible to ensure up to date Action Plans and medications are provided to the school and must inform the school office of any changes to a student's medical condition / action plan.

All other medication must have a medication authority form completed by a parent at the Office.

All medication, including over the counter types, must be signed in by a parent and stored securely at the General Office for the safety of all students.

It is recommended that students with hay fever etc. take their medication at home before school.

Absences/ Late Arrivals

A reminder that all absences should be reported via Xuno, including any family holidays.

Parents are responsible for addressing and updating their child's 'Unexplained Absences' in Xuno.

Students arriving late to school must be first signed in at the office by a parent before going to class.

School Emails - Check the email you are replying to

When contacting classroom teachers or responding to their emails via Xuno, remember to double check the 'To' address.

Many emails meant for classroom teachers are arriving in the Amsleigh Park PS inbox, along with a huge number of other daily external emails.

Replying to the school inbox may delay your communication being received by the classroom teacher in a timely manner and creates extra work for Admin staff.

Change of Details Updates - Xuno

If you have any family details that need to be updated – phone numbers, home address, emergency contacts, work details, etc this can all be done via Xuno.

You need to click Full Xuno > School > Students > Contact Details > Update details

You can then update any of your details. We receive a notification of the changes that have been made. Admin Staff will then update the school's data base, which in turn flows back through to Xuno.

Birthday Bucket Bookings / Payments

A reminder that all bookings for Birthday Buckets must be made with Admin Staff at the office, one week prior to your requested date. Please do not contact PFA members directly to make bookings as the Booking Diary is kept at the General Office. Payment by credit / debit card only can be made in person at the office or over the phone.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF) 2026

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF.

A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families.

The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$400 for primary school students
- \$400 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form. A copy of your eligible Centrelink concession or pension card is required.

If you applied for CSEF at our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments:** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances:** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Amsleigh Park uses Xuno as our main communication tool with families, including newsletter distribution, absence notifications, student reports, communication with your child's teacher, messages and reminders, event approvals and online payments.

Xuno is a web-based school management program that has a website portal for use in a browser and an App, 'Xuno Family' for use on smart phones or tablets.

It is easy to use and is a vital tool to keep our parents informed about their child/ren's school life and all things happening at Amsleigh Park.

Bookings for "Get to Know You" & Parent Teacher interviews are also managed through Xuno.

Parents can use Xuno to notify the school of any address/contact detail changes, absences, late arrivals, upcoming family holidays etc.

For new families - On enrolment, you should have received a welcome email from Xuno (please check your junk folder if not received in your inbox), with information on how to create your Xuno account. Please follow the instructions and links in the email to create a Xuno account and password.

As Xuno is our main communication tool, it is important that all families are signed up so they are aware of school information and events and can easily inform the school of their child's absences and advise us of any changes to family or emergency contact details.

Please contact the office if you require a Xuno welcome email to be resent or a password reset.

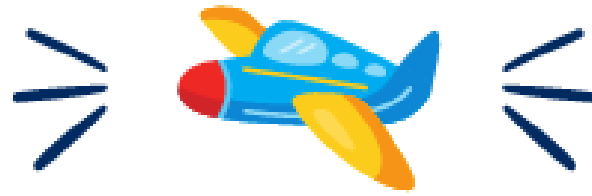
